HOUSE BILL NO. 1768

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING
2 K-12 AND OTHER RELATED EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING CERTAIN
3 AGENCIES AND PROGRAMS, IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE FISCAL
4 YEAR 2026.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** The following sums, or so much of those sums as
7 may be necessary, are appropriated out of any money in the State
8 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
9 funding K-12 and other related educational activities, including
10 certain agencies and programs, in the State of Mississippi, for
11 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026,
12 as follows:

13 (a) To the State Board of Education for the purpose of
14 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Education, and
15 excluding the expenses of the Vocational and Technical Education
16 Division.....\$ 107,369,734.00.

17 (b) To the State Board of Education for the purpose of
18 defraying the expenses of the Vocational and Technical Education
19 Division of the State Department of Education.....



20\$ 86,567,761.00.

21 (c) To the State Board of Education for the purpose of
22 paying annual compensation to the Chickasaw Cession counties for
23 sixteenth section lands which they lost through sale by the state,

51 Hundred Twenty-six Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-two Dollars
52 (\$126,472.00), or so much of that sum as may be necessary, is
53 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit
54 of the Health Care Expendable Fund to the State Department of
55 Education for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
56 department for the Mississippi Eye Screening Program for providing
57 vision safety services.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
following positions are authorized for the State Department of
Education, excluding the expenses of the Vocational and Technical
Education Division:

Time-Limited: 124

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds
appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi
Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025
headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee



salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
Mississippi State Personnel Board.

Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do
not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the
annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
withdrawn and no longer available.



143 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in

147 **SECTION 6.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.

SECTION 7. No school district shall expend any funds, received under the School Ad Valorem Reduction Grant, unless such school district has specifically identified the amount of the grant within the published budget as required by Section 37-61-9, Mississippi Code of 1972. The published budget shall include the following statement: "Ad Valorem taxes will be \$_____ less as a result of the Ad Valorem Reduction Grants enacted by the Mississippi Legislature in 1992."

SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, funds in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from income derived from the principal of the Education Improvement Trust Fund created by Section 206A, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be used for the School for Math and Science.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized for the Vocational and Technical Education Division of the State Department of Education:

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in this act, an amount not to exceed One Million Twenty-three Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-four Dollars (\$1,023,574.00) is authorized for the support of vocational and technical education programs as authorized in Section 37-31-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, for a period in excess of ten (10) months in a calendar year.



341 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
342 Vocational and Technical Education Division of the State
343 Department of Education shall, with the funds appropriated in
344 Section 1, transfer no more than Seventy-five Thousand Dollars
345 (\$75,000.00) to the Mississippi Soil and Water Conservation
346 Commission for the purpose of providing matching funds to purchase
347 soil conservation equipment.

348 **SECTION 12.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, no more
349 than One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) is
350 provided for the purpose of supporting the Future Farmers of
351 America Center.

352 **SECTION 13.** The State Department of Education shall transfer
353 the designated amounts to the appropriate entities, which shall
354 assume full responsibility for the expenditure of these funds in
355 accordance with state laws and accept all responsibility for any
356 improper expenditure, for the following:

373 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that of
374 the funds provided for Other Early Learning Programs in Section
375 4(a), Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000.00) is included for
376 the Mississippi Department of Education to provide grant
377 opportunities for Other Early Learning Programs through public
378 schools including other public school preschool programs not
379 participating in Early Learning Collaboratives.

380 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, an amount
381 not to exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
382 (\$1,500,000.00) shall be used for technological methods for
383 agricultural programs, computer science, engineering or robotic
384 engineering programs and equipment upgrades and Mississippi
385 Elementary (ME) STEM and STEAM programs from the Career and
386 Technical Education Division of the State Department of Education.
387 All programs must meet Mississippi Science Standards and/or
388 College and Career Standards.

389 Of the funds appropriated in this section, an amount not to
390 exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be distributed to



the Mississippi State University Center for Cyber Education and used for computer science programs development and teacher training for elementary schools, middle schools, and high schools for the purpose of developing K-12 computer science curricula, including both academic and career and technical education programs, developing and delivering teacher training, and working with the State Board of Education and Institutions of Higher Learning in the state to develop teacher preparation programs for computer science endorsements. All programs must meet the 2018 Mississippi Computer Science Standards and/or Mississippi College and Career Standards.

SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that computer science courses may be taught by certified teacher or for elementary level classes, computer science courses may be taught by teachers who are trained by the district in computer science instruction.

SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the sum of Sixty-two Thousand One Hundred Ninety-one Dollars (\$62,191.00), which is the aggregate sum that the school districts in the Chickasaw Cession receive annually from interest payments from the Chickasaw School Fund under Section 212, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, shall be deducted from the allocations to the school districts as provided in Section 29-3-137, Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall be distributed among the school districts in the Chickasaw Cession by the State Department of Education in the



manner that those interest payments were distributed during Fiscal Year 1985.

