## SENATE BILL NO. 2204

AN ACT TO REQUIRE A SHERIFF, CHIEF OF POLICE, THE DIRECTOR OF 2 HIGHWAY PATROL OR CONSTABLE OR ANY OTHER PEACE OFFICER IN THIS 3 STATE TO REPORT TO THE MISSISSIPPI AGRICULTURAL AND LIVESTOCK THEFT BUREAU ALL REPORTS OF STOLEN FARM-RELATED VEHICLES; TO 5 REQUIRE ANY COMMERCIAL ENTITY IN THE BUSINESS OF BUYING, SELLING, 6 LEASING, RENTING, STORING OR TRANSPORTING FARM-RELATED VEHICLES, 7 HAVING POSSESSION OR CUSTODY OF FARM-RELATED VEHICLES TO REPORT TO 8 THE MISSISSIPPI AGRICULTURAL AND LIVESTOCK THEFT BUREAU ANY THEFT, 9 BURGLARY, ROBBERY OR ATTEMPTED THEFT, BURGLARY OR ROBBERY OF FARM-RELATED VEHICLES; TO AMEND SECTION 69-29-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE 10 11 OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) Any sheriff, chief of police, director of highway patrol or constable, or any other peace officer in this state, shall report to the Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft Bureau all reports of stolen farm-related vehicles.
- 17 (2) Any commercial entity in the business of buying,
  18 selling, leasing, renting, storing or transporting farm-related
  19 vehicles, having possession or custody of farm-related vehicles
  20 shall report to the Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft
- 21 Bureau any theft, burglary, robbery or attempted theft, burglary
- 22 or robbery of farm-related vehicles.

- 23 (3) For purposes of this section, "farm-related vehicle"
- 24 shall mean farm machinery, all-terrain vehicles or off-road
- 25 vehicles.
- 26 **SECTION 2.** Section 69-29-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 27 amended as follows:
- 28 69-29-1. (1) (a) There is established the Mississippi
- 29 Agricultural and Livestock Theft Bureau.
- 30 (b) The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce shall
- 31 appoint a director of the Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock
- 32 Theft Bureau. Such director shall have at least five (5) years of
- 33 law enforcement experience. Such director shall be responsible
- 34 solely to the supervision of the Commissioner of Agriculture and
- 35 Commerce and to no other person or entity. Such director may be
- 36 discharged only for just cause shown.
- 37 (c) The director may employ twelve (12) agricultural
- 38 and livestock theft investigators. Each investigator shall be
- 39 certified as a law enforcement officer, successfully completing at
- 40 least a nine-week training course, in accordance with Section
- 41 45-6-11. The curriculum for the training of constables shall not
- 42 be sufficient for meeting the certification requirements of this
- 43 paragraph. In the selection of investigators under this section,
- 44 preference shall be given to persons who have previous law
- 45 enforcement experience.
- 46 (d) The director appointed under this section, under
- 47 the direction, control and supervision of the commissioner, and

- 48 the investigators employed under this section shall perform only
- 49 the duties described in subsection (2) of this section and shall
- 50 not be assigned any other duties.
- 51 (2) The director appointed under this section and the
- 52 investigators employed under this section shall have the following
- 53 powers, duties and authority:
- 54 (a) To enforce all of the provisions of Sections
- 55 69-29-9 and 69-29-11, and particularly those portions requiring
- 56 persons transporting livestock to have a bill of sale in their
- 57 possession; to make investigations of violations of such sections
- 58 and to arrest persons violating same;
- 59 (b) To enforce all of the laws of this state enacted
- 60 for the purpose of preventing the theft of livestock, poultry,
- 61 timber and agricultural, aquacultural and timber products and
- 62 implements; to make investigations of violations thereof and to
- 63 arrest persons violating same;
- 64 (c) To cooperate with all regularly constituted law
- 65 enforcement officers relative to the matters herein set forth;
- (d) To serve warrants and other process emanating from
- 67 any court of lawful jurisdiction, including search warrants, in
- 68 all matters herein set forth;
- 69 (e) To carry proper credentials evidencing their
- 70 authority, which shall be exhibited to any person making demand
- 71 therefor;

- 73 herein set forth in cases where same is authorized under the
- 74 constitutional and general laws of this state;
- 75 (g) To handle the registration of brands of cattle and
- 76 livestock;
- 77 (h) To investigate, prevent, apprehend and arrest those
- 78 persons anywhere in the state who are violating any of the laws
- 79 administered by the Department of Agriculture and Commerce,
- 80 including, but not limited to, all agriculture-related crimes;
- 81 (i) To access and examine records of any person,
- 82 business or entity that harvests, loads, carries, receives or
- 83 manufactures timber products as defined in this section. Each
- 84 such person or entity shall permit the director or any
- 85 investigator of the Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft
- 86 Bureau to examine records of the sale, transfer or purchase of
- 87 timber or timber products, including, but not limited to,
- 88 contracts, load tickets, settlement sheets, drivers' logs,
- 89 invoices, checks and any other records or documents related to an
- 90 ongoing investigation of the Mississippi Agricultural and
- 91 Livestock Theft Bureau;
- 92 (j) To conduct training for law enforcement regarding
- 93 laws enforced by the bureau and to assist any other law
- 94 enforcement agencies in responding to matters that may be related
- 95 to agriculture and commerce in the State of Mississippi and in

96	cases	of	natural	disasters	or	other	disasters	to	respond	as	needed

- 97 or as requested by other agencies \* \* \*;
- 98 (k) To maintain a registry of reports of stolen
- 99 farm-related vehicles.
- 100 (3) The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce shall
- 101 furnish such investigators with such vehicles, equipment and
- 102 supplies as may be necessary. All expenses of same, and all other
- 103 expenses incurred in the administration of this section, shall be
- 104 paid from such appropriation as may be made by the Legislature.
- 105 (4) The Mississippi Department of Revenue and its agents and
- 106 employees shall cooperate with such investigators by furnishing to
- 107 them information as to any possible or suspected violations of any
- 108 of the laws mentioned herein, including specifically Section
- 109 69-29-27, and in any other lawful manner.
- 110 (5) The conservation officers of the Department of Wildlife,
- 111 Fisheries and Parks are authorized to cooperate with and assist
- 112 the agricultural and livestock theft investigators in the
- 113 enforcement and apprehension of violators of laws regarding
- 114 agricultural and livestock theft.
- 115 (6) The Mississippi Forestry Commission employees are
- 116 excluded from any timber and timber products theft investigative
- 117 responsibilities except when technical expertise is needed and
- 118 requested through the State Forester or his designee.
- 119 (7) For the purposes of this section, "timber product" means
- 120 timber of all kinds, species or sizes, including, but not limited

121	to, logs, lumber, poles, pilings, posts, blocks, bolts, cordwood
122	and pulpwood, pine stumpwood, pine knots or other distillate wood,
123	crossties, turpentine (crude gum), pine straw, firewood and all
124	other products derived from timber or trees that have a sale or
125	commercial value.

126 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 127 and after July 1, 2025.
