5 WHEREAS, Major General John Trent Kelly, a dedicated and decorated leader in the Mississippi Army National Guard, will 6 7 retire in May 2025 after 40 years of exemplary service to the 8 State of Mississippi and the United States of America; and 9 WHEREAS, Major General Kelly began his military career in 10 1985 at the age of 19 when he enlisted in the Mississippi Army National Guard, later joining the Reserve Officer Training Corps 11 12 (ROTC) at the University of Mississippi, where he was commissioned as an officer on May 14, 1988; and 13 14 WHEREAS, throughout his distinguished career, Major General

14 WHEREAS, throughout his distinguished career, Major General 15 Kelly has served in numerous leadership positions, including 16 command at the company, battalion, and brigade levels, culminating 17 as the Assistant Adjutant General for the Mississippi Army 18 National Guard at the Joint Force Headquarters; and

WHEREAS, his dedication to service included multiple deployments, including: Operation Desert Storm in 1990 as an Engineer Second Lieutenant; Operation Iraqi Freedom III in 2005 as a Major with the 155th Brigade Combat Team; and a second deployment to Iraq in 2009 as the Battalion Commander of Task Force Knight of the 155th Brigade Combat Team; and

25 WHEREAS, Major General Kelly has received numerous awards and 26 commendations for his military service, including: two Bronze 27 Stars; the Legion of Merit; the Combat Action Badge; the Bronze, 28 Silver, and Gold de Fleury Medals; and many other federal, state, 29 and campaign medals; and

30 WHEREAS, in addition to his military service, Major General 31 Kelly has pursued extensive education, earning an associate degree 32 from East Central Community College, a bachelor's degree and Juris 33 Doctor from the University of Mississippi, and a master's degree 34 in strategic studies from the United States Army War College; and 35 WHEREAS, Major General Kelly has exemplified the

36 Citizen-Soldier ideal, balancing military service, family, and a 37 civilian career in public service, including his tenure as a 38 prosecutor, district attorney, and currently as a member of the 39 United States House of Representatives representing Mississippi's 40 First Congressional District; and

41 WHEREAS, Major General Kelly has been a great personal 42 leader, friend, and mentor to State Representative Rodney Hall 43 both in the Mississippi Army National Guard and as a
