## HOUSE BILL NO. 704

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXCLUSIVELY RECOGNIZE DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.'S BIRTHDAY ON THE THIRD MONDAY OF JANUARY; TO REMOVE ROBERT E. LEE'S BIRTHDAY AS A LEGAL STATE HOLIDAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature desires to reflect the
- 6 transformative power of Mississippi from its past to its present
- 7 by celebrating holidays that wholly reflect the remarkable strides
- 8 made by all citizens; NOW, THEREFORE,
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 3-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 3-3-7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2)
- 13 of this section, the following are declared to be legal holidays,
- 14 viz: the first day of January (New Year's Day); the third Monday
- of January ( \* \* \* Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday); the
- 16 third Monday of February (Washington's birthday); the last Monday
- of April (Confederate Memorial Day); the last Monday of May
- 18 (National Memorial Day and Jefferson Davis' birthday); the fourth
- 19 day of July (Independence Day); the first Monday of September

- 20 (Labor Day); the eleventh day of November (Armistice or Veterans'
- 21 Day); the day fixed by proclamation by the Governor of Mississippi
- 22 as a day of Thanksqiving, which shall be fixed to correspond to
- 23 the date proclaimed by the President of the United States
- 24 (Thanksgiving Day); and the twenty-fifth day of December
- 25 (Christmas Day). \* \* \* If any legal holiday \* \* \* falls on a
- 26 Sunday, then the next following day shall be a legal holiday.
- 27 (2) In lieu of any one (1) legal holiday provided for in
- 28 subsection (1) of this section, with the exception of the third
- 29 Monday in January ( \* \* \* Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday) and
- 30 the eleventh day of November (Armistice or Veterans' Day), the
- 31 governing authorities of any municipality or county may declare,
- 32 by order spread upon its minutes, Mardi Gras Day or any one (1)
- 33 other day during the year, to be a legal holiday.
- 34 (3) August 16 is declared to be Elvis Aaron Presley Day in
- 35 recognition and appreciation of Elvis Aaron Presley's many
- 36 contributions, international recognition and the rich legacy left
- 37 to us by Elvis Aaron Presley. This day shall be a day of
- 38 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
- 39 holiday.
- 40 (4) May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in
- 41 recognition, observation and commemoration of Hernando de Soto,
- 42 who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by
- 43 Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of
- 44 Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's

- 45 187-day journey from the Tombigbee River basin on our state's
- 46 eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the
- 47 Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall be a day of
- 48 commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and
- 49 European exploration and shall not be recognized as a legal
- 50 holiday.
- 51 (5) Armistice Day (Veterans' Day) shall be observed by
- 52 appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of
- 53 Mississippi. The superintendent of schools of each public school
- 54 district is authorized to provide for the appearance of uniformed
- 55 military personnel, uniformed veterans or the families of fallen
- 56 military personnel/veterans at such public school exercises in
- 57 honor of Armistice (Veterans') Day. The superintendent of schools
- is also authorized to permit the school band and its director(s)
- 59 at any public school in the district to perform at Armistice
- 60 (Veterans') Day exercises in the school district upon the request
- 61 of public officials or veterans associations without loss of any
- 62 program credit by participating students and without loss of leave
- 63 by participating school personnel.
- 64 (6) The month of March is declared to be "Mississippi
- 65 Musicians Month" to recognize and celebrate the state's rich
- 66 musical heritage and to encourage the world to join Mississippi in
- 67 honoring our musicians and their contributions.
- 68 (7) In recognition of the service, courage and sacrifice of
- 69 the valiant service members of the Tuskeqee Airmen who served

- 70 during World War II, the fourth Thursday of March is designated as
- 71 Tuskegee Airmen Day in Mississippi. This should be a day of
- 72 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
- 73 holiday.
- 74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2025.
