HOUSE BILL NO. 1771

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE
2 STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE
3 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR
4 2026; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
8 to the credit of the Department of Transportation, for the purpose
9 of defraying the administrative expenses of the Mississippi
10 Department of Transportation for the fiscal year beginning
11 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....
12\$ 1,429,085,656.00.

13 **SECTION 2.** The following offices are supported by the funds
14 appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services,
15 the Office of Highways and the Office of Aeronautics and Rails.
16 Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the
17 following positions are authorized:

18 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

19 Permanent: 2,698



Time-Limited: 0

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board.

Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the



45 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
46 essential for the agency.

47 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
48 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
49 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
50 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
51 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
52 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
53 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
54 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
55 appropriated level.

56 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
57 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
58 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
59 withdrawn and no longer available.

60 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
61 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
62 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
63 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

64 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
65 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1,
66 the following amounts shall be available for expenditure in the
67 program budgets as required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi
68 Code of 1972:

74 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
75 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall maintain complete
76 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
77 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
78 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
79 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
80 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
81 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
82 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
83 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

84 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the
85 intention of the Legislature that Six Hundred Fifty Thousand
86 Dollars (\$650,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of
87 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication
88 Program during the Fiscal Year 2026.

89 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
90 authorized for expenditure in Section 3, Five Million Dollars
91 (\$5,000,000.00) shall be transferred by the Mississippi Department
92 of Transportation to the Department of Public Safety Office of
93 Commercial Transportation Enforcement Division for the operations



94 of the Division consistent with Section 77-7-330, Mississippi Code
95 of 1972.

96 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
97 act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend
98 such funds as necessary to conduct project planning. Such project
99 planning shall apply to all preliminary engineering, right-of-way
100 acquisition and construction projects of the department and, at a
101 minimum, shall consist of policies for the oversight and
102 management of project cost which:

103 (a) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each
104 project. For purposes of this provision, projects include
105 preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and
106 construction;

107 (b) Capture and retain the initial project cost
108 estimates for comparison with final actual expenditures;

109 (c) Require that any changes to a cost estimate for a
110 project will be reviewed and approved by district or central
111 office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing
112 any revision, and providing a narrative description of the reasons
113 for approving a revision;

114 (d) Capture the cost of consultants, engineers,
115 attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and
116 professional contractors used in preliminary engineering,
117 right-of-way acquisition and construction projects.



118 **SECTION 8.** None of the funds appropriated under the
119 provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the
120 Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if
121 such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:

122 (a) The explanation and justification for letting such
123 a contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered
124 upon the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;

125 (b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after
126 entry of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives
127 notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of
128 such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation
129 Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the
130 Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation
131 Committee.

132 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that of the
133 sum appropriated in Section 1, the Department is authorized to
134 provide a protective footwear allowance of not more than Two
135 Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per person annually for Engineers,
136 Maintenance, and Construction Workers as part of their safety
137 equipment.

138 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
139 Department of Transportation, Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
140 (\$450,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
141 Program.



142 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, not less
143 than Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000.00) shall be expended for
144 contracted maintenance overlay and pavement rehabilitation.

145 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
146 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer
147 between the various programs in an amount not to exceed ten
148 percent (10%) of the amount allocated in Section 3, except that no
149 transfers shall be authorized which increase the "Administrative
150 and Other Expenses" Program or which decrease the "Maintenance"
151 Program.

152 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
153 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend
154 an amount not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00)
155 received from other public or private entities as reimbursements
156 for payments made on federal projects.

157 **SECTION 14.** With the funds appropriated in this act, the
158 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall notify members of
159 the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award
160 of projects within their respective districts and at least five
161 (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any
162 grant in their district or any public announcement of ceremony
163 regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or
164 bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Any
165 signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or
166 bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made



available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature."
Further, the signage shall state the four-year legislative term in
which the project was funded.

SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that
whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
made without competitive bids.

SECTION 16. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is
authorized to dispose of or transfer used cell phones that are
obsolete or inoperable to cell phone recycling programs dedicated
to providing free phone access to United States military
personnel.

SECTION 17. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
performance measures provided below:

235 **SECTION 18.** The Mississippi Department of Transportation is
236 authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or
237 contribution from any individual, public, or private organization,
238 or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational
239 costs of the department. Such grants, donations or contributions
240 shall be received and expended under the rules and regulations of
241 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner



242 consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to exceed One
243 Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00).

244 **SECTION 19.** With the funds appropriated herein, the
245 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to make
246 payments for expenses incurred during prior fiscal years for an
247 amount not to exceed Two Hundred Ten Thousand One Hundred Thirteen
248 Dollars and Ten Cents (\$210,113.10).

249 **SECTION 20.** In addition to all other funds appropriated
250 herein, the following sums, or so much thereof as may be
251 necessary is appropriated out of the following funds in the State
252 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation for the
253 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026:

254 (a) 2022 Capacity Project Fund for the purposes provided in
255 Section 65-1-141.2, Mississippi Code of 1972.....
256\$ 250,000,000.00.

257 (b) 2022 Emergency Road and Bridge Fund for the purposes
258 provided in Section 65-1-179.1, Mississippi Code of 1972.....
259\$ 60,000,000.00.

260 (c) Strategic Multi-Modal Investments Fund for the purposes
261 provided in Section 65-1-901, Mississippi Code of 1972.....
262\$ 15,000,000.00

263 (d) 2023 Lafayette County Infrastructure Improvement Funds
264 for the purposes provided in Section 65-1-187, Mississippi Code of
265 1972.....\$ 100,000,000.00



266 **SECTION 21.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
267 funds appropriated in Section 20 subsection (b) of this act shall
268 be expended on the projects included in the 2022 ERBR
269 Solicitation.

270 **SECTION 22.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
271 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend such funds
272 appropriated in Section 20 subsection (a) and (b) as necessary to
273 conduct project planning. Such project planning shall apply to
274 all preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and
275 construction projects of the department and, at a minimum, shall
276 consist of policies for the oversight and management of project
277 cost which:

278 (a) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each project.
279 For purposes of this provision, projects include preliminary
280 engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction;

281 (b) Capture and retain the initial project cost estimates
282 for comparison with final actual expenditures;

283 (c) Require that any changes to a cost estimate for a
284 project will be reviewed and approved by district or central
285 office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing
286 any revision, and providing a narrative description of the reasons

SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2,
Three-Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), or so much thereof
as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the
State Treasury to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created
in Section 57-1-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a
manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are
provided for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.

SECTION 24. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 25. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2025.
