HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 32

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND HONORING THE COURAGEOUS LIFE AND EXTRAORDINARY LEGACY OF JAMES HENRY TAYLOR FOR HIS SERVICE DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.

4 WHEREAS, on March 16, 1962, Flying Tiger Line Flight 739 was

5 on a secret mission, but the flight disappeared and was never

6 found, and tragically, all those on board, including 93 United

7 States Army soldiers and 11 civilian crew members, including James

8 Henry Taylor of Olive Branch, Mississippi, perished; and

9 WHEREAS, very little is known about what happened to the

10 plane and its passengers, and due to the circumstances surrounding

11 this mission, the names of those lost have not yet been added to

12 the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C.; and

13 WHEREAS, recently, many families and loved ones of these

14 heroes gathered in Columbia Falls, Maine, where national nonprofit

15 Wreaths Across America (WAA) is based, to be present for the

16 unveiling of a new monument dedicated to the men who were lost,

17 and the new monument, which is made entirely of granite and stands

18 8 feet tall, 9.5 feet wide and 4 feet deep at its base, displays

- 19 the engraving of each of the 93 Army soldiers aboard, as well as
- 20 the names of the 11 flight crew members, many of whom were
- 21 veterans themselves; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the inscription on the stone reads: "Missing in
- 23 action; Presumed dead. Flying Tiger Line Flight 739 went missing
- 24 on March 16, 1962, with 93 U.S. Army soldiers on board. These men
- 25 and their flight crew perished in what would become one of the
- 26 biggest aviation mysteries out of the Vietnam War era. THE NAMES
- 27 OF THOSE WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES AND WHO REMAIN MISSING ARE INSCRIBED
- 28 HERE SO THAT THEY WILL BE SAID ALOUD AND THEIR MEMORY WILL LIVE
- 29 ON."; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the land where the monument was erected was donated
- 31 by WAA Founder Morrill Worcester, and it is located on the balsam
- 32 tip land where brush is harvested each year to make veterans'
- 33 wreaths to be placed on the headstones of our nation's heroes on
- 34 National Wreaths Across America Day; and
- 35 WHEREAS, during the ceremony, the names of each person aboard
- 36 Flying Tiger Line Flight 739 were honored as they were read aloud,
- 37 and there have been renewed efforts to add the names of the men
- 38 who perished on Flight 739 to the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Wall
- 39 as an everlasting tribute to their sacrifice and service; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Dianna Crumpler was among the family members who
- 41 attended the unveiling of the monument, as her brother, James
- 42 Henry Taylor, was on Flying Tiger Line Flight 739, and Dianna,

- 43 who, along with her brother, Curtis Taylor, was 17-years-old when
- 44 the flight disappeared, shared James Henry Taylor's story; and
- 45 WHEREAS, James Henry Taylor was born in Memphis, Tennessee,
- 46 on January 17, 1938, to James Walter and Helen Taylor of Olive
- 47 Branch, Mississippi, and he attended college at then Northwest
- 48 Mississippi Junior College, now known as Northwest Community
- 49 College, in Senatobia, Mississippi; and
- 50 WHEREAS, James was very popular in school, and his friends
- 51 called him "Tater" and everyone who knew him commented about his
- 52 smile, as they said that they never saw him when he wasn't smiling
- 53 or laughing that crazy laugh that everyone knew was coming from
- 54 him; and
- 55 WHEREAS, during his tenure at Northwest, he met Deanna Brown
- 56 from Crenshaw, Mississippi, and fell in love, and the duo was
- 57 united in holy matrimony after he graduated from Northwest; and
- 58 WHEREAS, after his marriage and graduation from Northwest,
- 59 James attended Southwest College in Memphis, now known as Rhodes
- 60 College, and was pursuing a career as a pastor in the Presbyterian
- 61 Church, and was serving as the youth director at his home church,
- 62 which is the same church his sister still attends in Olive Branch,
- 63 Bethel Presbyterian Church, and the pastor at the time took him
- 64 under his wing and loved him like his own son, mentoring him for
- 65 the ministry; and
- 66 WHEREAS, after he finished two years of school, he found out
- 67 that his wife, called Dee, was pregnant with their first child,

- 69 care of his family was to enlist in the Army; and
- 70 WHEREAS, James spent two years in the Army when Dee became
- 71 pregnant with their second child, and a couple of months before
- 72 Jamie Ann was born, James re-enlisted because he could finish his
- 73 next three years in the Army and also study to be a minister while
- 74 in the service; and
- 75 WHEREAS, James had a month off between his two terms of
- 76 service so he brought his family back to Olive Branch to live
- 77 while he served, or at least until he was stationed at a permanent
- 78 base, but the mission to Vietnam, Tiger Line Flight 739 was his
- 79 first deployment; and
- 80 WHEREAS, James preached a sermon about going to Heaven the
- 81 Sunday before he left on that final flight, and the name of the
- 82 sermon was "The Odds against going to Heaven are 6 to 1," which
- 83 was named after a popular song in the early sixties; and
- 84 WHEREAS, the Tiger Line Flight 739 mission was a very secret
- 85 mission, so secret that all of the men were told they could bring
- 86 nothing with them that identified them in any way, so they had to
- 87 leave wedding rings, pictures, dog tags, and everything at home;
- 88 and
- 89 WHEREAS, many of the soldiers on Tiger Line Flight 739 told
- 90 their families that they would likely not be returning alive, but
- 91 James's family did not know how dangerous the mission was at that
- 92 time; and

93	WHEREAS, the flight left on March 16, 1962, and was lost from
94	radar between Guam and the Philippines or Saigon, but James's
95	sister knows the flight made it to Guam because he stopped long
96	enough while they were refueling to drop a postcard to his wife to
97	tell her that he loved her and missed her and where he was, but
98	this was the last contact anyone ever had with him; and
99	WHEREAS, the largest search ever made in the Pacific was
100	launched and several countries joined in the search for anything,
101	but nothing, not even a shred of anything, was found by anyone,
102	and after eight days, the search was called off and the hearts of
103	the family members of all those on board shattered; and
104	WHEREAS, sadly, after James left, Jamie Ann was born with a
105	heart defect and only lived for 12 days, and his daughter, Merry,
106	was 2-years-old when her father departed on Flight 739, and she
107	has said that it was difficult growing up without a father, and
108	that not knowing what happened to him added a layer of grief and
109	lack of closure; and
110	WHEREAS, Merry also attended the dedication of the monument
111	in Maine, and being there among the sons and daughters of other
112	parents who perished, she realized she wasn't alone, and to have
113	her father and the fathers of others honored in such a meaningful
114	way was healing for her; and
115	WHEREAS, James Henry Taylor's unflinching courage and gallant
116	self-sacrifice reflect lasting glory upon himself and uphold the
117	noble traditions of the infantry and the military service; and

118	WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to honor heroic
119	Mississippians such as James Henry Taylor for remarkable
120	dedication and self-sacrifice to the United States of America, the
121	State of Mississippi and the people of Olive Branch, who are
122	eternally appreciative, for without James, the freedom they know
123	and love would not be possible:
124	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
125	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
126	THEREIN, That we do hereby recognize and honor the courageous life
127	and extraordinary legacy of James Henry Taylor for his service
128	during the Vietnam War.
129	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
130	furnished to the family of James Henry Taylor and to the members
131	of the Capitol Press Corps.
