## HOUSE BILL NO. 1767

2	THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI ARTS COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the Mississippi Arts Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
10	\$ 1,562,907.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Arts
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds and
15	donations collected by or otherwise available to the commission,
16	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission for
17	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
18	\$ 2,690,000.00.

19	SECTION 3	. Of	the	funds	appropriated	under	the	provisions	of

- 20 this act, the following positions are authorized:
- 21 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
- 22 Permanent: 10
- 23 Time-Limited: 2
- 24 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 25 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 26 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds
- 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 28 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi
- 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 30 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 31 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 32 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 33 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025
- 34 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 35 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 36 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 37 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 38 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 39 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 40 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 41 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 42 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 43 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to

44 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 202

- 45 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office.
- the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the 46
- 47 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 48 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 49 essential for the agency.
- 50 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 51 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 52 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 53
- 54 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 55 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 56 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 57 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 58 appropriated level.
- 59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 61
- 62 withdrawn and no longer available.
- 63 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 64 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 65 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor. 66
- 67 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Mississippi Arts Commission shall maintain complete accounting and 68

69	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
70	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
71	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
72	2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
73	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to
74	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
75	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
76	during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
77	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
78	Section 2, funds in the amount of One Million Four Hundred Ninety
79	Thousand Dollars (\$1,490,000.00) shall be derived from the
80	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
81	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the following:
82	Training of educators and promotion of arts programs in
83	public schools\$ 100,000.00
84	Miscellaneous grants and programs\$ 350,000.00
85	Whole Schools Initiative\$ 1,040,000.00
86	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that
87	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
88	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
89	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
90	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
91	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
92	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
93	made without competitive bids.

94	SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
95	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
96	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
97	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
98	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
99	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
100	actions contrary to this provision.
101	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
102	Arts Commission may retain an amount not to exceed one percent
103	(1%) of the monies in the Building Fund for the Arts for the
104	purpose of defraying administrative costs associated with
105	administering the grant program established in Section 39-11-13,
106	Mississippi Code of 1972.
107	SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
1 / 2	necessary is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital

108 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 109 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for Mississippi Arts 110 Commission for the Building for the Arts as authorized in House 111 Bill 1822, 2024 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning 112 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 1,750,000.00. 113 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, 114 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this 115 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the 116 117 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not

change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2025.
