HOUSE BILL NO. 1268 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI SAVE OUR SERVICE MEMBER TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO SUBMIT A REPORT ON ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2026; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI FIRST RESPONDER PTSD AND SUICIDE PREVENTION TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO SUBMIT A REPORT ON ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2025; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created the Mississippi Save Our
- 12 Service Member Task Force. The purpose of the task force is to
- 13 unite key stakeholders in order to assess the mental health needs
- 14 of military veterans and current members of the Mississippi
- 15 National Guard and to develop a strategic plan and proposed
- 16 legislation addressing mental health issues and the prevention of
- 17 suicide.
- 18 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following
- 19 fifteen (15) members:

- 29 (d) Two (2) psychiatrists experienced in treating

- 32 Governor and one (1) member being appointed by the Lieutenant
- 33 Governor;
- 34 (e) Two (2) chaplains in the Mississippi National
- 35 Guard, appointed by the Adjutant General;
- 36 (f) One (1) company grade military officer with command
- 37 experience, appointed by the Adjutant General;
- 38 (g) One (1) noncommissioned officer with first sergeant
- 39 experience, appointed by the senior enlisted advisor for the
- 40 Mississippi National Guard;
- 41 (h) One (1) field grade officer with battalion
- 42 commander experience, appointed by the Adjutant General;

43 (i) One (1) noncommissioned officer with command

- 44 sergeant major experience, appointed by the senior enlisted
- 45 advisor for the Mississippi National Guard;
- 46 (j) One (1) employee of a university counseling center,
- 47 or a person otherwise responsible for coordinating or providing
- 48 student mental health services on campus, appointed by the
- 49 Governor; and
- 50 (k) One (1) employee of a community mental health
- 51 provider that provides services to veterans and service members,
- 52 appointed by the Governor.
- 53 (3) The task force shall perform the following duties:
- 54 (a) Assess the needs of Mississippi's military force by
- 55 gathering input from veterans and current National Guard members
- 56 about mental health challenges and reviewing existing resources
- 57 and identifying gaps in mental health support services and suicide
- 58 prevention efforts;
- 59 (b) Consult with faculty and researchers at
- 60 universities and colleges who are studying and researching the
- 61 psychology of PTSD and traumatic brain injury, particularly in
- 62 relation to service members' mental health and to suicide
- 63 prevention efforts;
- 64 (c) Review and make recommendations on how to identify
- 65 PTSD and suicidal ideation in veterans and current National Guard
- 66 members and on methods to prevent suicide;

- 84 (4) (a) Appointments to the task force must be made before
- 85 August 1, 2025. Before August 15, 2025, on a day to be designated
- 86 jointly by the legislative members of the task force, the task
- 87 force shall meet and organize by selecting from its membership a
- 88 chair and vice chair. The vice chair shall serve also as the
- 89 secretary and is responsible for keeping all records of the task
- 90 force. A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
- 91 quorum. In the selection of its officers and the adoption of

- 92 rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority
- 93 of the task force is required. Written notice of task force
- 94 meetings shall be sent electronically to all members at least
- 95 fifteen (15) days before the date on which a meeting is to be

- 97 (b) The task force shall make a final report of its
- 98 findings and recommendations, including any recommended
- 99 legislation and funding needs, to the Legislature before January
- 100 1, 2026, at which time the task force will be dissolved.
- 101 (5) Members of the task force may not receive compensation
- 102 for their service on the task force.
- 103 (6) To effectuate the purposes of this act, upon the request
- 104 of the chair of the task force, a department, division, board,
- 105 bureau, committee, institution or agency of the state or a
- 106 political subdivision of the state shall provide the facilities,
- 107 assistance, information and data needed to enable the task force
- 108 to carry out its duties.
- 109 **SECTION 2.** (1) There is created the Mississippi First
- 110 Responder PTSD and Suicide Prevention Task Force. The purpose of
- 111 the task force is to unite key stakeholders in order to assess the
- 112 mental health needs of first responders and develop a strategic
- 113 plan and proposed legislation. The task force shall review and
- 114 make recommendations on how to identify PTSD and those
- 115 contemplating suicide and on methods to prevent suicide for
- 116 Mississippi's first responders. Additionally, this task force

- 117 will identify methods to effectively provide treatment for first
- 118 responders. For the purposes of this section only, the term
- 119 "first responders" includes law enforcement officers, fire
- 120 fighters, 911 dispatchers, members of the Mississippi National
- 121 Guard and emergency medical services.
- 122 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following
- 123 twenty-one (21) members:
- 124 (a) Three (3) members of the Senate Public Health and
- 125 Welfare Committee appointed by the chair of the committee;
- 126 (b) Three (3) members of the House Public Health and
- 127 Human Services Committee appointed by the chair of the committee;
- (c) One (1) employee of the State Department of Health
- 129 appointed by the executive director;
- 130 (d) One (1) employee of the State Department of Mental
- 131 Health appointed by the executive director;
- (e) One (1) employee of the Mississippi Department of
- 133 Human Services appointed by the executive director;
- 134 (f) The Medical Director and the Director of the Office
- 135 of Standards and Training of the Department of Public Safety, or
- 136 their respective designees;
- 137 (g) One (1) employee of the Office of the Attorney
- 138 General appointed by the Attorney General;
- (h) Two (2) members, who must be therapists, appointed
- 140 by the First Responders of Mississippi organization;

- 155 (3) The task force shall perform the following duties:
- 156 (a) Assess the needs of first responders by gathering
- 157 input from first responders about mental health challenges and
- 158 reviewing existing resources, and identify gaps in mental health
- 159 support services;
- 160 (b) Develop a plan to address identified needs by
- 161 creating a detailed plan for programs and services that will
- 162 support first responders' mental health, and identify strategies
- 163 to make mental health services accessible, affordable and
- 164 effective;

- (e) Ensure oversight and sustainability of programs by
 establishing a system and recommending an agency or entity to
 monitor program effectiveness and make needed improvements, and to
 secure funding and resources in order to ensure programs can
 continue long-term; and
- (f) Recommend relevant changes to Mississippi law and other state and local policies which can be implemented by state and local governmental entities.
 - (4) (a) Appointments to the task force must be made within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act. Within fifteen (15) days thereafter, on a day to be designated jointly by the legislative members of the task force, the task force shall meet and organize by selecting from its membership a chair and vice chair. The vice chair shall serve also as the secretary and is responsible for keeping all records of the task force. A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum. In the selection of its officers and the adoption of rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the task force is required. Written notice of task force meetings
