SENATE BILL NO. 2006

AN ACT TO RECONSTITUTE THE MISSISSIPPI FAIR COMMISSION; TO 2 PROVIDE FOR ITS COMPOSITION; TO PRESCRIBE AND RESTORE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES, WHICH HAD BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE BY VIRTUE OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5 1566, 2020 REGULAR SESSION; TO AMEND SECTIONS 69-5-1, 69-5-3, 6 69-5-5, 69-5-7, 69-5-8, 69-5-11, 69-5-13, 69-5-15, 69-5-27, 7 69-5-29 AND 69-5-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 69-5-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 11 12 69-5-1. * * * 13 (* * *1) In order to promote agricultural and industrial 14 development in Mississippi and to encourage the farmers to grow better livestock and agricultural products, there is hereby 15 16 created * * * a body politic and corporate to be hereafter known as the "Mississippi Fair * * * Commission," which said body 17 politic and commission shall be under the management and control 18 of the commission, * * * which shall be composed of the following: 19 The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, who 20 (a) shall serve as the chairman * * *;

- 22 <u>(b)</u> The Director of the Mississippi State University
- 23 Extension Service, or his or her appointee * * *;
- 24 <u>(c) The President of the Mississippi * * * Cattlemen's</u>
- 25 Association, or his or her appointee;
- 26 (d) The * * * President of the Mississippi * * * Farm
- 27 Bureau Federation, or his or her appointee;
- 28 (e) The * * * President of the Junior League of
- 29 Jackson, or her appointee * * *;
- 30 (f) The * * * Director of Visit Mississippi, or his or
- 31 her appointee; and * * *
- 32 (g) The President of the Mississippi Horse Show
- 33 Association, or his or her appointee.
- 34 (2) Each member of the commission shall be appointed to
- 35 serve for a term of four (4) years * * * without salary
- 36 compensation. In the event a vacancy occurs by resignation or
- 37 death, the respective organization from which the appointment was
- 38 made shall designate a successor to represent the organization on
- 39 the commission wherein the vacancy was created.
- 40 (3) The Mississippi Fair Commission is hereby vested with
- 41 all of the powers, duties, property, contractual rights and
- 42 obligations to expended funds that shall be appropriated by the
- 43 Legislature.
- SECTION 2. Section 69-5-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 45 amended as follows:

47 up rules and regulations consistent with the law governing the distribution of state monies for premiums or awards, which shall 48 49 not be less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each and capped 50 at an amount established by the commission, which such amounts 51 shall be appropriated by the Legislature based upon the 52 commission's recommendations for such purpose included in its 53 annual budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 54 Committee. It will be the duty of the * * * commission to meet 55 upon the call of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, in 56 his or her capacity as chairman, at least twice each year, to 57 approve premium lists or awards, and give out rules governing 58 participants in state premium money in Mississippi. 59 commission may invite the presidents of the various district livestock shows before the * * * commission when determining 60 61 policies affecting district livestock shows.

The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall set

- 62 (2) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission is hereby
 63 authorized to accept money or funds donated to the * * *
 64 commission, including funds to be awarded as prizes in livestock
 65 competition. Any money or funds received under this subsection
 66 shall be placed in a special fund. The * * * commission shall not
 67 expend any money or funds from the special fund without
 68 appropriation by the Legislature.
- 69 (3) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall have charge 70 of the State Fairgrounds located in Jackson, Mississippi,

- 72 full power and authority in perfecting plans and causing to be
- 73 held thereon the Mississippi State Fair and other such events that
- 74 may be authorized by the * * * commission. The Mississippi State

- 76 subsection.
- 77 (4) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission is hereby
- 78 authorized to employ an attorney as prescribed in Section 69-1-14.
- 79 (5) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission may take any
- 80 action authorized in Section 1 of Chapter 306, Laws of 2000.
- 81 (6) Subject to the approval of the Department of Finance and
- 82 Administration, the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission may allow a
- 83 commercial, charitable or governmental entity to use, publish and
- 84 advertise such entity's name in connection with any of the
- 85 buildings, improvements, grounds or objects located on the State
- 86 Fairgrounds as defined in subsection (3) of this section, except
- 87 for the Kirk Fordice Equine Center, or in connection with any of
- 88 the events conducted on the State Fairgrounds in return for a
- 89 monetary consideration paid to the * * * commission. Furthermore,
- 90 the * * * commission may lease to any public, private, commercial
- 91 or charitable entity for a term not to exceed twenty (20) years
- 92 naming rights to buildings, except for the Kirk Fordice Equine
- 93 Center, or property, including, but not limited to, new
- 94 construction, improvements to existing buildings, grounds and/or
- 95 objects located on the State Fairgrounds as defined in subsection

