## HOUSE BILL NO. 1057

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-15-5 AND 73-15-20, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIVES TO PRACTICE AS AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE WITHOUT HAVING A WRITTEN COLLABORATIVE/CONSULTATIVE RELATIONSHIP AGREEMENT WITH A PHYSICIAN OR HAVING AN AGREEMENT WITH A PHYSICIAN REGARDING THE PROTOCOL OR PRACTICE GUIDELINES OF THE CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIFE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-15-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 73-15-5. (1) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of
- 12 Nursing.
- 13 (2) The "practice of nursing" by a registered nurse means
- 14 the performance for compensation of services which requires
- 15 substantial knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral,
- 16 psychological and sociological sciences and of nursing theory as
- 17 the basis for assessment, diagnosis, planning, intervention and
- 18 evaluation in the promotion and maintenance of health; management
- 19 of individuals' responses to illness, injury or infirmity; the
- 20 restoration of optimum function; or the achievement of a dignified

- 21 "Nursing practice" includes, but is not limited to,
- 22 administration, teaching, counseling, delegation and supervision
- of nursing, and execution of the medical regimen, including the 23
- administration of medications and treatments prescribed by any 24
- 25 licensed or legally authorized physician or dentist.
- 26 foregoing shall not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis
- or prescriptions of medical, therapeutic or corrective measures, 27
- 28 except as may be set forth by rules and regulations promulgated
- 29 and implemented by the Mississippi Board of Nursing.
- 30 "Clinical nurse specialist practice" by a certified (3)
- 31 clinical nurse specialist means the delivery of advanced practice
- nursing care to individuals or groups using advanced diagnostic 32
- 33 and assessment skills to manage and improve the health status of
- individuals and families; diagnose human responses to actual or 34
- 35 potential health problems; plan for health promotion, disease
- 36 prevention, and therapeutic intervention in collaboration with the
- 37 patient or client; implement therapeutic interventions based on
- the nurse specialist's area of expertise and within the scope of 38
- 39 advanced nursing practice, including, but not limited to, direct
- 40 patient care, counseling, teaching, collaboration with other
- 41 licensed health care providers; and, coordination of health care
- 42 as necessary and appropriate and evaluation of the effectiveness
- 43 of care.
- "Advanced nursing practice" means, in addition to the 44
- practice of professional nursing, the performance of 45

- 46 advanced-level nursing approved by the board which, by virtue of
- 47 graduate education and experience are appropriately performed by
- 48 an advanced practice registered nurse. The advanced practice
- 49 registered nurse may diagnose, treat and manage medical
- 50 conditions. This may include prescriptive authority as identified
- 51 by the board. Advanced practice registered nurses must practice
- 52 in a collaborative/consultative relationship with a physician or
- 53 dentist with an unrestricted license to practice in the State of
- 54 Mississippi, except as otherwise authorized in Section
- 55 73-15-20(3), and advanced nursing must be performed within the
- 56 framework of a standing protocol or practice guidelines, as
- 57 appropriate.
- 58 (5) The "practice of nursing" by a licensed practical nurse
- 59 means the performance for compensation of services requiring basic
- 60 knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral, psychological
- 61 and sociological sciences and of nursing procedures which do not
- 62 require the substantial skill, judgment and knowledge required of
- 63 a registered nurse. These services are performed under the
- 64 direction of a registered nurse or a licensed physician or
- 65 licensed dentist and utilize standardized procedures in the
- 66 observation and care of the ill, injured and infirm; in the
- 67 maintenance of health; in action to safequard life and health; and
- 68 in the administration of medications and treatments prescribed by
- 69 any licensed physician or licensed dentist authorized by state law
- 70 to prescribe. On a selected basis, and within safe limits, the

