HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 103

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER AND
MERITORIOUS LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE OF MAYOR PHILIP R. FISHER UPON

3 THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT.

WHEREAS, Mr. Philip R. Fisher, the Mayor of the City of

5 Clinton, Mississippi, and community leader extraordinaire, is

6 retiring after selflessly dedicating 12 years of illustrious

7 service and competent guidance to the wonderful people of the

8 Clinton community; and

9 WHEREAS, born in 1954, Mayor Fisher grew up in Jackson,

10 Mississippi, attending Green Elementary School, Bailey Jr. High

11 School and Callaway High School, and he received his bachelor of

12 science degree in marketing from Mississippi State University in

13 1976 and his United States Army College Master Degree in Strategic

14 Studies in 2003; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at Mississippi State, Mayor Fisher

16 began his journey into politics, as he was twice elected to the

17 student Senate, served as secretary and president of his

- 18 fraternity, and was elected Mr. Mississippi State University in
- 19 1976; and
- 20 WHEREAS, in addition to graduating college in 1976, Mayor
- 21 Fisher also exchanged the vows of holy matrimony with Rita Kathryn
- 22 Davis of Enterprise, Mississippi, in May 1976, and they completed
- 23 their family unit with the addition of two children, Brian, and
- 24 his wife Mimmie, and their children, Mary Elizabeth, Hasten Doxey
- 25 and Graham Campbell, and daughter, Dana Faggert, and her husband
- 26 Andrew, and their daughter, Kathryn Hartfield (Hart); and
- 27 WHEREAS, after graduation, Mayor Fisher heroically joined the
- 28 United States Marine Corps, serving at Marine Corps Base Camp
- 29 Pendleton as a Platoon Commander, Weapons Platoon Commander and
- 30 Assistant Battalion Operation Officer; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Mayor Fisher also joined the Mississippi Army
- 32 National Guard, where he served as an Operations Officer, Planning
- 33 Officer and Commanding Officer of the 31st Rear Area Operation
- 34 Center; State Drug Reduction Officer; Intelligence Officer for the
- 35 66th Troop Command; Deputy Commanding Officer and then Commanding
- 36 Officer for the 184th Expeditionary Sustainment Command; and
- 37 WHEREAS, in August 2005, Mayor Fisher was mobilized for
- 38 Hurricane Katrina, serving as Chief of Staff, and in October 2005,
- 39 he was mobilized for Operation Iraqi Freedom, where he commanded
- 40 soldiers in Kuwait, Iraq and Afghanistan, with the task of
- 41 accounting for the thousands of missing shipping containers
- 42 throughout the Theater, and his and his teams' efforts resulted in

43	a reduction of monthly billing by the shipping companies from an
44	estimated \$25,000,000 per month to \$3,000,000 per month; and
45	WHEREAS, Mayor Fisher was activated for Operation Enduring
46	Freedom in June 2009, where he served as the senior Transportation
47	Officer in Afghanistan, and as the senior Transportation Officer,
48	his responsibilities included the command of 43,000 soldiers,
49	sailors, airmen, Marines, and civilians as well as all movement of
50	food, fuel, other supplies and ordinance in and out of
51	Afghanistan; and
52	WHEREAS, additionally, Mayor Fisher commanded the air assets
53	associated with both troop and supply movement in Afghanistan, and
54	had more trucking assets on the road in Afghanistan on any given
55	day than Walmart had in the entire United States, and his
56	responsibilities allowed him to work in close coordination with
57	other NATO countries including the United Kingdom, Canada, New
58	Zealand, Australia, Romania, France, Italy and Scotland; and
59	WHEREAS, Mayor Fisher has received numerous distinguished
60	military awards, some of the most prestigious a fearless combatant
61	can receive, and they include the Defense Superior Service Medal,
62	Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation
63	Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal,
64	National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Global
65	War on Terrorism Service Medal, NATO Medal and the Ranger Tab; and
66	WHEREAS, in his civilian life, Mayor Fisher worked as an
67	equipment salesman for Stribling Puckett before joining the sales

- 68 team at Procter and Gamble in 1985, and during his tenure with
- 69 Proctor and Gamble, he worked in the grocery, nursing home,
- 70 medical and dental divisions before retiring in 2007, and he was
- 71 recognized at the regional and national level for sales
- 72 achievement; and
- 73 WHEREAS, Mayor Fisher reentered the political arena in 1993
- 74 when he was elected for the first time as an alderman for the City
- of Clinton, and he would go on to be re-elected to that position
- 76 three more times, and in 2007, he was elected District 4 Hinds
- 77 County Supervisor and then re-elected in 2011; and
- 78 WHEREAS, after serving as an alderman for 14 years and on the
- 79 Hinds County Board of Supervisors for six years, he was elected as
- 80 the Mayor of Clinton in 2013, beginning his first term on July 1,
- 81 2013, and Mayor Fisher assumed the role with years of invaluable
- 82 experience under his belt, and he utilized his training and
- 83 expertise to serve the role of mayor with efficiency and
- 84 effectiveness and respected each citizen's ideas and visions; and
- WHEREAS, for the past 12 years, Mayor Fisher has worked
- 86 tirelessly to strengthen the City of Clinton, improve
- 87 infrastructure, and serve the people with passion and purpose, and
- 88 his dedication will leave a lasting mark for generations to come;
- 89 and
- 90 WHEREAS, Mayor Fisher was also honored with the Outstanding
- 91 Citizen of the Year Award, a title that reflects the impact of a
- 92 lifetime dedicated to leadership, integrity, and unwavering

- 101 Clinton, retirement will surely leave an insatiable void for
- 102 governing and mingling with Mississippi's finest in the heart of
- 103 Mayor Fisher, but he is overjoyed to spend time with his family
- 104 and grandchildren and reflect on the countless number of
- 105 remarkable people that have touched his life throughout his
- 106 12-year career as the Mayor of the City of Clinton; and
- 107 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 108 recognize and commend the tireless devotion to the betterment of
- 109 Mississippi and honor the ardent vow to impeccable public service
- 110 that Mr. Philip R. Fisher, bestowed to the citizens of Mississippi
- 111 as Mayor of the City of Clinton:

- 113 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
