## HOUSE BILL NO. 787

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-159-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT RECIPIENTS OF THE MISSISSIPPI EMPLOYER-ASSISTED HOUSING TEACHER PROGRAM BE REQUIRED TO PURCHASE A HOME AND RESIDE IN THE COUNTY WHERE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF EMPLOYMENT IS LOCATED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-159-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 37-159-11. (1) There is established the Mississippi
- 10 Employer-Assisted Housing Teacher Program, which shall be a
- 11 special home loan program for eligible licensed teachers who
- 12 render service to the state in a geographical area of the state
- 13 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated
- 14 by the State Board of Education. The home loan program shall be
- 15 administered by the State Department of Education. The department
- 16 may contract with one or more public or private entities to
- 17 provide assistance in implementing and administering the program.
- 18 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and regulations
- 19 regarding the implementation and administration of the program.

- 20 (2) Participation in the loan program shall be available to
  21 any licensed teacher who renders service in a geographical area of
  22 the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as
  23 designated by the State Board of Education. \* \* \* The maximum
  24 amount of a loan that may be made under the program to any person
  25 shall be Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00).
- 26 Any loan made under the program to a person who actually 27 renders service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state 28 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be converted to an 29 interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for 30 one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan. Any person who does 31 32 not render three (3) years' service as a teacher in a geographical 33 area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of 34 teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be 35 liable to the State Department of Education for one-third (1/3) of 36 the amount of the loan for each year that he does not render such service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 37 38 at the time the person discontinues his service. If a claim for 39 repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an 40 attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee. 41
- 42 (4) All funds received by the State Department of Education 43 as repayment of loans by program participants shall be deposited 44 in the Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

45 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

46 and after July 1, 2025.