SECTION 18. Of the funds provided in this act for the purpose of funding the Mississippi Student Funding Formula, the Student Base Amount in Fiscal Year 2026 shall be Six Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-two Dollars and Sixty-one Cents (\$6,842.61).

SECTION 19. With the funds provided in this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that School Attendance Officers and academic teachers at the Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi School for the Blind shall receive their annual increment.

SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Education shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated in this act and that those records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the budget requests for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process for each agency and institution appropriated funds within the provisions of this act.

SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) to the State Board of Education, not less than Twenty-three Million Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$23,080,000.00) shall be used for



National Board Certification. Of this amount, Seven Hundred
Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) shall be used for the World Class
Teacher Program providing instruction and assistance to teachers
seeking National Board Certification.

SECTION 22. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
Section 4(a) not less than Seventeen Million Five Hundred
Fifty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$17,558,000.00) shall be used for
the Educable Child Program. It is the intention of the
Legislature that the State Board of Education shall allocate
funding for the Educable Child Program based upon a recalculated
formula in a manner to include only those billable days funded
through appropriation of state funds and not District funds. It
is the intent of the Legislature that the Educable Child funds
shall be exempt from budget cuts made to the Department of
Education by the Legislature and/or the Office of the Governor.

SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) and
Section 4(a), not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00)
shall be used for the Education Scholarship Account (ESA) Program.
It is the intent of the Legislature that the Education Scholarship
Account (ESA) funds shall not be reduced by the State Department
of Education and/or the Office of the Governor.

SECTION 24. The public school districts of the state are
authorized at their discretion to pay with local funds one hundred
percent (100%) of the cost of the health insurance premiums of the
State and School Employees Health Insurance Plan for all retired



members of the Public Employees' Retirement System who are employed as school bus drivers by the school districts. It is the intention of the Legislature that no state funds shall be used for this purpose.

SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in those received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, not less than Six Million Four Hundred Fourteen Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$6,414,898.00) shall be used for the Compulsory School Attendance Office and School Attendance Officers.

SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Three Million Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$3,060,000.00) shall be used for the Mary Kirkpatrick-Mary Sprayberry Public School Nurse Program. The amount of Three Million Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$3,060,000.00) is provided from the Department of Health.

SECTION 28. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Education shall charge a fee for room and board for



491 students who enroll in the Mississippi School for Mathematics and
492 Science and the Mississippi School of Arts. Such fees will be
493 waived for any student enrolled in the State Children's Health
494 Insurance Program. The amount of such fees shall be Five Hundred
495 Dollars (\$500.00) for each semester.

496 **SECTION 29.** It is the intent of the Legislature that each
497 eligible employee who meets the National Board requirements under
498 Section 37-19-7(2), Mississippi Code of 1972, shall be paid the
499 full supplement and that such supplement shall be included on a
500 prorated basis in the employee's monthly paycheck.

501 **SECTION 30.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
502 Mississippi Department of Education may loan any general or
503 special source fund amount, not to exceed Five Million Dollars
504 (\$5,000,000.00), to any school district for the purpose of
505 providing funds to school districts through the Emergency
506 Assistance Fund as outlined in Section 37-17-6, Mississippi Code
507 of 1972, during the period beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
508 June 30, 2026. The school districts receiving these loans shall
509 repay the Mississippi Department of Education the amount of the
510 loan on or before June 30, 2026.

511 **SECTION 31.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a), Seven
512 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) shall be transferred to the
513 Board of Health no later than December 31, 2025.



514 **SECTION 32.** Any school district receiving funds through Save
515 the Children may provide a ten percent (10%) match from local
516 funds for implementation of the program.

517 **SECTION 33.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a), Two
518 Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) is provided for the Mississippi
519 Community Oriented Policing Services in Schools (MCOPS) grant
520 program. A portion of these funds not to exceed one percent (1%)
521 may be used for training and administrative costs related to
522 oversight and auditing of the program.

523 **SECTION 34.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) and
524 Section 2(a), Twenty-nine Million Dollars (\$29,000,000.00) is
525 provided for an Early Childhood Education Initiative program. The
526 funding shall be provided to early learning collaboratives in
527 Fiscal Year 2026 as follows: no less than Two Thousand Five
528 Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per student in a full-day program and
529 no less than One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00)
530 per student in a half-day program. Funds must be matched as
531 provided by Section 37-21-51, Mississippi Code of 1972.

