- 28 left fans on the edge of their seats until the last second, and
- 29 Tupelo's biggest deficit came late in the second quarter, when the
- 30 team trailed 20-7; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the Lady Wave saw its first lead of the game after a
- 32 layup by senior Jade Rucker with 2:38 remaining in the third
- 33 quarter, and a back-and-forth affair followed with multiple lead
- 34 changes and overtime; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Jade Rucker, who has signed to play college
- 36 basketball at Austin Peay, led Tupelo during the championship game
- 37 with 22 points and 12 rebounds, and behind Rucker, Nadia Norfleet
- 38 had 14 points for Tupelo and Olivia Smith had 12; and
- 39 WHEREAS, the Lady Wave has been superbly coached and inspired
- 40 by Head Coach Matt Justice, who has broadened the players'
- 41 knowledge of the game and refined their skills in execution, and
- 42 he continues to build upon the legacy of superior play and true
- 43 sportsmanship forged by the tenacious and undaunted spirit of each
- 44 team member; and
