HOUSE BILL NO. 1343

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MODEL MISSISSIPPI HAIR PROTECTION IN SCHOOLS POLICY ACT"; TO REQUIRE PUBLIC AND CHARTER SCHOOLS TO CREATE POLICIES WITH GUIDELINES THAT PROHIBIT DISCRIMINATION BASED ON HAIRSTYLES; TO ESTABLISH MINIMUM GUIDELINES FOR THE POLICIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 8 "Model Mississippi Hair Protection in Schools Policy Act".
- 9 **SECTION 2.** Each school and school district shall adopt a
- 10 policy to ensure that no student is discriminated against based on
- 11 his or her hairstyle choices. The policy shall be based on the
- 12 best practice models for protecting children against
- 13 discriminatory practices based on hairstyles. At a minimum, the
- 14 policies shall:
- 15 (a) Explicitly prohibit discrimination based on natural hair
- 16 and protective hairstyles;
- 17 (b) Remove any policies or punitive actions that have the
- 18 effect of restricting hairstyles that are disproportionately
- 19 associated with specific racial or cultural groups;

20	(C)	Highlight the impact of hair-based discrimination	on
21	students'	mental health and academic performance through sta	aff and
22	administr	ation trainings;	

- 23 (d) Establish clear, accessible channels for students and 24 families to report instances of hair-based discrimination;
- 25 (e) Refrain from suspensions and other forms of discipline 26 for violations of appearance rules that disrupt students' learning 27 time; and
- (f) Maintain written procedures for students to report
 concerns of potential discrimination in the enforcement of
 appearance policies, with clear guidelines and assurances of no
 retaliation for reporting such.
- 32 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 33 and after July 1, 2025.
