## SENATE BILL NO. 2435

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO
PRINT A SPECIAL DECAL BEARING THE INTERNATIONAL SYMBOL OF ACCESS
FOR THE DISABLED ON EACH LICENSE TAG ISSUED FOR DISABLED VETERANS;
AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 27-19-53. (1) (a) (i) Any legal resident of the State of
- 9 Mississippi who is rated as having one hundred percent (100%)
- 10 permanent service-connected disability or at least seventy percent
- 11 (70%) nonpermanent service-connected disability by the Veterans'
- 12 Administration or United States Department of Veterans Affairs is
- 13 privileged to purchase annually under this subsection two (2)
- 14 motor vehicle license plates or tags in his or her county of legal
- 15 residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) in total cost for
- 16 each plate or tag, regardless of make or model of motor vehicle.
- 17 The registration year of such motor vehicle shall commence the
- 18 first day of the month in which application for registration is
- 19 made, as provided in Section 27-19-31. In order for a person who

- 20 is rated as having at least seventy percent (70%) nonpermanent
- 21 service-connected disability to renew a license plate or tag
- 22 issued under this section, the person must provide an updated
- 23 benefits letter from the United States Department of Veterans
- 24 Affairs indicating that the person's rating has not been adjusted
- 25 to less than seventy percent (70%) nonpermanent service-connected
- 26 disability.
- 27 (ii) Any legal resident of the State of
- 28 Mississippi who is rated as having one hundred percent (100%)
- 29 permanent service-connected disability or at least seventy percent
- 30 (70%) nonpermanent service-connected disability by the Veterans'
- Administration or United States Department of Veterans Affairs is 31
- 32 privileged to purchase annually under this subsection one (1)
- 33 motorcycle license plate or tag in his or her county of legal
- residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) in total cost for 34
- 35 each plate or tag. The registration year of such motorcycle shall
- 36 commence the first day of the month in which application for
- registration is made, as provided in Section 27-19-31. In order 37
- 38 for a person who is rated as having at least seventy percent (70%)
- 39 nonpermanent service-connected disability to renew a license plate
- 40 or tag issued under this section, the person must provide an
- updated benefits letter from the United States Department of 41
- Veterans Affairs indicating that the person's rating has not been 42
- 43 adjusted to less than seventy percent (70%) nonpermanent
- 44 service-connected disability. The Department of Revenue shall

- 48 corner of the plate or tag issued for each vehicle that is
- 49 registered in the applicant's name.
- 50 (b) Not more than two (2) such motor vehicle license
- 51 plates or tags shall be issued under this subsection to each such
- 52 qualified person. Not more than one (1) such motorcycle license
- 53 plate or tag shall be issued under this subsection to each such
- 54 qualified person.
- 55 (c) This section pertains only to taxes or plates for
- 56 private passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks or motorcycles.
- 57 (d) Proof of ownership of a particular motor vehicle or
- 58 motorcycle for which a license plate or tag is requested must be
- 59 shown at time of application for such plate or tag.
- (e) Vehicles and motorcycles owned by such person are
- 61 exempt under this subsection from all ad valorem and privilege
- 62 taxes; however, the surviving spouse of a deceased person who was
- 63 issued a license plate or tag under this subsection shall be
- 64 entitled to apply for or retain a license tag issued under this
- 65 subsection and may continue annually to renew registration for two
- 66 (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags and one (1) motorcycle
- 67 license plate or tag under this subsection for as long as the
- 68 spouse remains unmarried. In addition, if a deceased person who
- 69 was eligible to be issued a license plate or tag under this

- 70 subsection did not apply for or was not issued a license plate or
- 71 tag, the surviving spouse of such deceased person shall be
- 72 entitled to apply for and be issued a license plate or tag under
- 73 this subsection and may continue annually to renew registration
- 74 for two (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags and one (1)
- 75 motorcycle license tag or plate under this subsection for as long
- 76 as the spouse remains unmarried. At the time of application or
- 77 renewal registration, a surviving spouse who desires to retain a
- 78 distinctive plate or tag issued under this subsection shall file
- 79 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is
- 80 unmarried. Any such vehicle or motorcycle when so registered
- 81 shall be exempt from all ad valorem and privilege taxes.
- 82 (2) Any person who is entitled to obtain license tags under
- 83 subsection (1) of this section may be issued one (1) additional
- 84 such license tag for any other vehicle registered in his or her
- 85 name upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad
- 86 valorem taxes and registration fees as otherwise prescribed by law
- 87 for the particular vehicle.
- 88 (3) The Department of Revenue is directed to furnish each
- 89 person obtaining a license tag under this section an emblem, which
- 90 the person shall attach securely to the tag, showing that the tag
- 91 was issued to a disabled American veteran.
- 92 (4) A license issued under this section shall not be
- 93 transferable to any other person.

94	(5) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of
95	this section, or attempting to secure benefits under this section
96	to which he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and,
97	upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One Thousand Dollars
98	(\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not less than
99	ninety (90) days, or both.

- 100 (6) From and after July 1, 2022, the special tag authorized 101 under this section shall bear the name and emblem of each branch 102 of the United States Armed Forces.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2025.
