HOUSE BILL NO. 1001

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI INMATE LABOR ACCOUNTABILITY
2 AND REHABILITATION ACT"; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS; TO AUTHORIZE THE
3 COMMISSIONER OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, TO
4 ALLOW THE SALE OF ALL GOODS, WARES, SERVICES OR MERCHANDISE
5 MANUFACTURED BY INMATES TO BE SOLD IN A CERTAIN MANNER; TO REQUIRE
6 THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE SHALL BE ALLOCATED IN A CERTAIN MANNER;
7 TO REQUIRE THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT TO ESTABLISH AN
8 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO REVIEW AND APPROVE THE TYPES OF GOODS AND
9 SERVICES PRODUCED AND SOLD BY INMATES; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN
10 REPORTING OF THE DEPARTMENT CONCERNING GOODS AND SERVICES SOLD BY
11 INMATES; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL
12 PROGRAMS AND FINANCIAL LITERACY TRAINING TO INMATES; AND FOR
13 RELATED PURPOSES.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

15 **SECTION 1. Short Title.**

16 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi
17 Inmate Labor Accountability and Rehabilitation Act."

18 **SECTION 2. Findings and Purpose.**

19 (1) The Legislature recognizes the importance of providing
20 inmates with opportunities for productive work while also ensuring
21 that the proceeds from such work support their rehabilitation and
22 financial obligations.



(2) This act aims to regulate the sale of goods and services produced by inmates in a manner that is consistent with their rehabilitation needs and responsibilities.

SECTION 3. Definitions.

For purposes of this act, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

(a) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

(b) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

(c) "Goods and services" means any products or services manufactured, mined, or provided by inmates.

(d) "Inmate" means any person incarcerated in the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

(e) "Rehabilitation needs" means the financial obligations and responsibilities of inmates, including fines, restitution fees, technical violation fees, and repayment of entitlement benefits such as child support.

SECTION 4. Regulation of Production and Sale.

(1) At the discretion of the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections, all goods, wares, services, or merchandise manufactured, mined, or offered in whole or in part by inmates shall be sold in a manner that is congruent with the identified rehabilitation needs of inmate clubs and club members.



(2) The proceeds from the sale of such goods and services shall be allocated first to fulfill the financial obligations of inmates, including:

- (a) Repayment of fines;
- (b) Restitution fees;
- (c) Technical violation fees; and
- (d) Repayment of entitlement benefits such as child support.

SECTION 5. Oversight and Approval Process.

(1) The commissioner shall establish an oversight committee to review and approve the types of goods and services that may be produced and sold by inmates.

(2) This committee shall evaluate the alignment of proposed sales with the rehabilitation needs and financial obligations of the inmates involved.

SECTION 6. Transparency and Reporting.

(1) The Mississippi Department of Corrections shall publish an annual report detailing the following:

- (a) The types of goods and services produced by inmates;
- (b) The sales generated; and
- (c) The allocation of proceeds towards inmate financial obligations.

(2) This report shall be made available to the public to promote transparency and accountability.



73 **SECTION 7. Rehabilitation and Support Services.**

74 (1) The department shall provide educational programs and
75 financial literacy training to inmates involved in production
76 work, ensuring they understand the implications of their financial
77 obligations.

78 (2) Inmates participating in the programs set out under this
79 section shall receive incentives, such as reduced time for good
80 behavior or credits towards their sentences, to encourage
81 engagement.

82 **SECTION 8. Severability.**

83 If any provision of this act is found to be unconstitutional
84 or invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force
85 and effect.

86 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
87 and after its passage.