- 96 (3) of this section in return for consideration benefitting the
- 97 commission. The lessee shall pay the cost of erecting,
- 98 maintaining and removing signage related to the property. Those
- 99 funds received from an entity for allowing its name to be used,
- 100 published or advertised in connection with the buildings,
- 101 improvements, objects or events shall be retained by the * * *
- 102 commission to be used for capital improvements to the fairgrounds
- 103 or in its annual operating budget subject to appropriation by the
- 104 Legislature and shall be deposited in the special fund referenced
- 105 in subsection (8) of this section. The \star \star commission shall not
- 106 enter into any such agreement with any vendor whose products are
- 107 illegal for participation in or use by persons eighteen (18) years
- 108 of age and under.
- 109 (7) The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, as
- 110 Chairman of the Mississippi Fair Commission, is authorized to form
- 111 and establish a private foundation or nonprofit corporation to
- 112 receive and disburse private funds for the purpose of supporting
- 113 the fairgrounds through fundraising efforts and the acceptance of
- 114 donations for the benefit of the fairgrounds. The funds shall be
- 115 disbursed in accordance with the guidelines described in this
- 116 section, and the foundation or nonprofit corporation shall be
- 117 subject to the reporting requirements described in subsection (10)
- 118 of this section. All funds shall remain with the foundation until
- 119 disbursement and shall not be transferred to the State General
- 120 Fund. No public funds shall be deposited into the account of the

- 121 private foundation or nonprofit corporation established by 122 the * * * commission for the benefit of the State Fairgrounds, nor 123 shall the Legislature appropriate any State General Fund or 124 Special Fund monies to the foundation or nonprofit corporation for 125 such purposes. All monies received by the foundation shall be 126 maintained separately from funds allocated to the * * * commission 127 for operating and administrative costs associated with the State Fairgrounds as defined in subsection (3) of this section. 128 129 addition to the reporting of information to be included in the annual legislative report of the * * * commission, the private 130 131 foundation or nonprofit corporation shall be subject to annual 132 financial audits by the State Auditor and by auditors of donors in 133 the same manner as required for state agencies.
 - (8) The * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall have the authority to enter into a lease or right-of-way with a third party covering any land or buildings on the State Fairgrounds as defined in subsection (3) of this section, and any funds generated from such lease or right-of-way shall remain in a special fund managed by the * * * commission for the benefit of the State Fairgrounds. All monies in the special fund shall be subject to appropriation by the Legislature and may be used for capital improvements to the State Fairgrounds as defined in subsection (3) of this section, or in the * * * commission's annual operating budget for operating and administrative costs associated with the State Fairgrounds.

 Any unexpended funds remaining in the special fund shall not lapse

- 148 (9) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission is hereby
- 149 authorized \star \star \star to adopt such rules and regulations as may be
- 150 necessary or desirable to carry out, execute or implement the

- 152 (10) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall report by
- 153 January 1 of each year a detailed financial statement of all

- 156 House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Senate

- SECTION 3. Section 69-5-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 161 amended as follows:
- 162 69-5-5. The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall appoint,
- 163 subject to the advice and consent of the Senate, a director to
- 164 serve within the * * * Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
- 165 Commerce, who shall oversee all operations at the State
- 166 Fairgrounds Complex and its adjoining properties and who shall be
- 167 required to keep full and complete minutes of the commission's
- 168 actions and give full and detailed reports of livestock shows and
- 169 fairs participating in premium monies, for report to the Governor
- 170 and Legislature. The compensation of the director shall be fixed

- 171 by the * * * commission, subject to approval by the State
- 172 Personnel Board, and shall be exempt from the provisions of
- 173 subsection (2) of Section 25-3-39.
- 174 **SECTION 4.** Section 69-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 175 amended as follows:
- 176 69-5-7. Headquarters of the Mississippi State Fair * * *
- 177 <u>Commission</u> shall be in connection with the office of the
- 178 Department of Agriculture and Commerce.
- SECTION 5. Section 69-5-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 180 amended as follows:
- 181 69-5-8. The building under the jurisdiction of the * * *
- 182 Mississippi Fair Commission, that is located in Jackson,
- 183 Mississippi, and used primarily as an arena for rodeo and
- 184 livestock expositions and related events, shall be named the Kirk
- 185 Fordice Equine Center. The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission
- 186 shall prepare or have prepared a distinctive plaque, to be placed
- 187 in a prominent place within the Kirk Fordice Equine Center, that
- 188 states the background, accomplishments and service * * * of
- 189 Governor Kirk Fordice to the State of Mississippi.
- 190 **SECTION 6.** Section 69-5-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 191 amended as follows:
- 192 69-5-11. (1) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission shall
- 193 charge for admission to the State Fair. The proceeds thereof
- 194 shall be used for the repayment of revenue bonds issued for the

