SENATE BILL NO. 2177

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-31-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT PAYMENTS OUT OF STATE APPROPRIATIONS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR EXTENDED CONTRACTS FOR VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE EDUCATION SERVICES AND OTHER RELATED VOCATIONAL EDUCATION SERVICES 5 CONTRIBUTING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHALL BE AVAILABLE ONLY TO THOSE HIGH SCHOOLS WHOSE TEACHERS OF VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS ARE 7 RESPONSIBLE FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS OF INSTRUCTION DURING THOSE DAYS 8 OR WEEKS BETWEEN ACADEMIC YEARS OR, FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS HAVING 9 ADOPTED THE EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR, BETWEEN ACADEMIC 10 QUARTERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. Section 37-31-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 13 amended as follows: 37-31-13. (1) Any appropriation that may be made under the 14 15 provisions of Sections 37-31-1 through 37-31-15 shall be used by the board for the promotion of vocational education as provided 16 17 for in the "Smith-Hughes Act" and for the purpose set forth in Sections 37-31-1 through 37-31-15. The state appropriation shall 18 not be used for payments to high schools which are now receiving 19 other state funds, except in lieu of not more than one-half (1/2)20 the amount that may be due such high schools from federal funds. 21 22 Only such portion of the state appropriation shall be used as may

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- 23 be absolutely necessary to carry out the provisions of Sections
- 24 37-31-1 through 37-31-15, and to meet the federal requirements.
- 25 Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the state
- 26 appropriation shall not be used for payments to high schools for
- 27 conducting vocational programs for more than ten (10) months in
- 28 any school year, and only funds other than total funding formula
- 29 funds may be expended for such purpose.
- 30 Subject to annual approval by the State Board of
- 31 Education, extended contracts for vocational agriculture education
- services and other related vocational education services which 32
- 33 contribute to economic development may be conducted by local
- 34 school districts, and state appropriations may be used for
- 35 payments to school districts providing such services.
- 36 of trustees of each school district shall determine whether any
- proposed services contribute to the economic development of the 37
- 38 area. Local districts may apply to the Division of Vocational and
- 39 Technical Education of the State Department of Education for any
- state funds available for these extended contracts. The State 40
- 41 Board of Education shall establish the application process and the
- 42 selection criteria for this program. The number of state-funded
- 43 extended contracts approved by the State Board of Education will
- 44 be determined by the availability of funds specified for this
- The State Board of Education's decision shall be final. 45
- Payments under this subsection shall only be available to those 46
- high schools whose teachers of vocational programs are responsible 47

49	or weeks between academic years or, for school districts having
50	adopted the extended school year calendar, between academic
51	quarters: (a) supervision and instruction of students in
52	agricultural or other vocational experience programs; (b) group
53	and individual instruction of farmers and agribusinessmen; (c)
54	supervision of student members of youth groups who are involved in
55	leadership training or other activity required by state or federal
56	law; or (d) any program of vocational agriculture or other
57	vocational-related services established by the Division of
58	Vocational and Technical Education of the State Department of
59	Education that contribute to the economic development of the
