HOUSE BILL NO. 1062

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-9-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE LICENSED DENTAL HYGIENISTS TO PROVIDE DENTAL HYGIENE 3 SERVICES TO PATIENTS FOR UP TO TEN CONSECUTIVE BUSINESS DAYS UNDER THE GENERAL SUPERVISION OF LICENSED DENTISTS UNDER CERTAIN 5 CONDITIONS; TO PROHIBIT THE PRACTICE OF DENTAL HYGIENE IN A MANNER 6 THAT IS SEPARATE OR INDEPENDENT FROM A SUPERVISING DENTIST, AND 7 PROHIBIT ESTABLISHING OR MAINTAINING AN OFFICE OR A PRACTICE THAT IS PRIMARILY DEVOTED TO THE PROVISION OF DENTAL HYGIENE SERVICES; 8 9 TO PROVIDE THAT A DENTIST MAY NOT SUPERVISE MORE THAN THREE DENTAL 10 HYGIENISTS UNDER GENERAL SUPERVISION AT ANY ONE TIME; TO PROVIDE 11 THAT A DENTIST MAY NOT SUPERVISE A DENTAL HYGIENIST FOR MORE THAN 12 TEN CONSECUTIVE BUSINESS DAYS OR FOR MORE THAN TWENTY-FOUR TOTAL 13 DAYS IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR; TO PROVIDE THAT A PATIENT MAY NOT BE SEEN TWICE CONSECUTIVELY UNDER GENERAL SUPERVISION; TO PROVIDE 14 15 THAT AN EXAMINATION FEE MUST NOT BE CHARGED IF A PATIENT IS SEEN 16 UNDER GENERAL SUPERVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. Section 73-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 19 amended as follows: 20 73-9-5. (1) For the purpose of this chapter, a dental hygienist shall be an individual who has completed an accredited 21 dental hygiene education program, passed the national dental 22 hygiene board and is licensed by the State Board of Dental 23 24 Examiners to provide, as an auxiliary to the dentist, preventive care services including, but not limited to, scaling and 25

30	(2) * * * No person shall practice dental hygiene in a
31	manner that is separate or independent from a supervising dentist,
32	or establish or maintain an office or a practice that is primarily
33	devoted to the provision of dental hygiene services.
34	(3) * * * Under general supervision, a dental hygienist may
35	provide to patients of record, for not more than ten (10)
36	consecutive business days, all dental hygiene services (except the
37	administration of nitrous oxide inhalation or local anesthesia,
38	which must be under direct supervision) if all of the following
39	<pre>conditions are satisfied:</pre>
40	(a) The dental hygienist has practiced dental hygiene
41	in the State of Mississippi for a minimum of five (5) years, such

59	supervision, may delegate or supervise any dental hygiene duties

64	(4) The following limitations also apply to the practice of
65	dental hygiene under general supervision:
66	(a) No entity may employ dental hygienists to provide
67	treatment for patients of record under general supervision other
68	than:
69	(i) A nonprofit entity that meets the statutory,
70	regulatory and program requirements for grantees supported by the
71	Public Health Service and that has supervision by a Mississippi
72	licensed dentist; or
73	(ii) An office owned by a dentist or group of
74	dentists licensed in Mississippi.

75	(b) No duly licensed and registered dentist shall
76	supervise more than three (3) dental hygienists under general
77	supervision at any one time.
78	(c) No duly licensed and registered dentist shall
79	supervise a dental hygienist for more than ten (10) consecutive
80	business days or for more than twenty-four (24) total days in any
81	calendar year.
82	(d) No patient may be seen twice consecutively under
83	general supervision.
84	(e) An examination fee must not be charged if a patient
85	is seen under general supervision.
86	(f) The patient undergoing dental hygiene services
87	under general supervision must be a minimum of eighteen (18) years
88	of age, and either ASA Class I or ASA Class II as defined by the
89	American Society of Anesthesiologist Physical Status
90	Classification System.
91	(5) Notwithstanding the above subsections of this section, a
92	dental hygienist licensed in Mississippi may perform radiographs,
93	oral prophylaxis, and place fluoride varnish without a Mississippi
94	licensed dentist being physically present in the office if all of
95	the other conditions of this section are met.
96	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
97	and after July 1, 2025.
