COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1133

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-11-85, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DEFINE "HIGH-NEEDS SCHOOL" FOR PURPOSES OF PRIORITIZING FUNDING FOR IMPLEMENTING CARDIAC EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLANS (CERPS); TO AMEND SECTION 37-11-87, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT 5 CERPS SHALL ENCOMPASS ATHLETIC VENUE GROUNDS, AND THAT AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) SHALL BE PLACED WITHIN 7 THREE MINUTES OF EACH SCHOOL ATHLETIC VENUE; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 37-11-89, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT 8 OF EDUCATION TO DESIGNATE \$2,499,000.00 TO AID IN IMPLEMENTING 9 10 CERPS; TO SPECIFY THAT FUNDING SHALL BE USED FOR ACTIVITIES AND 11 EQUIPMENT PROMOTING CERP PREPAREDNESS IN SCHOOLS, AND THAT 12 HIGH-NEEDS SCHOOLS SHALL BE GIVEN FUNDING PRIORITY; TO AUTHORIZE 13 THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH A PROCEDURE FOR MONITORING SCHOOL COMPLIANCE WITH FUNDING REQUIREMENTS; TO 14 15 AUTHORIZE SCHOOLS TO ACCEPT GIFTS, GRANTS AND DONATIONS FOR THE 16 PURCHASE OF AEDS THAT MEET THE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE UNITED 17 STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION, AND FOR THE COSTS INCURRED IN 18 INSPECTING AND MAINTAINING, AND TRAINING STAFF IN THE USE OF, SUCH DEVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 19

- 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 21 SECTION 1. Section 37-11-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 22 amended as follows:
- 23 37-11-85. As used in Sections 37-11-87 and 37-11-89, the
- 24 following terms shall have the meanings ascribed herein:
- 25 (a) "Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP)" shall mean
- 26 a written document that establishes the specific steps to reduce

- 27 death from cardiac arrest in any setting be it a school,
- 28 community organization, workplace, or sports facility.
- 29 (b) "Automated External Defibrillator (AED)" shall mean
- 30 a lightweight, portable device that delivers an electric shock
- 31 through the chest to the heart. The shock can potentially stop an
- 32 irregular heartbeat (arrhythmia) and allow a normal rhythm to
- 33 resume following sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).
- 34 (c) "Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA)" means when the heart
- 35 malfunctions and stops beating unexpectedly, and if not treated
- 36 within minutes, it quickly leads to death.
- 37 (d) "High-needs school" means a school where at least
- 38 fifty percent (50%) of children are eligible to receive free and
- 39 reduced-priced meals or a school participating in the Community
- 40 Eligibility Provision or Universal Free Meals. High-needs schools
- 41 may also be defined by Title 1 status.
- 42 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-11-87, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 37-11-87. (1) Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, each
- 45 public school shall develop a cardiac emergency response plan
- 46 (CERP) that addresses the appropriate use of school personnel to
- 47 respond to incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden
- 48 cardiac arrest or a similar life-threatening emergency while on
- 49 school grounds and, beginning in the 2025-2026 school year, school
- 50 athletic venue grounds.

- 65 (4) The CERP shall integrate, at a minimum, the following 66 quidelines:
  - (a) Establishing a cardiac emergency response team;
- (b) Activating the team in response to a SCA;
- 69 (c) A plan for implementing AED placement and routine 70 maintenance within the school;
- 71 (d) Disseminating the plan throughout the school 72 campus;
- 73 (e) Maintaining ongoing staff training in CPR/AED use;
- 74 (f) Practicing using drills annually;
- 75 (g) Integrating local EMS with the plan; and

- plan. 78 Appropriate AED placement shall be dictated by the CERP and in accordance with quidelines set by the American Heart 79 80 Association or another nationally recognized, evidence-based 81 standard. An AED must be identified with appropriate signage and be available in an unlocked location on school property within 82 83 three (3) minutes of each school athletic venue. The AED shall be 84 accessible during the school day and at any other time in which 85 students are participating in a school-sponsored athletic event or 86 team practice. A school or local and regional board of education may accept gifts, grants and donations, including in-kind 87 88 donations designated for the purchase of an AED that meets the 89 standards established by the United States Food and Drug Administration and for the costs incurred to inspect and maintain 90 91 such device and train staff in the use of such device.
- (6) Appropriate school staff shall be trained in first-aid,
  CPR, and AED use that follow evidence-based guidelines set forth
  by the American Heart Association or another nationally
  recognized, evidence-based standard. Staff trained shall be
  determined by the CERP, including, but not limited to, licensed
  coaches, school nurses and athletic trainers.
- 98 **SECTION 3.** The following shall be codified as Section 99 37-11-89, Mississippi Code of 1972:

- 100 37-11-89. (1) The State Department of Education shall 101 designate Two Million Four Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars 102 (\$2,499,000.00) to aid in implementing CERPs. Funding shall be 103 used for activities and equipment promoting CERP preparedness in 104 schools, including, but not limited to, the purchase and 105 maintenance of AEDs and the purchase of training and educational 106 materials on CPR and basic first aid. High-needs schools shall be 107 given funding priority.
- 108 (2) The State Department of Education may establish a
  109 procedure for monitoring compliance by school boards, operators of
  110 independent charter schools, and governing bodies of private
  111 schools to the requirements set forth in subsection (1) of this
  112 section.
  - (3) School boards, operators of independent charter schools, and governing bodies of private schools may accept gifts, grants and donations, including in-kind donations, designated for the purchase of AEDs that meet the standards established by the United States Food and Drug Administration, and for the costs incurred in inspecting and maintaining, and training staff in the use of, such devices.
- 120 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 121 and after July 1, 2025.