- 71 role of the licensed practical nurse shall be expanded by the
- 72 board under its rule-making authority to more complex procedures
- and settings commensurate with additional preparation and 73
- 74 experience.
- 75 (6) A "license" means an authorization to practice nursing
- 76 as a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse designated
- 77 herein.
- 78 (7) A "registered nurse" is a person who is licensed or
- 79 holds the privilege to practice under the provisions of this
- article and who practices nursing as defined herein. "RN" is the 80
- 81 abbreviation for the title of Registered Nurse.
- 82 A "licensed practical nurse" is a person who is licensed (8)
- 83 or holds the privilege to practice under this article and who
- practices practical nursing as defined herein. "LPN" is the 84
- abbreviation for the title of Licensed Practical Nurse. 85
- 86 (9) A "registered nurse in clinical practice" is one who
- 87 functions in any health care delivery system which provides
- nursing services. 88
- 89 (10) A "clinical nurse specialist" is a person who is
- 90 licensed or holds the privilege to practice under this article in
- 91 this state to practice professional nursing and who in this state
- 92 practices advanced nursing as defined herein. "CNS" is the
- abbreviation for the title of Clinical Nurse Specialist. 93
- 94 An "advanced practice registered nurse" is a person who
- is licensed or holds the privilege to practice under this article 95

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96 and who is certified in advanced practice registered nurse or

97 specialized nursing practice and includes certified registered

98 nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists and

99 certified nurse practitioners. "CNM" is the abbreviation for the

100 title of Certified Nurse Midwife, "CRNA" is the abbreviation for

101 the title of Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. "CNP" is the

102 abbreviation for the title of Certified Nurse Practitioner.

103 (12) A "nurse educator" is a registered nurse who meets the
104 criteria for faculty as set forth in a state-accredited program of
105 nursing for registered nurses, or a state-approved program of
106 nursing for licensed practical nurses, and who functions as a

107 faculty member.

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108 (13) A "consumer representative" is a person representing

109 the interests of the general public, who may use services of a

110 health agency or health professional organization or its members

111 but who is neither a provider of health services, nor employed in

112 the health services field, nor holds a vested interest in the

provision of health services at any level, nor has an immediate

family member who holds vested interests in the provision of

115 health services at any level.

116 (14) "Privilege to practice" means the multistate licensure

privilege to practice nursing in the state as described in the

118 Nurse Licensure Compact provided for in Section 73-15-201.

- 122 SECTION 2. Section 73-15-20, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 123 amended as follows:
- 124 73-15-20. (1) Advanced practice registered nurses. nurse desiring to be certified as an advanced practice registered 125 126 nurse shall apply to the board and submit proof that he or she 127 holds a current license to practice professional nursing and that he or she meets one or more of the following requirements: 128
- 129 (a) Satisfactory completion of a formal post-basic 130 educational program of at least one (1) academic year, the primary 131 purpose of which is to prepare nurses for advanced or specialized 132 practice.
- 133 Certification by a board-approved certifying body. 134 Such certification shall be required for initial state 135 certification and any recertification as a registered nurse anesthetist, nurse practitioner or nurse midwife. The board may 136 137 by rule provide for provisional or temporary state certification 138 of graduate nurse practitioners for a period of time determined to 139 be appropriate for preparing and passing the National 140 Certification Examination. Those with provisional or temporary 141 certifications must practice under the direct supervision of a licensed physician or a certified nurse practitioner or certified 142

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nurse midwife with at least five (5) years of experience.

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- Rulemaking. The board shall provide by rule the (2) appropriate requirements for advanced practice registered nurses in the categories of certified registered nurse anesthetist, certified nurse midwife and advanced practice registered nurse.
- Collaboration. Except as otherwise authorized in this subsection (3), an advanced practice registered nurse shall perform those functions authorized in this section within a collaborative/consultative relationship with a dentist or physician with an unrestricted license to practice dentistry or medicine in this state and within an established protocol or practice quidelines, as appropriate, that is filed with the board upon license application, license renewal, after entering into a new collaborative/consultative relationship or making changes to the protocol or practice quidelines or practice site. The board shall review and approve the protocol to ensure compliance with applicable regulatory standards. The advanced practice registered nurse may not practice as an \* \* \* advance practice registered nurse if there is no collaborative/consultative relationship with a physician or dentist and a board-approved protocol or practice guidelines. However, a certified nurse midwife is not required to have a written collaborative/consultative relationship agreement with a physician or have an agreement with a physician regarding

