- 4 WHEREAS, in recognition of her superb talent and stellar
- 5 leadership, The University of Southern Mississippi Women's
- 6 Basketball Head Coach Joye Lee-McNelis was inducted into the
- 7 Legends Club on January 18, 2025, achieving the highest honor for
- 8 Southern Miss athletes and coaches; and
- 9 WHEREAS, as a key player on the basketball team at Hancock
- 10 North Central High School, Coach McNelis became known as the top
- 11 guard in Mississippi, and she caught the attention of recruiters
- 12 across the state when the team won two state titles; and
- 13 WHEREAS, after her high school graduation, the budding star
- 14 athlete decided to stay close to her hometown in Leetown,
- 15 Mississippi, to play for the Lady Eagles under the tutelage of
- 16 Coach Kay James; and
- 17 WHEREAS, upon joining the team in 1980 and earning her way
- 18 into the starting lineup, freshman McNelis helped lead Southern

- 19 Miss to its first postseason play when the Lady Eagles advanced to
- 20 the second round of the AIAW Region III Tournament, and in 1982,
- 21 the team repeated history when they made the postseason tournament
- 22 at the National Women's Invitational Tournament; and
- 23 WHEREAS, in her senior year, Coach McNelis led the Lady
- 24 Eagles in scoring with a remarkable 19.7 points per game, and due
- 25 in no small part to her impressive efforts, Southern Miss finished
- 26 the year as the best scoring team in the nation; and
- 27 WHEREAS, in her four years wearing the famed black and gold,
- 28 Coach McNelis won four letters for the Lady Eagles and scored a
- 29 total of 1,512 points for the team, more than almost any other
- 30 player in program history, second only to her mentor Nancy Faulk,
- 31 whose No. 14 jersey she fittingly received upon Faulk's
- 32 graduation; and
- 33 WHEREAS, as signified by her 1997 induction into the Southern
- 34 Miss M-Club Hall of Fame, Coach McNelis remains a legend in the
- 35 Lady Eagle record books, ranking amongst the top 10 players in
- 36 seven statistical categories, including all-time scoring, scoring
- 37 average (14.0 ppg), field goals made and attempted, free throws
- 38 made and attempted, and free throw percentage; and
- 39 WHEREAS, after earning her bachelor's degree in business
- 40 distributive education in 1984, Coach McNelis accepted a job
- 41 working under Southwest Texas State Head Coach Dennis McNelis, who
- 42 utilized her innate recruiting ability to bolster his new squad;
- 43 and

44	WHEREAS, upon realizing they are perfect teammates, Dennis
45	and Joye married, and they have two wonderful children together:
46	Connor, who has followed in his parents' footsteps and is the
47	assistant coach at Arkansas State, and Whitney, who, together with
48	her husband Michael Wilkerson, has blessed her parents with two
49	perfect grandchildren, Emma Grace and Caroline Lee; and
50	WHEREAS, after two seasons at Southwest Texas State, Coach
51	McNelis returned to her beloved alma mater in 1986 to work under
52	Coach Kay James, her former coach and mentor, and the dynamic duo
53	helped the Lady Eagles soar to new heights, with the team
54	finishing 103-47 for a total win percentage of 68.7 percent; and
55	WHEREAS, a true student of the game, Coach McNelis showed the
56	offensive-minded Coach Kay new ways to approach the basket in the
57	rapidly changing world of college basketball, and together they
58	led their team to three NCAA Tournaments, two Metro Conference
59	Tournament Titles, and a regular season championship; and
60	WHEREAS, Coach McNelis had equal impact off the court as the
61	recruiting coordinator for Southern Miss, bringing in multiple
62	classes ranked in the top 10 nationally and signing some of the
63	greatest players in the program's history, including Tanya
64	Bullock, Alexis Hall, and 1994 Kodak All-American Janice Felder,
65	the most decorated Lady Eagle in program history; and
66	WHEREAS, in 1991, administrators at Memphis State gave Coach
67	McNelis the opportunity to coach basketball at the Division I
68	level, and in her 13 seasons as the head coach for the Lady

