HOUSE BILL NO. 1197

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "SAFE SOLICITATION ACT"; TO REQUIRE ANY 2 PERSON WHO DESIRES TO SOLICIT TO OBTAIN A SOLICITATION PERMIT FROM 3 THE MUNICIPALITY, COUNTY OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION IN WHICH THE 4 SOLICITATION OCCURS; TO CREATE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY; TO 5 AMEND SECTIONS 97-35-25 AND 97-35-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 6 CONFORM TO THIS ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 45-1-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 7 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY OR THE CHIEF OF CAPITOL POLICE TO ISSUE SOLICITATION PERMITS; AND FOR RELATED 8 9 PURPOSES.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

11 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the

12 "Safe Solicitation Act".

13 SECTION 2. For purposes of this act, the following words 14 shall have the meanings described herein:

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"Governing Authority" means the municipality, (a)

16 county, political subdivision of the state or state agency that

17 governs the street, traffic median, shoulder, improved shoulder,

18 sidewalk, or improved portion of the roadway where the

19 solicitation occurs.

20 (b) "Solicitation" or "solicit" means to request money 21 or anything of value as a donation or contribution while standing,

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sitting or positioned in any manner on any road, street, highway median, traffic island or highway intersection; or to request any other thing of value in exchange for any goods, wares, merchandise or thing of value while standing, sitting or positioned in any manner on any road, street, highway median, traffic island or highway intersection.

(c) "Solicitation permit" means a form designed and provided by a municipality, county, political subdivision of the state or state agency as proof that a person is authorized to solicit in accordance with this act.

32 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to 33 solicit in any municipality, county or political subdivision of 34 this state without a solicitation permit issued by the 35 municipality, county or political subdivision in which the 36 solicitation will occur.

37 (2) The municipality, county or political subdivision is
38 authorized to charge a fee for the solicitation permit in an
39 amount which shall not exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

40 (3) (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to create or
41 otherwise design a solicitation permit without the authority or
42 permission of a municipality, county or political subdivision in
43 which the solicitation occurs and to use or allow use of the
44 document for the purpose of solicitation in violation of this act.
45 (b) Any person violating the provisions of paragraph

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50 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) (a) Any person who wishes to solicit shall 51 obtain a solicitation permit from the municipality, county or 52 political subdivision in which the solicitation will occur in 53 accordance with this act.

54 (2) Any person who has received a permit may solicit in 55 accordance with the following terms and conditions:

(a) No solicitor may impede traffic at any time;

57 (b) All solicitors must enter or remain in a roadway,
58 street or thoroughfare only while the controlling traffic signal
59 prohibits vehicular movement;

60 (c) All solicitors must remain within one hundred (100)
61 feet of or from the intersection approved under the permit;

62 (d) All solicitations shall occur during daylight hours63 only.

64 (e) Solicitation activities shall not interfere with
65 the safe and efficient movement of traffic and shall not cause
66 danger to the participants or the public.

(f) No person engaging in solicitation activities shall persist after solicitation has been denied, act in a demanding or harassing manner, or use any sound or voice-amplifying apparatus or device, except as otherwise authorized by federal, state, county or municipal law concerning such use.

75 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) Each permit shall allow solicitation only 76 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and one hour before sunset, as 77 determined by the governing authority.

(2) Only one (1) permit will be issued for an intersection
on any given day. Permits will be issued on a first come basis to
those applicants who submit a completed application form.

81 (3) The application for a solicitation permit shall state 82 the name, mailing address and telephone number of the person 83 requesting the authority to solicit, and the location(s) and times 84 the solicitation will take place.

85 SECTION 6. Section 97-35-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 86 amended as follows:

87 97-35-25. (1) Except as otherwise authorized for solicitation permits in accordance with the Safe Solicitation Act, 88 it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to *** * *** willfully 89 90 obstruct the free, convenient and normal use of any public 91 sidewalk, street, highway, alley, road *** * *** or other passageway 92 by impeding, hindering, stifling, retarding or restraining traffic 93 or passage thereon, and any person or persons violating the provisions of this section shall be quilty of a misdemeanor, and 94 95 upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by confinement in the 96

99 (2) The provisions of this section are supplementary to the100 provisions of any other statute of this state.