- 195 purpose of constructing, equipping and furnishing new buildings 196 and making improvements on the State Fairgrounds.
- 197 Funds collected in excess of those required to retire any outstanding bond indebtedness may be used as operating revenue 198 199 for the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission for operating and 200 administrative costs associated with the State Fairgrounds, and 201 such excess funds received by the * * * commission shall be 202 deposited in a special fund account managed by the * * * 203 commission for the benefit of the State Fairgrounds.
- 204 (3) The State Treasurer is hereby directed to invest such 205 excess funds to the credit of the special account managed by 206 the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission for the benefit of the State 207 Fairgrounds.
- 208 Section 69-5-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is SECTION 7. 209 amended as follows:
- 210 69-5-13. The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission is hereby 211 authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to declare by 212 resolution the number and type buildings which need to be 213 constructed and the type improvements that need to be made on the 214 state fairgrounds, and file a certified copy of said resolution 215 with the State Building Commission. If the State Building 216 Commission believes such construction and improvements to be in the best public interest, and that receipts from admission to the 217 218 State Fair reasonably shall be expected to produce sufficient revenues over a period not to exceed twenty (20) years to retire 219

- 220 bonds issued to pay the cost of such improvements as well as the
- 221 interest thereon, it may, in its discretion, approve the request
- 222 of the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission.
- 223 **SECTION 8.** Section 69-5-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 224 amended as follows:
- 225 69-5-15. (1) The words "revenue bonds" shall be deemed to
- 226 mean bonds payable solely from the net revenue received by
- 227 the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission.
- The Department of Finance and Administration shall have power
- 229 and is hereby authorized, at one time or from time to time by
- 230 resolution, to authorize the issuance of negotiable revenue bonds
- 231 to provide funds for the purpose of paying all or any part of the
- 232 cost of construction and/or improvements requested by the * * *
- 233 Mississippi Fair Commission pursuant to Section 69-5-13, or the
- 234 cost of any purchase of property or improvements thereon pursuant
- 235 to Section 17-17-49, but in no event shall the amount of such
- 236 bonds outstanding at any one time exceed Four Million Dollars
- 237 (\$4,000,000.00); and shall cause a certified copy of such
- 238 resolution to be delivered to the State Bond Commission. No bonds
- 239 shall be issued under this section after April 23, 2008. Upon the
- 240 receipt of said authorizing resolution, the State Bond Commission,
- 241 acting as the issuing agent, shall issue and sell the revenue
- 242 bonds of the State of Mississippi when authorized at the time and
- 243 in the amount indicated in said resolution, prescribe the form of
- 244 the bonds, advertise for and accept bids therefor, issue and sell

245	the bonds, and do any and all other things necessary and advisable
246	in the issuance and sale of said bonds. The principal of and the
247	interest on such revenue bonds shall be payable solely from a
248	special fund to be provided for that purpose from the net revenue
249	received by the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission. Such bonds
250	shall bear date or dates, be in such denomination or
251	denominations, bear interest at such rate or rates, provided that
252	the bonds of any issue shall not bear a greater overall maximum
253	interest rate to maturity than that allowed in Section 75-17-103,
254	be payable at such place or places within or without the State of
255	Mississippi, shall mature at such time or times, be redeemable
256	prior to maturity at such time or times and upon such terms, with
257	or without premium, shall bear such registration privileges, and
258	shall be substantially in such form, all as shall be determined by
259	the State Bond Commission. Such bonds shall mature in annual
260	installments beginning not more than three (3) years from date
261	thereof and extending not more than twenty (20) years from date
262	thereof. Such bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the State
263	Bond Commission, or by his facsimile signature, and the official
264	seal of the State Bond Commission shall be affixed thereto, and
265	attested by the Secretary of the State Bond Commission. The
266	interest coupons, if any, to be attached to such bonds or other
267	certificates thereon may be executed by the facsimile signatures
268	of said officers. Whenever any such bonds shall have been signed
269	by the officials herein designated to sign the bonds who were in