- 69 Tigers, Coach McNelis amassed a 229-156 overall record and proved
- 70 her ability as a program builder capable of delivering consistent
- 71 wins; and
- 72 WHEREAS, Coach McNelis remains the last Memphis State coach
- 73 to take the program to the NCAA Tournament, leading the Lady
- 74 Tigers to four NCAA Tournaments and helping her 1995 team advance
- 75 to the second round; and
- 76 WHEREAS, in 2004, Coach McNelis made her long awaited return
- 77 to Reed Green Coliseum as the head coach of the Lady Eagles, and
- 78 immediately upon her return, she began laying the foundation for
- 79 the program's future success by establishing the Wings, a booster
- 80 club comprised of the team's most dedicated supporters; and
- WHEREAS, only a few years into her tenure as head coach,
- 82 Coach McNelis delivered back-to-back 20-win seasons for Southern
- 83 Miss with 21 wins in 2007-2008 and 20 wins in 2008-2009, a feat
- 84 that fans had not witnessed since the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996
- 85 seasons; and
- WHEREAS, Coach McNelis was recognized as the Conference USA
- 87 Coach of the Year after her 2013-2014 team won 10-straight down
- 88 the stretch to finish second in the Conference USA standings, and
- 89 the team advanced to the Conference USA Tournament championship
- 90 game before qualifying for the WNIT, tying for the record of
- 91 all-time single-season wins in program history with a 27-7 season;
- 92 and

93	WHEREAS, under the guidance of Coach McNelis, the 2014-2015
94	team won another 25 games and advanced to the WNIT Great 8, the
95	farthest any Lady Eagle team has advanced in postseason play,
96	marking the first time Southern Miss posted back-to-back seasons
97	with 25-plus wins since 1988-1989 and 1989-1990; and
98	WHEREAS, in the 2019-2020 season, Coach McNelis oversaw her
99	500th game as the head coach of the Lady Eagles, and in the
100	2021-2022 season opener against William Carey, she notched her
101	500th career win; and
102	WHEREAS, in her first year leading the Lady Eagles in the Sun
103	Belt Conference, Coach McNelis and her 2022-2023 squad topped 20
104	wins for the first time since the 2016-2017 season, tied the
105	program's high-water mark with 13 conference wins, and delivered
106	the program's first conference title since the 1993-1994 season,
107	marking the first conference title for Coach McNelis since her
108	1997-1998 Conference USA claim at Memphis and her fourth overall;
109	and
110	WHEREAS, in 2023, Coach McNelis celebrated her 300th win as
111	head coach of the Lady Eagles in an astounding victory against
112	University of Louisiana at Monroe, making Southern Miss one of
113	only six Division I programs with two head coaches boasting over
114	300 wins, and her 2023-2024 squad made another appearance in the
115	postseason WNIT, advancing to the Super 16 to claim back-to-back
116	20-win seasons once again; and

117	WHEREAS, perhaps her most significant accolade, Coach McNelis			
118	was named the recipient of the 2024 Pat Summitt Most Courageous			
119	Award by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association, a particularly			
120	meaningful honor due to the friendship she found with Summitt			
121	while coaching at Memphis State; and			
122	WHEREAS, the focused, resolute, and supremely talented Coach			
123	McNelis now deservedly takes her place as the 22nd inductee into			
124	the Legends Club and the third Lady Eagle to earn the prestigious			
125	honor, joining her former coach Kay James and her former recruit			
126	Janice Felder; and			
127	WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize			
128	and honor the hard work and incredible accomplishments of			
129	Mississippi's extraordinary citizens, especially those such as			
130	Southern Miss Head Coach Joye Lee-McNelis, who radiates excellence			
131	and inspires each player who has the opportunity to learn and			
132	flourish under her expert leadership:			
133	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF			
134	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING			
135	THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate The University			
136	of Southern Mississippi Women's Basketball Head Coach Joye Lee-			
137	McNelis upon her induction into the Legends Club and extend best			
138	wishes for continued success in all her future endeavors.
