HOUSE BILL NO. 1431 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "EDUCATION EFFICIENCY ACT"; TO CREATE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE EFFICIENCY AND JOINDER TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE URGENT NEED OF PROVIDING HOLISTIC EDUCATIONAL EFFICIENCY AND OPPORTUNITIES TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS THROUGHOUT THE 5 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPOSITION OF THE TASK 6 FORCE AND SPECIFY ITS PURPOSE AND DUTIES; TO SPECIFY CERTAIN DATA 7 THAT MUST BE COMPILED IN A REPORT ON THE STUDY WHICH MUST BE 8 SUBMITTED TO THE LEGISLATURE BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2025; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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- 11 **SECTION 1.** This act may be cited and shall be known as the
- 12 "Education Efficiency Act".
- SECTION 2. (1) There is hereby created the School District 13
- 14 Administrative Efficiency and Joinder Task Force
- 15 to study the urgent need of providing holistic educational
- efficiency and opportunities to school districts throughout the 16
- 17 State of Mississippi, with particular emphasis on evaluation and
- 18 assessments in those counties having two (2) or more school
- 19 districts situated therein and those school districts whose
- 20 boundaries are situated within two (2) counties, for the purpose

- 21 of determining how to substantially reduce the number of school
- 22 districts within the state.
- 23 (2) (a) The task force shall consist of the following
- 24 fifteen (15) members:
- 25 (i) The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the House
- 26 Education Committee;
- 27 (ii) The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Senate
- 28 Education Committee;
- 29 (iii) The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the House
- 30 Accountability, Efficiency, Transparency Committee;
- 31 (iv) The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Senate
- 32 Accountability, Efficiency, Transparency Committee;
- 33 (v) The Chairman <u>and Vice Chairman</u> of the House
- 34 State Affairs Committee;
- 35 (vi) The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the House
- 36 Appropriations Committee;
- 37 <u>(vii)</u> A member of the Mississippi Senate,
- 38 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 39 (<u>viii</u>) The State Superintendent of Public
- 40 Education, or his or her designee;
- 41 (\underline{ix}) Three (3) members of the Standing Commission
- 42 on School District Efficiency, to be appointed by the State Board
- 43 Education, with one (1) being selected from each Mississippi
- 44 Supreme Court District;

45 (\underline{x}) The Commissioner of Higher Education, or	his
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- 46 or her appointee;
- 47 (\underline{xi}) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 48 Community College Board, or his or her appointee; and
- 49 (\underline{xii}) The Commissioner of Revenue, or his or her
- 50 appointee.
- 51 (b) The Chairman of the House Education Committee and
- 52 the Chairman of the Senate Education Committee shall serve as
- 53 co-chairs of the task force, who shall jointly convene the first
- 54 meeting of the task force within twenty (20) days of the effective
- 55 date of this act, and at said meeting, shall elect any additional
- officers from among its membership deemed necessary for the
- 57 efficient discharge of the task force's duties.
- 58 (3) The task force shall adopt rules and regulations
- 59 governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner
- of conducting its business. A majority of the members shall
- 61 constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting any business of
- 62 the task force, and a majority vote of all members present shall
- 63 be required for any recommendations to the Legislature.
- 64 (4) (a) Using existing staff of the State Department of
- 65 Education, the task force shall compile the most recent data
- 66 available which reflects the following:
- 67 (i) The total public school student population for
- 68 the entire State of Mississippi;

69 (ii)	The total	number of	students	enrolled	in	the
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- 70 public school system in each county;
- 71 (iii) The names of each school district situated
- 72 within each county, the total number of students enrolled in those
- 73 school districts and the net enrollment of students in those
- 74 school districts;
- 75 (iv) The total and per pupil administrative costs
- 76 of each school district, using the same funds, functions and
- 77 objects that the department is required to use under Section
- 78 37-151-203(1)(d) in the annual determination of the base student
- 79 cost under the Mississippi Student Funding Formula;
- 80 (v) The density classifications of each school
- 81 district required under Section 3-151-85 for purposes of
- 82 determining the district's transportation costs using the scale of
- 83 allowable costs developed by the department;
- (vi) The total number of sparsely populated
- 85 districts, as defined under Section 37-151-201, in the state;
- 86 (vii) The accreditation level of each school
- 87 district; and
- 88 (viii) Such other objective information that may
- 89 be deemed relevant by the task force in addressing the issue of
- 90 the holistic educational efficiency and opportunities of school
- 91 districts.
- 92 (b) The information gathered by the task force under
- 93 this subsection shall be compiled and presented, by county, in a

- 94 user friendly format that easily allows for comparisons to be made
- 95 between school districts under each category of information.
- 96 (5) In addition to the data compiled under subsection (1) of
- 97 this section, the task force shall include the following
- 98 information:
- 99 (a) An in-depth analysis of all matters that must be
- 100 considered in determining whether or not reducing the number of
- 101 school districts in the state would be feasible or advantageous;
- 102 (b) A list of the benefits and disadvantages of
- 103 reducing or not reducing the number of school districts in each
- 104 specific county having two (2) or more school districts;
- 105 (c) A projection of the most feasible minimum size of a
- 106 school district which is capable of promoting a wholesome
- 107 educational experience, complete with advanced placement courses,
- 108 athletics and other extracurricular activities;
- 109 (d) A projection of the savings in state and local
- 110 funding which would be achieved through the consolidation of
- 111 school districts in each specific county having two (2) or more
- 112 school districts; and
- 113 (e) A recommended procedure to accomplish the
- 114 consolidation of school districts in each specific county having
- 115 two (2) or more school districts and a reasonable time frame in
- 116 which the consolidation could be achieved.
- 117 (6) In order to quantify and affirm the number of school
- 118 districts necessary within the state, if determined that single

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- 120 children and families of this state, the department shall use the
- 121 following criterion:
- 122 (a) An assessment of the largest school districts in
- 123 the state;
- 124 (b) An assessment of the smallest school districts in
- 125 the state;
- 126 (c) An assessment of previously consolidated school
- 127 districts in counties having two (2) or more districts;
- 128 (d) An assessment of school districts whose boundaries
- 129 are situated within two (2) counties;
- 130 (e) The administrative, operational and programs of
- 131 instruction and curriculum of those schools accredited at the
- 132 highest and lowest levels of performance on the accreditation
- 133 rating scale;
- 134 (f) The socio-economic demographics of each district
- 135 with greater populations of at-risk students; and
- 136 (g) Levels of social, economic, academic and cultural
- 137 exposure.
- 138 (7) The task force shall cause the State Department of
- 139 Education to prepare a written report on the study which includes,
- 140 at a minimum, the data and information specified under subsections
- 141 (4), (5) and (6) of this section. The report must be presented to
- 142 the Legislature and the Governor before December 31, 2025.