- 270 office at the time of such signing but who may have ceased to be 271 such officers prior to the sale and delivery of such bonds, or who 272 may not have been in office on the date such bonds may bear, the 273 signatures of such officers upon such bonds and coupons shall 274 nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes and have the 275 same effect as if the person so officially signing such bonds had 276 remained in office until the delivery of the same to the purchaser 277 or had been in office on the date such bonds may bear.
- 278 No bonds shall be issued under the authority of this 279 section prior to February 1, 1983; thereafter such bonds may be 280 issued provided that the expansion and other improvements of the 281 Mississippi Industrial Showcase and Trade Mart Building shall have 282 priority in the use of the proceeds of such bonds and provided 283 that the Department of Finance and Administration has approved 284 plans to increase the size of such building by at least fifty 285 percent (50%).
- SECTION 9. Section 69-5-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- the power and authority, in its discretion, to borrow money from
 any bank or banks in an amount not in excess of Two Hundred
 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00), to be used for the repair,
 renovation or maintenance of buildings located at the Mississippi
 State Fairgrounds. The * * commission may use any funds
 accruing to it to service and retire said indebtedness. Such loan

- 295 shall not exceed a term of ten (10) years and shall bear interest
- 296 at a rate not in excess of that provided for in Section 75-17-101.
- 297 Any loan secured under the provisions of this section shall
- 298 be approved by the State Bond Commission.
- 299 **SECTION 10.** Section 69-5-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 300 amended as follows:
- 301 69-5-29. The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission may by
- 302 regulation establish policies for the issuance of free passes.
- 303 These policies shall not prohibit officials of the fair or
- 304 designated authority from entering said places for inspection
- 305 purposes; shall not apply to press reporters designated to report
- 306 news items; and shall not prohibit the commission from declaring
- 307 specified days, such as Press Day, Legislator's Day, or any other
- 308 special day.
- 309 **SECTION 11.** Section 69-5-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 310 amended as follows:
- 311 69-5-31. (1) The * * * Mississippi Fair Commission is
- 312 authorized to hire and designate area law enforcement officers on
- 313 a contractual basis to provide security and to enforce all laws of
- 314 the State of Mississippi on the Mississippi State Fairgrounds
- 315 Complex. All officers must have attended and satisfactorily
- 316 completed the training course required for law enforcement
- 317 officers at the Law Enforcement Officer's Training Academy or an
- 318 equivalent facility. All officers must be current with this
- 319 certification. A complete record of all law enforcement training

- 321 employment. Furthermore, the * * * Mississippi Fair Commission
- 322 may enter into a contract with any certified law enforcement
- 323 officer to provide security to the * * * Mississippi Fair
- 324 Commission with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of
- 325 Mississippi on property known as the "Mississippi State
- 326 Fairgrounds Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and
- 327 property.
- 328 (2) (a) All officers while in performance of their duty on
- 329 the premises or at any of the facilities at the Mississippi State
- 330 Fairgrounds Complex under the direction or control of the * * *
- 331 Mississippi Fair Commission and public property immediately
- 332 adjacent to such facilities shall:
- 333 (i) Be required to dress in uniforms prescribed by
- 334 the respective law enforcement agency by which he or she is
- 335 employed; and
- 336 (ii) Be authorized to carry weapons.
- 337 (b) Employees designated as officers shall be duly
- 338 sworn and vested with authority to bear arms and make arrests, and
- 339 shall exercise primarily the responsibilities of the prevention
- 340 and detection of crime, the apprehension of criminals, and the
- 341 enforcement of the ordinances and policies of the * * \star
- 342 Mississippi Fair Commission, a political subdivision of the State
- 343 of Mississippi. Employees designated as such officers shall be

344	considered	law	enforcement	officers	within	the	meaning	of	Section
345	45-6-3.								

346	(3) The identities and personal information of the officers
347	under the authority of this section are confidential and shall no
348	be publicly disclosed by the department. The * * * Mississippi
349	Fair Commission shall redact the identities and personal
350	information of officers contracted to serve on the Mississippi
351	State Fairground Complex, from all contracts disclosed as public
352	records in compliance with the Mississippi Public Records Act,
353	prescribed under Section 25-61-1 et seq.; and such law enforcemen
354	contracts shall not be posted on the Department of Finance and
355	Administration's searchable website, as required by the
356	Mississippi Accountability and Transparency Act, prescribed under
357	Section 27-104-151 et seq.

SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2025.
