HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 83

A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING THE HONORABLE ISLA TULLOS UPON HER RETIREMENT AND COMMENDING HER FOR 28 YEARS OF DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVICE AS THE MAYOR OF RAYMOND, MISSISSIPPI.

- 4 WHEREAS, the Honorable Isla Tullos, Mayor of the City of
- 5 Raymond, Mississippi, is retiring from her position at the helm of
- 6 city leadership after 28 extraordinary years of dedicated public
- 7 service; and
- 8 WHEREAS, first elected in 1997 after tossing her hat into the
- 9 ring at the urging of two local aldermen, Mayor Tullos won her
- 10 office offering citizens a vision of the Raymond she saw the then-
- 11 stagnant city had the potential to become; and
- 12 WHEREAS, while Mayor Tullos was anxious to undertake
- 13 beautification and historic preservation projects that would have
- 14 been immediate signs of progress to the townsfolk, her first
- 15 priority after taking office was to tackle critical infrastructure
- 16 projects desperately needed, such as the drilling of a deeper
- 17 water well for cleaner water, extending water lines and making
- 18 sewer system upgrades; and

19	WHEREAS, with the city's fundamental infrastructure needs							
20	being greatly improved, Mayor Tullos put to use her planning and							
21	organizational skills to lead the quaint town in ongoing efforts							
22	to improve its aesthetics, a focus that actually had begun a few							
23	years before Mayor Tullos assumed office when she and her husband,							
24	Max, purchased an early 1800's dilapidated building on the town							
25	square and transformed the structure into a masterpiece of a home							
26	complete with a courtyard and stunning gardens; and							
27	WHEREAS, one of Mayor Tullos's earliest beautification and							
28	historic preservation projects was the transformation of what some							
29	may have considered an eyesore, a rare 1905 Chicago Bridge and							
30	Iron Company metal water tank right in the center of the town							
31	square, which is now designated an official Mississippi Landmark,							
32	surrounded by meticulously maintained plants in a garden-like							
33	setting; and							
34	WHEREAS, throughout her seven terms of office, Mayor Tullos							
35	has been at the forefront of efforts to preserve Raymond's							
36	history, and in 1998, in order to purchase a local Confederate							
37	battlefield, she and six others established Friends of Raymond,							
38	Inc., a nonprofit preservation group comprised solely of							
39	volunteers which continues to this day to actively work with the							
40	City of Raymond and other local entities to preserve the area's							
41	rich history and coordinate historic preservation efforts; and							
42	WHEREAS, to help cement official recognition of the city's							
43	historical significance by its own residents and visitors alike,							

44	Mayor Tullos led the board of aldermen in adopting policies and							
45	securing various designations in furtherance of preservation							
46	efforts in Raymond, including the implementation of comprehensive							
47	zoning regulations, developed in conjunction with the Mississippi							
48	Planning and Development District in 2002, and in 2003, the							
49	establishment of the Historic Preservation Commission, the							
50	Heritage Overlay District approved by the Mississippi Department							
51	of Archives and History, and the Raymond Historic District, listed							
52	on the National Register of Historic Districts, as well as							
53	achieving Certified Local Government Status under the National							
54	Historic Preservation Act by the National Park Service, United							
55	States Department of the Interior; and							
56	WHEREAS, Mayor Tullos spearheaded other activities which							
57	showcased the beauty of the small town while engendering a sense							
58	of pride and community among Raymond's residents, including a							
59	pilgrimage of homes, churches and other historic properties, a							
60	celebration of the iconic 100-year-old water tower, and a							
61	celebration marking the city's 175th birthday; and							
62	WHEREAS, the high quality of life and beauty the City of							
63	Raymond has to offer has not gone unnoticed, and in 2004, the city							
64	was recognized as a Designated 2004 Preserve America Community in							
65	honor of its commitment to preserving and using its cultural and							
66	natural resources for the benefit and enjoyment of the public, in							
67	addition to receiving a letter and certificate of commendation							
68	from United States First Lady Laura Bush; and

- WHEREAS, other honors the city received during Mayor Tullos's
- 70 tenure include its 2009 recognition by the Governor's Community
- 71 Projects of Excellence Awards Program as the BEST Small
- 72 Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Project and a 2016
- 73 National Association of Development Organizations (NADO)
- 74 Innovation Award for the project "The City of Raymond City Hall
- 75 and Courtroom Renovations"; and
- 76 WHEREAS, Mayor Tullos, designated a Graduate of the Certified
- 77 Municipal Official Course, Professional Development Level, by the
- 78 Mississippi Municipal League and past president of the Metro
- 79 Mayors Association, served as the 2006-2007 President of the Board
- 80 of Trustees of the Mississippi Heritage Trust, which fittingly
- 81 selected Mayor Tullos as the recipient of its 2022 Heritage Award
- 82 for Distinguished Service; and
- WHEREAS, devout in her faith, Mayor Tullos has served many
- 84 years as a Warden at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Raymond; and
- 85 WHEREAS, Mayor Tullos, who considers her 28 years as Mayor of
- 86 Raymond her "entry and departure into politics," admits having a
- 87 passion for Raymond, and over her nearly three decades in office,
- 88 she has phenomenally not only preserved the city but shaped it
- 89 into a special place -- a "best-kept secret" according to
- 90 residents -- one where, in her own words, there is "a warm,
- 91 loving, diverse bunch of people ... in a safe place to live ...
- 92 [with] all the wonderful assets of a large city and still

93	[offering]	the	peace	and	auiet	of	small-town	-in-the-	-country

- 94 living"; and
- 95 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 96 recognize and pay tribute to outstanding Mississippians,
- 97 especially those such as Mayor Isla Tullos, whose long and
- 98 distinguished selfless public service to the City of Raymond has
- 99 enriched the lives of her fellow citizens and community, bringing
- 100 honor not only to the City of Raymond but also the entire State of
- 101 Mississippi:
- 102 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 103 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 104 congratulate the Honorable Isla Tullos upon her retirement and
- 105 commend her for 28 years of dedicated public service as the Mayor
- 106 of the City of Raymond, Mississippi.
- 107 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we do hereby extend our
- 108 sincerest wishes to Mayor Tullos for every success in all her
- 109 future endeavors.
