HOUSE BILL NO. 1420

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-7-75, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE PENALTIES FOR TERRORISTIC THREATS MADE AGAINST AN AIRPORT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 97-7-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 97-7-75. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
- 8 as the "Mississippi Terroristic Threats Law."
- 9 (2) (a) A person commits the offense of making a
- 10 terroristic threat when the person makes a threat to commit a
- 11 crime of violence or a threat to cause bodily injury to another
- 12 person if the threat does in fact cause a reasonable expectation
- 13 or reasonable fear of the imminent commission of an offense and
- 14 if, in making the threat, the person has the intent to:
- 15 (i) Intimidate or coerce a civilian population or
- 16 segment of a civilian population; or
- 17 (ii) Influence or affect, by intimidation or
- 18 coercion, the policy or conduct of a unit of government,

- 21 (b) It is not a defense to a prosecution under this
- 22 section that, at the time the defendant made the terroristic
- 23 threat, the defendant did not have the intent or capability to
- 24 actually commit the specified offense, nor is it a defense that
- 25 the threat was not made to a person who was a subject or intended
- 26 victim of the threatened act.
- 27 (3) (a) A person convicted of the offense of making a
- 28 terroristic threat is guilty of a felony punishable by
- 29 imprisonment in the custody of the Mississippi Department of
- 30 Corrections for not more than ten (10) years.
- 31 (b) A person convicted of the offense of making a
- 32 terroristic threat against an airport shall be guilty of a felony
- 33 and punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Mississippi
- 34 Department of Corrections not less than five (5) years.
- 35 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 36 and after July 1, 2025.
