HOUSE BILL NO. 1291

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2 DECLARE THE SECOND MONDAY OF EACH OCTOBER AS A DAY OF OBSERVANCE
3 IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO BE PROCLAIMED "INDIGENOUS PEOPLES'
4 DAY"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 3-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7 amended as follows:

8 3-3-7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2)
9 of this section, the following are declared to be legal
10 holidays * * *: the first day of January (New Year's Day); the
11 third Monday of January (Robert E. Lee's birthday and Dr. Martin
12 Luther King, Jr.'s birthday); the third Monday of February
13 (Washington's birthday); the last Monday of April (Confederate
14 Memorial Day); the last Monday of May (National Memorial Day and
15 Jefferson Davis' birthday); the fourth day of July (Independence
16 Day); the first Monday of September (Labor Day); the eleventh day
17 of November (Armistice or Veterans' Day); the day fixed by
18 proclamation by the Governor of Mississippi as a day of
19 Thanksgiving, which shall be fixed to correspond to the date

20 proclaimed by the President of the United States (Thanksgiving
21 Day); and the twenty-fifth day of December (Christmas Day). In
22 the event any holiday * * * declared legal in this subsection
23 shall fall on Sunday, then the next following day shall be a legal
24 holiday.

25 (2) In lieu of any one (1) legal holiday provided for in
26 subsection (1) of this section, with the exception of the third
27 Monday in January (Robert E. Lee's birthday and Martin Luther
28 King, Jr.'s birthday) and the eleventh day of November (Armistice
29 or Veterans' Day), the governing authorities of any municipality
30 or county may declare, by order spread upon its minutes, Mardi
31 Gras Day or any one (1) other day during the year, to be a legal
32 holiday.

33 (3) August 16 is declared to be Elvis Aaron Presley Day in
34 recognition and appreciation of Elvis Aaron Presley's many
35 contributions, international recognition and the rich legacy left
36 to us by Elvis Aaron Presley. This day shall be a day of
37 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
38 holiday.

39 (4) May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in
40 recognition, observation and commemoration of Hernando de Soto,
41 who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by
42 Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of
43 Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's
44 187-day journey from the Tombigbee River basin on our state's



45 eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the
46 Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall be a day of
47 commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and
48 European exploration and shall not be recognized as a legal
49 holiday.

50 (5) Armistice Day (Veterans' Day) shall be observed by
51 appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of
52 Mississippi. The superintendent of schools of each public school
53 district is authorized to provide for the appearance of uniformed
54 military personnel, uniformed veterans or the families of fallen
55 military personnel/veterans at such public school exercises in
56 honor of Armistice (Veterans') Day. The superintendent of schools
57 is also authorized to permit the school band and its director(s)
58 at any public school in the district to perform at Armistice
59 (Veterans') Day exercises in the school district upon the request
60 of public officials or veterans associations without loss of any
61 program credit by participating students and without loss of leave
62 by participating school personnel.

63 (6) The month of March is declared to be "Mississippi
64 Musicians Month" to recognize and celebrate the state's rich
65 musical heritage and to encourage the world to join Mississippi in
66 honoring our musicians and their contributions.

67 (7) In recognition of the service, courage and sacrifice of
68 the valiant service members of the Tuskegee Airmen who served
69 during World War II, the fourth Thursday of March is designated as



70 Tuskegee Airmen Day in Mississippi. This should be a day of
71 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
72 holiday.

73 (8) The second Monday in October is declared to be Native
74 American or Indigenous Peoples' Day in recognition, observation
75 and commemoration of Native American Indian heritage and the
76 traditional ways of the culture in an effort to bring more
77 awareness to the unique, rich history of this nation that is
78 inextricably tied to the first people of this country and predates
79 the voyage of Christopher Columbus. The designation of this
80 observation further recognizes American Indians and Alaskan
81 Natives as thriving, contemporary sovereign nations who have
82 greatly contributed to the Constitution and foundation of the
83 United States by contributing to the social and cultural
84 enrichment of the quality of the American way of life, and who
85 holds a rightful place among the American family of governments.
86 This day shall be a day of commemoration, recognition and
87 observation of Native Americans and Indigenous People, who are the
88 first inhabitants of this country, and shall not be recognized as
89 a legal holiday.

90 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
91 and after July 1, 2025.
