HOUSE BILL NO. 1265

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE SALES TAX DIVERSION STUDY COMMITTEE,
- 2 WHICH SHALL DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE PROPER
- 3 ALLOCATION OF SALES TAX REVENUE BETWEEN THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT
- 4 OF REVENUE AND MUNICIPALITIES; TO PROVIDE THE DUTIES AND
- 5 COMPOSITION OF THE COMMITTEE; TO REQUIRE THE COMMITTEE TO MAKE A
- 6 LEGISLATIVE REPORT UPON COMPLETION OF THE STUDY; AND FOR RELATED
- 7 PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** There is created the Sales Tax Diversion Study
- 10 Committee to examine, evaluate, and develop recommendations
- 11 regarding the proper allocation of sales tax revenue between the
- 12 Mississippi Department of Revenue and municipalities. The
- 13 committee shall:
- 14 (a) Conduct a comprehensive review of current sales tax
- 15 diversion practices and identify discrepancies.
- 16 (b) Assess the financial impact of misallocated sales
- 17 tax revenue on municipalities.
- 18 (c) Analyze technological solutions, including
- 19 modernized software systems, to ensure accurate sales tax
- 20 distribution.

21 ((d)	Evaluate	the	accountability	and	oversight

- 22 mechanisms within the Department of Revenue.
- 23 (e) Develop recommendations for legislative or
- 24 administrative reforms to be implemented in the 2026 Legislative
- 25 Session.
- 26 **SECTION 2.** The committee shall be composed of the following
- 27 thirteen (13) members:
- 28 (a) Three (3) members of the Mississippi Senate,
- 29 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 30 (b) Three (3) members of the Mississippi House of
- 31 Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 32 (c) The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of
- 33 Revenue, or a designee, as an ex officio nonvoting member;
- 34 (d) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Municipal
- 35 League, or a designee;
- 36 (e) The State Auditor, or a designee, to assess
- 37 financial oversight concerns;
- 38 (f) A representative from a Mississippi municipality
- 39 with a population over fifty thousand (50,000), appointed by the
- 40 Governor;
- 41 (g) A representative from a Mississippi municipality
- 42 with a population under fifty thousand (50,000), appointed by the
- 43 Governor;
- 44 (h) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Economic
- 45 Council, or a designee; and

46 (i	.) The	Executive	Director	of	the	Business	and	Industry
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- 47 Political Education Committee, or designee.
- Appointments made under this section shall be made within
- 49 thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act.
- SECTION 3. (1) At its first meeting, the committee shall
- 51 elect a chairperson and vice chairperson from among its members
- 52 and shall establish rules for transacting business and keeping
- 53 records.
- 54 (2) The committee shall meet as necessary and report its
- 55 findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than
- 56 December 1, 2025.
- 57 (3) A majority of committee members shall constitute a
- 58 quorum for conducting business.
- 59 **SECTION 4.** (1) The Mississippi Department of Revenue shall
- 60 provide necessary staff and logistical support to the committee.
- 61 (2) To achieve its objectives, the committee may request
- 62 data, analysis and assistance from any state agency, division or
- 63 political subdivision.
- 64 **SECTION 5.** The Sales Tax Diversion Study Committee shall
- 65 dissolve on or before January 1, 2026, unless extended by the
- 66 Legislature.
- 67 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 68 and after July 1, 2025.
