HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 64

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING DR. PHYLLIS POLK 2 JOHNSON, DNP, RN, FNP-BC, ON HER ELECTION AS THE 2024-2026 3 PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF STATE BOARDS OF NURSING AND 4 HER SUCCESS AS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF 5 NURSING. 6 WHEREAS, Dr. Phyllis Polk Johnson, DNP, RN, FNP-BC, Executive 7 Director of the Mississippi Board of Nursing, has a distinguished career in the field of nursing regulation which has earned her the 8 9 prestigious distinction of being elected the 2024-2026 President 10 of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN); and WHEREAS, the NCSBN, a world leader in nursing regulatory 11 12 knowledge and advancement which is comprised of member nursing regulatory bodies from all 50 states and around the world, 13 14 empowers and supports regulators in their mandate to protect and 15 promote the welfare of the public and interests of the profession 16 of nursing; and 17 WHEREAS, since 2017, Dr. Johnson has ably served the State of 18 Mississippi as the Executive Director of the Mississippi Board of

Nursing, the state agency vested with the authority to regulate

- 21 has been responsible for the oversight of nearly 70,000 nurses,
- 22 including RNs, LPNs and APRNs; and
- 23 WHEREAS, before being named Executive Director of the Board
- 24 of Nursing, Dr. Johnson served as the Director of Advanced
- 25 Practice and Licensure for the board, where she was responsible
- 26 for the regulation of licensure, compliance and discipline for the
- 27 more than 5,000 nurse practitioners, nurse midwives and certified
- 28 registered nurse anesthetists; and
- 29 WHEREAS, a native of Carthage, Mississippi, Dr. Johnson,
- 30 whose parents instilled in her the value of hard work and a desire
- 31 to excel at a young age, graduated as salutatorian of her class
- 32 from South Leake High School in Walnut Grove before earning a
- 33 bachelor of science in nursing, cum laude, and a master of science
- 34 in nursing from the Mississippi University for Women, as well as a
- 35 master of science in biology, with an emphasis in genetics and
- 36 molecular biology, from Jackson State University; and

- 37 WHEREAS, since taking the helm at the Board of Nursing, Dr.
- 38 Johnson has furthered her education by completing a doctor of
- 39 nursing practice degree from Alcorn State University with a 4.0
- 40 GPA, all the while cultivating a culture of excellence for the
- 41 agency's employees and staff and steering the board on a steady
- 42 course; and
- 43 WHEREAS, Dr. Johnson, who has exercised numerous clinical and
- 44 managerial responsibilities in her more than 35 years of nursing,

- 45 has been instrumental at the Board of Nursing in developing rules
- 46 and regulations pertaining to the prescribing practices of
- 47 Advanced Practice Nurses; and
- 48 WHEREAS, Dr. Johnson's wisdom, natural leadership abilities,
- 49 tireless work ethic, and commitment to excellence have led to her
- 50 appointment to numerous important advisory boards and committees,
- 51 including: the Governor's Opioid and Heroin Drug Task Force; the
- 52 Governor's COVID-19 Advisory Board; the NCSBN National Licensure
- 53 Compact Executive Committee; the Jackson State University COVID-19
- 54 Advisory Board; the Mississippi Board of Medical Licensure's
- 55 Advisory Committee for Physician Assistants; the Advisory
- 56 Committee for the Project Change Initiative of My Brother's
- 57 Keeper; and Chairman of the Madison County Business League and
- 58 Foundation Health and Well-Being Committee; and
- 59 WHEREAS, in recognition of her countless contributions, Dr.
- 60 Johnson has been the worthy recipient of several notable awards,
- 61 including the Mississippi Business Journal's 2019 Mississippi's
- 62 Business Woman of the Year and the 2021 Madison County Economic
- 63 Development Authority Visionary Leadership Award; and
- 64 WHEREAS, a decorated officer in the United States Navy
- 65 Reserves who achieved the rank of Commander before retiring in
- 66 2013, Dr. Johnson is a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority,
- 67 Inc., and actively participates in the renowned service
- 68 organization's Jackson, Mississippi, Alumnae Chapter; and

70	professional and volunteer work in the community by her husband,
71	Clinton Johnson, Jr., her two sons, William and Trey, and seven
72	adoring grandchildren; and
