HOUSE BILL NO. 1142

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-21-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE QUALIFICATIONS EXEMPTION FOR PERSONS EMPLOYED PREKINDERGARTEN OR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAM, NOT GRANTED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, IN A CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZED BY THE MISSISSIPPI CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZER BOARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-21-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 37-21-3. (1) No person shall act in the capacity of master 11 teacher, teacher or assistant teacher in any federal or state-funded program of early childhood education or "Head Start," 12 13 or perform any of the functions, duties or powers of the same, unless that person shall be qualified in the following manner: 14 15 (a) A master teacher or any other employee or consultant receiving a salary or fee equivalent to that of a 16 master teacher shall meet the qualifications of a teacher in this 17 18 section, including the requirement that a teacher may be required to hold a state teaching license by the State Department of 19 20 Education, and have demonstrated effectiveness as an early H. childhood educator. Effectiveness as an early childhood educator may be demonstrated by a rating of highly effective on a state evaluation of teaching, if available, or with evidence that the teacher has a record of raising the achievement outcomes of prekindergarten students.

26 (b) A teacher shall possess a bachelor's degree in 27 early childhood education, child development or an equivalent 28 field. A teacher may also possess a bachelor's degree in any 29 field as well as have at least twelve (12) credit hours of 30 coursework in early childhood education, child development, or an 31 equivalent field approved by an institution granting a bachelor's degree in the early childhood education, child development or an 32 33 equivalent field; or have a bachelor's degree in any field as well as have completed a specialized early childhood training program 34 35 deemed equivalent by the State Department of Education to twelve 36 (12) hours of approved coursework.

37 An assistant teacher shall possess an associate's (C) degree in early childhood education, child development or an 38 39 equivalent field; or an associate's degree in any field and a 40 Child Development Associate credential, a Montessori certification 41 or an equivalent certification; or a high school diploma/GED and a 42 Child Development Associate credential, a Montessori certification or an equivalent certification. Public school assistant teachers 43 in the voluntary prekindergarten program established by the Early 44 Learning Collaborative Act of 2013 may be required by the State 45

46 Department of Education to meet the definition of a highly 47 qualified paraprofessional in addition to these requirements. 48 The State Department of Education shall adopt any necessary rules, policies or procedures to implement this section. 49 50 (2) Persons employed as a teacher, assistant teacher or in 51 any other capacity in a prekindergarten or early childhood 52 education program, not granted by the State Department of Education, in a charter school authorized by the Mississippi 53 54 Charter School Authorizer Board are exempt from the requirements 55 of this section.

56 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 57 and after July 1, 2025.

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
