- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 71-5-146, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 8
- 9 71-5-146. (1) For the purpose of establishing and ensuring
- 10 that the Mississippi Department of Employment Security background
- 11 investigation requirements are consistent and in compliance with
- 12 the Internal Revenue Service background investigation requirements
- 13 for those individuals with access to, or potential access to
- 14 Federal Tax Information ("FTI"), including, but not limited to,
- 15 IRS Publication 1075, the Mississippi Department of Employment
- Security ("MDES") shall have the authority to fingerprint and 16
- 17 conduct a background investigation on * * *:



18	(a) * * * Any MDES employee, MDES contractor, or MDES
19	subcontractor who is to be subjected to a national criminal
20	history background check due to his or her access to FTI; and
21	(b) * * * Any individual who applies to a position with
22	MDES who is to be subjected to a national criminal history
23	background due to required FTI access upon hire.
24	(2) The department shall have the authority to enact
25	policies and procedures that allow designated department employees
26	to:
27	(a) Access and review state and federal criminal
28	history records;
29	(b) Fingerprint individuals identified in subsection
30	(1) of this section;
31	(c) Submit said fingerprints to the state
32	identification bureau for a check of state records;
33	(d) Forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of
34	Investigation (FBI) for a fingerprint-based national criminal
35	history record check * * *; and
36	(* * $\star\underline{e}$) Develop additional background policies and
37	procedures as required by state or federal law or regulations.
