HOUSE BILL NO. 1061

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY, IN 2 DIRECT COLLABORATION WITH THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 3 TRANSPORTATION AND THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LEFLORE COUNTY, TO 4 CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A 5 SAFE AND EFFICIENT ELEVATED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING OR SKYBRIDGE FOR 6 STUDENTS AND VISITORS OF MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY AT OR 7 NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF U.S. HIGHWAY 82 AND SUNFLOWER ROAD 8 (COUNTY ROAD 507) IN ITTA BENA, MISSISSIPPI; AND FOR RELATED 9 PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. (1) The administration of Mississippi Valley
- 12 State University, in conjunction with the Board of Trustees of
- State Institutions of Higher Learning, and in direct collaboration 13
- 14 with the Mississippi Department of Transportation and the Board of
- Supervisors of Leflore County, shall conduct a study to determine 15
- the feasibility of establishing safe, reliable and cost effective 16
- 17 alternative for a safe and efficient elevated pedestrian crossing
- or skybridge for faculty, staff, students and campus visitors of 18
- 19 Mississippi Valley State University at or near the intersection of
- U.S. Highway 82 and Sunflower Road (County Road 507) located in 20
- 21 Itta Bena, Leflore County, Mississippi.

22	(2)	The	commission	shall,	at	a minimum,	study	and	report	to

- 23 the 2025 Regular Session of the Legislature the following:
- 24 (a) The total amount of federal revenue received by the
- 25 State of Mississippi and the total amount of state funds spent on
- 26 federal matching funds that can allowably be allocated for the
- 27 establishment, construction and maintenance of an elevated
- 28 pedestrian crossing or skybridge within the area designated in
- 29 subsection (1) of this section;
- 30 (b) A cost-benefit analysis examining the impact of
- 31 providing alternative pathways to safely traverse the roadway
- 32 which allows safe access to and from the university's campus;
- 33 (c) Examples in Mississippi and/or in other states of
- 34 pedestrian crosswalks or skybridges in highly traveled areas;
- 35 (d) Benefits to university goers and to the local
- 36 community to seamless connect the university with the surrounding
- 37 community by providing a safe and uninhibited navigation corridor
- 38 within the area designated in subsection (1) of this section;
- 39 (e) Previous efforts and key considerations to identify
- 40 a location and pedestrian crossing alternatives within the area
- 41 designated in subsection (1) of this section; and
- 42 (f) Any constraints associated with a proposed
- 43 pedestrian crossing within the area designated in subsection (1)
- 44 of this section, including, but not limited to:
- 45 (i) Plans for future expansion of U.S. Highway 82
- 46 and/or Sunflower Road (County Road 507);

47	(ii)	Current	and	prof	iected	land	uses	in	and	around

- 48 the area;
- 49 (iii) Existing pedestrian infrastructure in the
- 50 area; and
- 51 (iv) Property impacts associated with any proposed
- 52 U.S. Highway 82 pedestrian crossing.
- 53 (3) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any
- 54 department, division, board, bureau, committee or agency of the
- 55 state or any political subdivision thereof, may, at the request of
- 56 the Transportation Commissioner for the Central District, provide
- 57 such facilities, assistance, information and data which will
- 58 enable the study to be properly performed under the authority of
- 59 this section.
- The President of Mississippi Valley State and the Executive
- 61 Director of the Mississippi Department of Transportation, shall
- 62 jointly prepare a report to the Legislature on the results of the
- 63 study not later than December 15, 2025.
- 64 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 65 and after July 1, 2025.
