SENATE BILL NO. 2296

1 AN ACT TO ENACT THE SAFE PARKS AND PUBLIC SPACES ACT; TO 2 STATE LEGISLATIVE INTENT; TO PROVIDE DEFINITIONS; TO PROHIBIT 3 PUBLIC CAMPING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY NOT DESIGNATED AS A CAMPSITE; TO PROVIDE THAT A SECOND SUCH OFFENSE SHALL BE A MISDEMEANOR 5 PUNISHABLE BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$100.00; TO SET FORTH REQUIREMENTS PERTAINING TO POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS; TO PROVIDE THAT 7 STATE FUNDING TO A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY FOR HOMELESSNESS 8 ASSISTANCE, PREVENTION OR SERVICES SHALL BE CONDITIONAL UPON SUCH 9 COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY ENFORCING THIS ACT; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY IF ANY PORTION OF THIS ACT HELD TO BE INVALID; AND 10 11 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 13 SECTION 1. Title and purpose. (1) This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Safe Parks and Public Spaces Act." 14 15 (2) The purpose of this Act is to protect the public from the dangers of unauthorized street camping in public parks, 16 17 rights-of-way and other public spaces. The Legislature 18 recognizes the risk presented by unauthorized street camping, 19 including conduct that results in the proliferation of drugs and 20 drug paraphernalia, threats of random acts of violence and the 21 spread of disease and detritus. It is the intention of the 22 Legislature to protect the people of Mississippi in public spaces

- 23 and rights-of-way by enacting a prohibition on unauthorized street
- 24 camping.
- 25 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Definitions. For purposes of this act, the
- 26 following words shall have the meaning ascribed herein unless
- 27 otherwise noted:
- 28 (a) "Campsite" means a regular location of public
- 29 grounds designated as a recreational camping ground, area or
- 30 facility, that allows temporary overnight occupancy without a
- 31 permanently fixed structure.
- 32 (b) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 33 Human Services.
- 34 (c) "State funds" means any funds raised by the state
- 35 and federal funds received by the state for housing or
- 36 homelessness.
- 37 (d) "Public camping" means to sleep upon, occupy or
- 38 otherwise use as a substitute for regular shelter, any public
- 39 property or right-of-way in this state, as evidenced by, but not
- 40 limited to, the erection of a tent or other temporary shelter, the
- 41 presence of bedding or pillows, or the storage of personal
- 42 property.
- 43 **SECTION 3. Prohibitions.** (1) It shall be unlawful for any
- 44 person to intentionally or knowingly engage in public camping
- 45 upon any public property in this state not designated as a
- 46 campsite by the state or controlling political subdivision,
- 47 excluding public property specially designated as a

- 48 temporary site for unsheltered homeless encampments.
- 49 (2) An offense committed by a person under this section is a
- 50 misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars
- 51 (\$100.00), except for the person's first offense, whereby the law
- 52 enforcement officer shall direct the person to the nearest
- 53 emergency shelter for homeless individuals.
- SECTION 4. Pertaining to political subdivisions. (1) A
- 55 county or municipality may not authorize or otherwise allow any
- 56 person to regularly engage in public camping or sleeping on any
- 57 public property not designated as a campsite by the state or
- 58 controlling political subdivision, including, but not limited to,
- 59 any public building or its grounds and any public right-of-way
- 60 under the jurisdiction of the county or municipality, as
- 61 applicable, excluding public property specially designated as a
- 62 temporary site for unsheltered homeless encampments.
- 63 (2) A county or municipality may not prohibit or discourage
- 64 a law enforcement officer or prosecuting attorney who is employed
- or otherwise under the direction or control of the county or
- 66 municipality from enforcing any order or ordinance prohibiting
- 67 public camping, sleeping or obstruction of sidewalks or other
- 68 rights-of-way.
- 69 (3) A resident of the county, an owner of a business located
- 70 in the county or the Attorney General may bring a civil action in
- 71 any court of competent jurisdiction against any county or
- 72 applicable municipality to enjoin a violation of subsections (1)

73	or	(2)	of	this	section.	Ιf	the	resident	or	business	owner

- 74 prevails in a civil action, the court may award reasonable
- 75 expenses incurred in bringing the civil action, including court
- 76 costs, reasonable attorney fees, investigative costs, witness fees
- 77 and deposition costs.
- 78 (a) An application for injunction filed pursuant to
- 79 this subsection must be accompanied by an affidavit attesting
- 80 that:
- 81 (i) The applicant has provided written notice of
- 82 the alleged violation of subsection (1) of this section to the
- 83 governing board of the county or applicable municipality;
- 84 (ii) The applicant has provided the county or
- 85 applicable municipality with five (5) business days to cure the
- 86 alleged violation; and
- 87 (iii) The county or applicable municipality has
- 88 failed to take all reasonable actions within the limits of its
- 89 governmental authority to cure the alleged violation within five
- 90 (5) business days after receiving written notice of the alleged
- 91 violation.
- 92 SECTION 5. Funding conditional upon enforcement of law. (1)
- 93 No county or municipality shall receive state funding for
- 94 homelessness assistance, prevention or services until the
- 95 department determines the county or municipality is in compliance
- 96 with Section 4 of this act.

97	(2) For each day any county or municipality is found to be
98	out of compliance with Section 4 of this act, starting on the date
99	of a filing of an application for injunction as specified in
100	Section 4(3), the county or municipality shall forfeit a pro-rata
101	amount of state funding for homelessness assistance, prevention or
102	services equal to the amount of state funding for homelessness
103	assistance awarded or provided to the county or municipality
104	divided by the days in the award or funding period.

- SECTION 6. Severability. If any provision of this chapter, or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid, the remainder of this chapter and the application of its provisions to any other person or circumstance shall not be affected thereby.
- SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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
