HOUSE BILL NO. 1059

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-1-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE CHIEF OF THE CAPITOL POLICE AND/OR THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO CREATE AND EMPLOY A PART-TIME RESERVE LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION TO ASSIST IN EXECUTION OF THEIR DUTIES IN THE CAPITOL COMPLEX IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the
- 11 Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the
- 12 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the
- 13 properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets,
- 14 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set
- 15 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court
- 16 Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building
- 17 and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any
- 18 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State
- 19 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically
- 20 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but

- 21 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would
- 22 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall,
- 23 through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make
- 24 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi
- 25 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of
- 26 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this
- 27 section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through
- 28 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and
- 29 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties
- 30 related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67,
- $31 \quad 29-5-73 \text{ through } 29-5-75, \text{ and } 29-5-81 \text{ through } 29-5-95 \text{ shall remain}$
- 32 with the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 33 (2) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of
- 34 State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and
- 35 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into
- 36 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the
- 37 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the
- 38 State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees
- 39 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the
- 40 City of Jackson.
- 41 (3) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 42 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 43 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 44 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 45 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new

- 46 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and
- 47 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County,
- Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 48
- Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel 49
- 50 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and
- 51 responses to security system alarms.
- 52 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 53 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 54 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 55 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 56 of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds
- 57 Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property.
- 58 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture
- 59 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of
- 60 Public Safety to supply the security personnel to the Department
- 61 of Agriculture with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State
- 62 of Mississippi on this property and any and all buildings on this
- property. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to charge 63
- 64 the Department of Agriculture a fee for security services provided
- 65 for special events at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex.
- 66 The fee charged will be commensurate with the cost associated with
- 67 the Department of Public Safety providing those services.
- 68 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 69 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department
- of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with 70

- 71 jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at
- 72 the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of
- 73 Revenue main office.
- 74 (6) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall have primary
- 75 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law
- 76 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi
- 77 within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District
- 78 created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary
- 79 function. The Department of Public Safety may, through any person
- 80 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make
- 81 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi
- 82 and violations of the City of Jackson's traffic ordinances or
- 83 ordinances related to the disturbance of the public peace which
- 84 occurs within the boundaries of the district and within the
- 85 boundaries of the City of Jackson. The Department of Public
- 86 Safety may choose to present cases to either the District Attorney
- 87 or the prosecuting attorneys designated by the Attorney General
- 88 for prosecution of any violation of law that accrues or occurs, in
- 89 whole or in part, within the boundaries established by Section
- 90 29-5-203. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety
- 91 granted under this subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the
- 92 jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of
- 93 Hinds County, Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 94 Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any
- 95 time and/or during any event necessitating the coordination of

96 and/or utilization at multiple jurisdictions, as determined by the

97 Chief of Capitol Police or the Commissioner of the Department of

98 Public Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on

99 property as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as

provided in subsection (1) of this section. The jurisdiction and

101 authority of the Department of Public Safety under this subsection

(6) shall be in addition to any other jurisdiction and authority

103 provided to the department under this section or any other law.

104 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall have

105 jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State

106 of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson,

107 Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any

108 person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety,

109 make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of

110 Mississippi which occurs within the boundaries of the City of

111 Jackson. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety

112 granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be

113 concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson,

114 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.

115 (c) Written approval from the Chief of the Capitol

116 Police or the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety

117 shall be required before any event occurs which will take place on

118 any street or sidewalk immediately adjacent to any building or

119 property owned or occupied by any official, agency, board,

120 commission, office or other entity of the State of Mississippi, or

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121	which	can	reasonably	, be	expected	t.o	block	. impede	or	otherwise
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- 122 hinder ingress thereto and/or egress therefrom. The Department of
- 123 Public Safety shall promulgate rules and regulations to effectuate
- 124 the provisions of this paragraph (c).
- 125 (d) The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the
- 126 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, the Chief of the
- 127 Jackson Police Department, and the Sheriff of Hinds County shall
- 128 hold a regular meeting within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 129 Complex Improvement District to address the concerns of the
- 130 public. Each meeting shall be called by the Chief of the Capitol
- 131 Police; and the first meeting shall be called by October 15, 2023.
- (e) The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the
- 133 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety is authorized to
- 134 create a part-time reserve law enforcement division to assist with
- 135 the duties described in this section for the Capitol Complex
- 136 Improvement District.
- 137 (7) The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter
- 138 into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of
- 139 the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted
- 140 under this section.
- 141 (8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section
- 142 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section
- 143 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to
- 144 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the
- 145 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department

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- 146 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety
- 147 for all employees transferred under this section.
- 148 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 149 and after July 1, 2025.
