HOUSE BILL NO. 1138

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT EFFECTIVE WITH THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR, ANY LICENSED TEACHER EMPLOYED IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT IN AN AREA DESIGNATED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AS A GEOGRAPHICALLY 5 CRITICAL TEACHER SHORTAGE AREA SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY 6 SUPPLEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,000.00, TO PROVIDE THAT TEACHERS 7 CURRENTLY RECEIVING AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT FOR NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION SHALL NOT BE DISQUALIFIED FROM RECEIVING THE NEW 8 9 \$2,000.00 ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows: 13 37-19-7. (1) Teachers' salaries in each public school 14 district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale 15 for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection. 60 The school district, with assistance from the Department of Education, shall consider the teacher's years of service and 61 62 license type and determine the corresponding salary for the 63 retired teacher. After determining the retired teacher's 64 corresponding salary, the school district may allocate up to one 65 hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of the amount provided under 66 the salary schedule for such teacher, as applicable, as salary and 67 assessment under the program.

After determining the retired teacher's salary, the school district may pay no more than fifty percent (50%) of the retired teacher's compensation as salary to the retired teacher. The remaining fifty percent (50%) of the retired teacher's

- 73 PERS as a pension liability participation assessment.
- 74 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made
- 75 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the

- 199 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 200 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid 201 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 202 district and shall be in addition to its allotments from the total 203 funding formula provided in Sections 37-151-200 through 37-151-215 204 and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated 205 by the State Board of Education. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such 206 207 salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 208 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience 209 otherwise are entitled. However, an educational employee shall 210 receive the salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand 211 Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the qualifying 212 certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this subsection. 213 No school district shall provide more than one (1) annual salary 214 supplement under the provisions of this subsection to any one (1) 215 individual employee holding multiple qualifying national 216 certifications.
- 217 (d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in 218 full or in part, by a local school district or private individual 219 or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement 220 process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or 221 individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district

- or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.
- 224 (3) The following employees shall receive an annual salary 225 supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00), 226 plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to

which the employee may be entitled:

- 228 Effective July 1, 2016, if funds are available for that 229 purpose, any licensed teacher or retired teacher employed by a 230 local school district under the authority of Section 25-11-126 who 231 has met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher Certificate 232 from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and 233 who is employed in a public school district located in one (1) of 234 the following counties: Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, 235 Amite, Bolivar, Coahoma, Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, 236 Sunflower, Washington, Holmes, Yazoo and Tallahatchie. 237 supplement awarded under the provisions of this subsection (3) 238 shall be in addition to the salary supplement awarded under the 239 provisions of subsection (2) of this section.

The additional state compensation shall be limited to those mentor teachers that provide mentoring services to beginning teachers. For the purposes of such funding, a beginning teacher shall be defined as any teacher in any school in Mississippi that has less than one (1) year of classroom experience teaching in a public school.