532 **SECTION 35.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) and
533 Section 4(a), Fifteen Million Ninety-four Thousand Five Hundred
534 Dollars (\$15,094,500.00) shall be used for the Literacy Initiative
535 and Assessment and monitoring and evaluating the adoption and
536 implementation of high-quality instructional materials that have
537 been reviewed through the approved state process and distributed



through regional textbook depository as outlined in Section 37-43-23, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 36. Of the funds appropriated herein, funding is provided for the ACT test, which is the college readiness portion of the state accountability model.

SECTION 37. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a), Two Million Seven Hundred Forty-eight Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-two Dollars (\$2,748,452.00) shall be used for the Mississippi School of the Arts and Four Million Thirty-one Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$4,031,297.00) shall be used for the Mississippi School for Mathematics and Science. It is the intention of the Legislature that of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) for the Mississippi School of the Arts, One Million Three Hundred Seventy-four Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$1,374,226.00) shall be paid to the school no later than July 10, 2025, and One Million Three Hundred Seventy-four Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$1,374,226.00) shall be paid no later than January 10, 2026. All funds appropriated from Section 4(a) for the Mississippi School of the Arts shall be paid to the school each month within ten (10) working days after such amount was received by the Department of Education. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Education shall not reduce the appropriated amounts provided in this act for the Mississippi School of the Arts and the Mississippi School for Mathematics and Science.



563 **SECTION 38.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(b) and
564 Section 2(b), Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is
565 provided for career and technical grants to schools for qualified
566 students as authorized by Section 37-153-15, Mississippi Code of
567 1972.

568 **SECTION 39.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
569 following amounts shall be available to the Schools for the Blind
570 and Deaf: Ten Million Five Hundred Thirty-one Thousand
571 Eighty-eight Dollars (\$10,531,088.00) from Section 1(a), One
572 Million Five Hundred Fifty-seven Thousand Thirty-seven Dollars
573 (\$1,557,037.00) from Section 4(a), and Two Million Four Hundred
574 Fifty-nine Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-five Dollars
575 (\$2,459,725.00) from Section 2(a).

576 **SECTION 40.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(a) of this
577 act, One Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,400,000.00) is
578 provided for the continuation of the current school safety
579 platform.

580 **SECTION 41.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, an amount
581 not to exceed Four Million One Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Three
582 Hundred One Dollars (\$4,171,301.00) is authorized to fully fund
583 the contract between the Department of Education and the Research
584 & Curriculum Unit at Mississippi State University to fund career
585 and technical curricula, services to secondary schools and career
586 and technical assessments.



587 **SECTION 42.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(b) to the
588 State Board of Education, Five Hundred Sixty-two Thousand Nine
589 Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$562,999.00) is provided for
590 secondary career and technical education instructors teaching at
591 post-secondary institutions.

592 **SECTION 43.** In addition to all other funds appropriated
593 herein, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
594 is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to
595 the credit of the Charter School Authorizer Board for operational
596 expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
597 June 30, 2026.....\$ 1,400,000.00.

598 **SECTION 44.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(b), One
599 Million Four Hundred Thirty-two Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-two
600 Dollars (\$1,432,872.00) shall be provided for new Career and
601 Technical Education Programs as determined by the Division of
602 Vocational and Technical Education at the Mississippi Department
603 of Education. Of the funds appropriated to the department for
604 these programs, no amount shall be expended by the department to
605 defray administrative costs.

606 **SECTION 45.** The Mississippi Department of Education shall
607 provide an annual report detailing the funding of industry
608 certifications and the anticipated industry certifications that
609 will be achieved in the upcoming fiscal year to the Legislative
610 Budget Office and the Legislature no later than January 15, 2026.



SECTION 46. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi Department of Education for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Education Enhancement Funds as authorized in House Bill 1823, 2024 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 33,934,767.00.

This reappropriation is made for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of funds as allocated herein:

a. Instructional Materials.....\$ 9,688,518.00.

b. Early Learning Collaboratives.....\$ 15,485,203.00.

c. Other Early Learning Programs.....\$ 8,761,046.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

SECTION 47. With the funds appropriated herein, the Mississippi Department of Education is authorized to make payments for expenses incurred during prior fiscal years for an amount not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Three Hundred Nine Dollars and Eighty-six Cents (\$15,309.86). These payments are for previous year invoices for Accelerate Learning Inc. and McGraw Hill LLC.



635 **SECTION 48.** It is the intent of the Legislature that each
636 eligible professional school counselor employee who meets the year
637 of teaching experience requirements under Section 37-151-5(m),
638 Mississippi Code of 1972, shall be considered having a year of
639 experience for purposes of the annual experience salary increment.

640 **SECTION 49.** The money appropriated in this act shall be paid
641 by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
642 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
643 Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
644 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
645 officers in the manner provided by law.

646 **SECTION 50.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
647 and after July 1, 2025.
