## HOUSE BILL NO. 1623

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFIED OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS AND

NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFIED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO BE PAID

5 AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

8 amended as follows:

9 37-19-7. (1) Teachers' salaries in each public school

10 district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale

11 for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection. For

12 teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent

as determined by the State Board of Education, and the following

14 number of years of teaching experience, the scale shall be as

The school district, with assistance from the Department of Education, shall consider the teacher's years of service and license type and determine the corresponding salary for \* \* \* a retired teacher. After determining the retired teacher's corresponding salary, the school district may allocate up to one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of the amount provided under the salary schedule for such teacher, as applicable, as salary and assessment under the program.

After determining \* \* \*  $\frac{1}{2}$  retired teacher's salary, the school district may pay no more than fifty percent (50%) of the retired teacher's compensation as salary to the retired teacher. The remaining fifty percent (50%) of the retired teacher's

compensation as salary shall be paid by the school district to

69 PERS as a pension liability participation assessment.

70	It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made
71	available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the
72	funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall
73	be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal
74	and compensation system implemented by the State Board of
75	Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority
76	to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to
77	establish, administer and maintain the system.
78	All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties from local supplement during the immediately preceding school year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary for the teacher for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to that teacher on or before October 1 of the current school year.

However, school districts are authorized, in their discretion, to negotiate the salary levels applicable to licensed employees who

athletic trainer shall submit documentation to the State

170	Department of Education that the certificate was received before
171	October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement
172	in the current school year, or the licensed athletic trainer shall
173	submit the documentation to the State Department of Education
174	before February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
175	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
176	(vi) An occupational therapist who has met the
177	requirements and acquired initial certification as an Occupational
178	Therapist Registered from the National Board for Certification in
179	Occupational Therapy, Inc., and who is employed by a local school
180	board or the State Board of Education as an occupational therapist
181	and not an administrator. The certified occupational therapist
182	shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education
183	that the certification was received before October 15 in order to
184	be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
185	year, or the occupational therapist shall submit the documentation
186	to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order
187	to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
188	second term of the school year.
189	(vii) A licensed school psychologist who has met
190	the requirements and acquired certification as a Nationally
191	Certified School Psychologist (NCSP) from the National Association

209	regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of
210	the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any
211	private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the
212	process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any
213	employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and
214	the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school
215	district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process
216	resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a
217	private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the
218	process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an
219	employee, the local school district may agree to directly

220	reimburse	the	individual	or	entity	for	such	cost	on	behalf	of	the
221	employee.											

- 222 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 223 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid 224 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 225 district and shall be in addition to its allotments from the total 226 funding formula provided in Sections 37-151-200 through 37-151-215 227 and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated 228 by the State Board of Education. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such 229 230 salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 231 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience 232 otherwise are entitled. However, an educational employee shall 233 receive the salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand 234 Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the qualifying 235 certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this subsection. 236 No school district shall provide more than one (1) annual salary 237 supplement under the provisions of this subsection to any one (1) 238 individual employee holding multiple qualifying national certifications. 239
- If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in 240 (d) 241 full or in part, by a local school district or private individual 242 or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement 243 process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district 244

269	(4) (a) This subsection shall be known and may be cited as
270	the "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition
271	to the minimum base pay described in this section, only if funds
272	are available for that purpose, the State of Mississippi may
273	provide monies from state funds to school districts for the
274	purposes of rewarding licensed teachers, administrators and
275	nonlicensed personnel at individual schools showing improvement in
276	student test scores. The MPBP plan shall be developed by the
277	State Department of Education based on the following criteria:
278	(i) It is the express intent of this legislation
279	that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of
280	accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of
281	Education.
282	(ii) To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,
283	administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal
284	access to the monies set aside in this section, the MPBP program
285	shall be designed to calculate each school's performance as
286	determined by the school's increase in scores from the prior
287	school year. The MPBP program shall be based on a standardized
288	scores rating where all levels of schools can be judged in a
289	statistically fair and reasonable way upon implementation. At the
290	end of each year, after all student achievement scores have been
291	standardized, the State Department of Education shall implement
292	the MPBP plan.

293	(iii) To ensure all teachers cooperate in the
294	spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the
295	local school district to be approved before the beginning of each
296	school year. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, how
297	all teachers, regardless of subject area, and administrators will
298	be responsible for improving student achievement for their
299	individual school.

- (b) The State Board of Education shall develop the processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in student achievement at individual schools and other measures deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria.
- (5) (a) If funds are available for that purpose, each school in Mississippi shall have mentor teachers, as defined by Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213, who shall receive additional base compensation provided for by the State Legislature in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per each beginning teacher that is being mentored. The additional state compensation shall be limited to those mentor teachers that provide mentoring services to beginning teachers. For the purposes of such funding, a beginning teacher shall be defined as any teacher in any school in Mississippi that has less than one (1) year of classroom experience teaching in a public school. 326 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 327 and after July 1, 2025.
