SENATE BILL NO. 2028

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES IN ANY COUNTY TO USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE COUNTY, LYING OUTSIDE THE LIMITS OF ANY 5 INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY UNTIL A CERTAIN DATE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 6 NUMBER OF RADAR GUNS ELIGIBLE FOR PURCHASE BY A COUNTY BASED ON 7 THE NUMBER OF FULL-TIME DEPUTIES IN THE COUNTY; TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF RADAR WITHIN 500 YARDS OF THE BOUNDARY LINE OF A 8 9 MUNICIPALITY, THE BOUNDARY LINE OF THE COUNTY AND A SPEED LIMIT 10 CHANGE; TO PROHIBIT SHERIFFS FROM USING RADAR SPEED DETECTION 11 EQUIPMENT ON ANY INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS OR FOUR-LANE STATE HIGHWAYS; 12 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 14 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 15 16 63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 17 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 18 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 19 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 20 21 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a 22 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 23 according to the latest or a previous federal census upon the S. 25	latest federal census population for the municipality is less than
26	one thousand five hundred (1,500);
27	(b) By any college or university campus police force
28	within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
29	(2,000) students are enrolled;
30	(c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
31	municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
32	(15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
33	designated highways lying within the corporate limits * * \star ;
34	(d) By municipal law enforcement officers upon the
35	public streets of any incorporated municipality (i) where the
36	county seat is located in the municipality and (ii) where there is
37	a public community college located in the municipality * * $*$; and
38	(e) By the sheriff and deputy sheriffs of any county
39	with a population exceeding fifty thousand (50,000) and wherein a
40	public university is located on any public county road or highway
41	within the county which is located outside the corporate limits of
42	any incorporated municipality. Under this paragraph (e):
43	(i) Each sheriff's department shall not purchase
44	more than two (2) radar guns;
45	(ii) Each sheriff's department shall not use radar
46	speed detection equipment within five hundred (500) yards of:
47	1. The boundary line of a municipality;
48	2. The boundary line of the county; and

49	3. A speed limit change; and
50	(iii) Each sheriff's department shall not use
51	radar speed detection equipment on any interstate or any four-lane
52	state highway.
53	(2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be
54	immediately notified by municipal or county law enforcement of any
55	road blockages or emergencies occurring on any federally
56	designated limited-access highways lying within the corporate or
57	<pre>county limits.</pre>
58	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
59	and after July 1, 2025