- 171 The board shall renew a license for an (4)Renewal. advanced practice registered nurse upon receipt of the renewal 172 173 application, fees and protocol or practice guidelines. The board 174 shall adopt rules establishing procedures for license renewals. The board shall by rule prescribe continuing education 175 176 requirements for advanced practice nurses not to exceed forty (40) 177 hours biennially as a condition for renewal of a license or 178 certificate.
  - (5) Reinstatement. Advanced practice registered nurses may reinstate a lapsed privilege to practice upon submitting documentation of a current active license to practice professional nursing, a reinstatement application and fee, a protocol or practice guidelines, documentation of current certification as an advanced practice nurse in a designated area of practice by a national certification organization recognized by the board and documentation of at least forty (40) hours of continuing education related to the advanced clinical practice of the nurse practitioner within the previous two-year period. The board shall adopt rules establishing the procedure for reinstatement.
- 190 (6) Changes in status. The advanced practice registered 191 nurse shall notify the board immediately regarding changes in the 192 collaborative/consultative relationship with a licensed physician or dentist. If changes leave the advanced practice registered 193

- 196 registered nurse may not practice as an advanced practice
- 197 registered nurse.
- 198 (7) **Practice requirements.** The advanced practice registered
- 199 nurse shall practice:
- 200 (a) According to standards and guidelines of the
- 201 National Certification Organization.
- 202 (b) In a collaborative/consultative relationship with a
- 203 licensed physician whose practice is compatible with that of the
- 204 nurse practitioner, except as otherwise authorized in Section
- 205 73-15-20(3). Certified registered nurse anesthetists may
- 206 collaborate/consult with licensed dentists. The advanced practice
- 207 nurse must be able to communicate reliably with a
- 208 collaborating/consulting physician or dentist while practicing.
- 209 (c) According to a board-approved protocol or practice
- 210 quidelines.
- 211 (d) Advanced practice registered nurses practicing as
- 212 nurse anesthetists must practice according to board-approved
- 213 practice guidelines that address pre-anesthesia preparation and
- 214 evaluation; anesthesia induction, maintenance, and emergence;
- 215 post-anesthesia care; peri-anesthetic and clinical support
- 216 functions.
- 217 (e) Except as otherwise authorized in Section
- 218 73-15-20(3), advanced practice registered nurses practicing in

219	other	specialty	areas	must	practice	according	to	a boar	d-approv	ed
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- 220 protocol that has been mutually agreed upon by the nurse
- 221 practitioner and a Mississippi licensed physician or dentist whose
- 222 practice or prescriptive authority is not limited as a result of
- 223 voluntary surrender or legal/regulatory order.
- 224 (f) Each collaborative/consultative relationship shall
- 225 include and implement a formal quality assurance/quality
- 226 improvement program which shall be maintained on site and shall be
- 227 available for inspection by representatives of the board. This
- 228 quality assurance/quality improvement program must be sufficient
- 229 to provide a valid evaluation of the practice and be a valid basis
- 230 for change, if any.
- 231 (g) Nurse practitioners may not write prescriptions
- 232 for, dispense or order the use of or administration of any
- 233 schedule of controlled substances except as contained in this
- 234 chapter.
- 235 (8) Prescribing controlled substances and medications.
- 236 Certified nurse midwives and certified nurse practitioners may
- 237 apply for controlled substance prescriptive authority after
- 238 completing a board-approved educational program. Certified nurse
- 239 midwives and certified nurse practitioners who have completed the
- 240 program and received prescription authority from the board may
- 241 prescribe Schedules II-V. The words "administer," "controlled
- 242 substances" and "ultimate user," shall have the same meaning as
- 243 set forth in Section 41-29-105, unless the context otherwise

244	requires. The board shall promulgate rules governing prescribing
245	of controlled substances, including distribution, record keeping,
246	drug maintenance, labeling and distribution requirements and
247	prescription guidelines for controlled substances and all
248	medications. Prescribing any controlled substance in violation of
249	the rules promulgated by the board shall constitute a violation of
250	Section $73-15-29(1)(f)$ , (k) and (l) and shall be grounds for
251	disciplinary action. The prescribing, administering or
252	distributing of any legend drug or other medication in violation
253	of the rules promulgated by the board shall constitute a violation
254	of Section $73-15-29(1)(f)$ , (k) and (l) and shall be grounds for
255	disciplinary action.
256	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2025.

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
