SENATE BILL NO. 2295

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO CLARIFY THE PROVISION WHICH PROHIBITS THE ALTERATION OR REMOVAL
 OF HISTORICAL MONUMENTS AND MEMORIALS; TO AUTHORIZE A CIVIL CLAIM
 TO ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION; TO PROVIDE A VENUE FOR
 THE CIVIL CLAIM; TO PROVIDE ATTORNEY'S FEES TO A PREVAILING PARTY
 WHO ESTABLISHES A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION; AND FOR RELATED
 PURPOSES.
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 55-15-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 55-15-81. (1) None of the following items, structures or
- 11 areas may be relocated, removed, disturbed, altered, renamed or
- 12 rededicated: any Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican-American
- 13 War, War Between the States, Spanish-American War, World War I,
- 14 World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Civil Rights era, Persian
- 15 Gulf War, War in Iraq, War in Afghanistan, or Native American
- 16 War's statues, monuments, memorials or nameplates (plaques), which
- 17 have been erected on public property of the state or any of its
- 18 political subdivisions, such as local, municipal or county owned
- 19 public areas, and any statues, monuments, memorials, nameplates
- 20 (plaques), schools, streets, bridges, buildings, parks preserves,

- 21 reserves or other public items, structure or areas of the state or
- 22 any of its political subdivisions, such as, local, municipal or
- 23 county owned public areas, which has been dedicated in memory of,
- 24 or named for, any historical military figure, historical military
- 25 event, military organization or military unit.
- 26 (2) No person may prevent the public body responsible for
- 27 maintaining any of the items, structures or areas described * * *
- 28 in subsection (1) of this section from taking proper measures and
- 29 exercising proper means for the protection, preservation, care,
- 30 repair or restoration of those items, structures or areas. * * *
- 31 (3) (a) Any person feeling this statute has been violated
- 32 may bring an action, and have legal standing to do so, to enforce
- 33 this law in the chancery court of the judicial district where the
- 34 violation is alleged to have taken place.
- 35 (b) In any action or proceeding to enforce a provision
- 36 of this section, a prevailing party who establishes a violation of
- 37 this section shall recover reasonable attorney's fees.
- 38 (* * *4) This section shall not apply to items, structures
- 39 or areas located on property owned or acquired by the Mississippi
- 40 Transportation Commission which may interfere with the
- 41 construction, maintenance or operation of public transportation
- 42 facilities.
- 43 (5) The protections of this statute shall apply and be in
- 44 force in regard to all protected items, structures or areas in
- 45 place as of the date of passage of this law.

46 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

47 and after July 1, 2025.