101 SECTION 7. Section 97-35-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 102 amended as follows:

103 97-35-23. (1) Except as otherwise authorized by a 104 municipality, county, political subdivision or state agency in 105 accordance with the Safe Solicitation Act, it shall be unlawful 106 for any person or persons to intentionally obstruct, or interfere 107 with the normal or ordinary free use and passage of vehicles of or 108 on, any public street or highway provided for use by vehicular 109 traffic, or for any person or persons to intentionally obstruct, 110 or interfere with the normal or ordinary free use and passage of pedestrians of or on any public sidewalk provided for foot travel 111 112 by pedestrians, and any person or persons who so do shall be 113 quilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Four Hundred Dollars 114 115 (\$400.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 116 four (4) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

117 (2) The provisions of this section are supplementary to the118 provisions of any other statute of this state.

SECTION 8. Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

45-1-19. 121 (1)The Department of Public Safety, through the Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the 122 123 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets, 124 125 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set 126 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court 127 Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building 128 and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any 129 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State 130 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically 131 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but 132 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would 133 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall, 134 through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi 135 136 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of 137 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 138 139 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and 140 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties 141 related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95 shall remain 142 with the Department of Finance and Administration. 143

144 (2) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of145 State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and

152 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of (3) 153 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the 154 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department 155 156 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new 157 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and 158 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County, 159 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 160 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel 161 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and 162 responses to security system alarms.

163 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of (4)164 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the 165 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all 166 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department 167 of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds 168 Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property. 169 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture 170 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of

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(5) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of Revenue main office.

185 The Department of Public Safety shall have primary (6)(a) 186 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law 187 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District 188 189 created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary 190 The Department of Public Safety may, through any person function. 191 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make 192 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi 193 and violations of the City of Jackson's traffic ordinances or 194 ordinances related to the disturbance of the public peace which 195 occurs within the boundaries of the district and within the

The Department of Public 197 Safety may choose to present cases to either the District Attorney 198 or the prosecuting attorneys designated by the Attorney General 199 for prosecution of any violation of law that accrues or occurs, in 200 whole or in part, within the boundaries established by Section 201 29-5-203. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety 202 granted under this subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of 203 204 Hinds County, Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol 205 Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any 206 time and/or during any event necessitating the coordination of 207 and/or utilization at multiple jurisdictions, as determined by the 208 Chief of Capitol Police or the Commissioner of the Department of 209 Public Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on property as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as 210 211 provided in subsection (1) of this section. The jurisdiction and 212 authority of the Department of Public Safety under this subsection 213 (6) shall be in addition to any other jurisdiction and authority 214 provided to the department under this section or any other law. 215

(b) The Department of Public Safety shall have
jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State
of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson,
Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any
person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety,
make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of

The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.

226 (C) Written approval from the Chief of the Capitol 227 Police or the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety 228 shall be required before any event or solicitation occurs which 229 will take place on any median, street, alley, or sidewalk 230 immediately adjacent to any building or property owned or occupied 231 by any official, agency, board, commission, office or other entity 232 of the State of Mississippi, or which can reasonably be expected 233 to block, impede or otherwise hinder ingress thereto and/or egress 234 therefrom. The Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules 235 and regulations to effectuate the provisions of this paragraph (c) 236 including conformity with the Safe Solicitation Act created by 237 this act. The Capitol Police and the Jackson Police Department are authorized to issue solicitation permits for any location in 238 239 the City of Jackson in accordance with the Safe Solicitation Act. 240 When the Capitol Police or the Jackson Police Department authorize 241 a solicitation permit, the issuing agency shall provide copies of 242 the solicitation permits issued to the nonissuing agency no less 243 than seven (7) days before the solicitation occurs. 244 The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the (d)

245 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, the Chief of the

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246 Jackson Police Department, and the Sheriff of Hinds County shall 247 hold a regular meeting within the boundaries of the Capitol 248 Complex Improvement District to address the concerns of the public. Each meeting shall be called by the Chief of the Capitol 249 Police; and the first meeting shall be called by October 15, 2023. 250 251 (7)The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter 252 into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted 253 254 under this section.

(8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section 256 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section 257 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to 258 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the 259 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department 260 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety 261 for all employees transferred under this section.

262 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 263 and after July 1, 2025.
