6	SECTION 1. Section 43-21-351, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 43-21-351. (1) Any person or agency having knowledge that a 8

- 11 intake unit alleging facts sufficient to establish the
- 12 jurisdiction of the youth court. The report shall bear a
- permanent number that will be assigned by the court in accordance 13

- 15 Courts pursuant to Section 9-21-9(d), and shall be preserved until

- 22 truancy matters, and the Department of Child Protection Services.
