## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 37

1 2 3 4	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND HONORING MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY ON THE COMMEMORATION OF ITS 75TH ANNIVERSARY, AND COMMENDING THE INSTITUTION'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AND THE NATION.
5	WHEREAS, Mississippi Valley State University, originally
6	established as Mississippi Vocational College by enactment of the
7	Mississippi Legislature in 1946, has played a pivotal role in
8	higher education within the State of Mississippi for 75 years; and
9	WHEREAS, the institution was founded with the express purpose
10	of training teachers for rural and elementary schools and
11	providing vocational training, beginning its legacy of academic
12	excellence and service to the community; and
13	WHEREAS, the groundbreaking ceremony on February 19, 1950,
14	marked the beginning of an institution that opened its doors to
15	205 in-service teachers in the summer of 1950 and 14 regular
16	students during its inaugural academic year, 1950-51, under the
17	leadership of its first president, Dr. James Herbert White; and
18	WHEREAS, Mississippi Valley State University has undergone
19	transformative growth, including its name change to Mississippi

- 20 Valley State College in 1964 and subsequently to Mississippi
- 21 Valley State University in 1974, reflecting its expanding mission
- 22 and academic offerings; and
- 23 WHEREAS, "Valley," whereby it is affectionately referenced by
- 24 current and prospective students, alumni and supporters alike, has
- 25 contributed significantly to higher education by offering diverse
- 26 undergraduate and graduate programs, including its first master's
- 27 degree program in 1976 and current offerings in fields such as
- 28 environmental health, criminal justice, business administration,
- 29 and education; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Mississippi Valley State University's leadership has
- 31 been marked by a succession of visionary presidents, culminating
- 32 in the tenure of its eighth and current president, Dr. Jerryl
- 33 Briggs, Sr., who, like his presidential predecessors, continues to
- 34 advance the university's mission under the mantra, "ONE GOAL. ONE
- 35 TEAM. ONE VALLEY . . . IN MOTION"; and
- 36 WHEREAS, MVSU has extended its reach through off-campus
- 37 centers such as the Greenwood Center and Greenville Higher
- 38 Learning Center, thereby enhancing access to education in the
- 39 Mississippi Delta; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Mississippi Valley State University remains
- 41 dedicated to its mission of providing quality undergraduate and
- 42 graduate programs to a diverse community of learners, contributing
- 43 to the betterment of the Mississippi Delta and beyond through
- 44 teaching, learning, research and service; and

45	WHEREAS, Valley's accreditation by the Southern Association
46	of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges and other
47	prestigious bodies, ensures the university's performance at the
48	highest standards of academic excellence; and
49	WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to acknowledge
50	and commend the exceptional investments made by our state's public
51	institutions of higher learning, of Mississippi Valley State
52	University's esteemed caliber, which endeavor daily to equip our
53	state's most valuable human capital with the necessary academic
54	and professional skills to navigate life and achieve their goals:
55	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
56	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
57	THEREIN, That we do hereby recognize and honor Mississippi Valley
58	State University on the occasion of its 75th Anniversary, commend
59	the institution's contributions to the State of Mississippi and
60	the nation, and extend heartfelt congratulations to its students,
61	faculty, alumni and administration for their achievements over the
62	past 75 years.
63	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
