## SENATE BILL NO. 2525

1 AN ACT	TO AMENI	SECTION	75-60-5,	MISSISSIPPI	CODE	OF	1972,	TO
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- 2 INCLUDE THE NEW JOINT BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY AND BARBERING; TO
- 3 CLARIFY THAT NONVOCATIONAL SCHOOLS ARE EXEMPT FROM REGISTERING
- 4 WITH THE COMMISSION ON PROPRIETARY SCHOOL AND COLLEGE
- 5 REGISTRATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 75-60-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 75-60-5. The provisions of this chapter do not apply to the
- 10 following categories of courses, schools or colleges:
- 11 (a) Tuition-free courses or schools conducted by
- 12 employers exclusively for their own employees;
- 13 (b) Schools, colleges, technical institutes, community
- 14 colleges, junior colleges or universities under the jurisdiction
- of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning
- 16 or the Mississippi Community College Board;
- 17 (c) Schools or courses of instruction under the
- 18 jurisdiction of the \* \* \* Board of Cosmetology and Barbering, the
- 19 State Board of Massage Therapy or the State Board of Nursing;

20    (d)	Courses	of	instruction	required	by	law	to	be
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- 21 approved or licensed, or given by institutions approved or
- 22 licensed, by a state board or agency other than the Commission on
- 23 Proprietary School and College Registration; however, a school so
- 24 approved or licensed may apply to the Commission on Proprietary
- 25 School and College Registration for a certificate of registration
- 26 to be issued in accordance with the provisions of this chapter;
- 27 (e) Correspondence education;
- 28 (f) Nonprofit private schools offering academic credits
- 29 at primary or secondary levels, or conducting classes for
- 30 exceptional education as defined by regulations of the State
- 31 Department of Education;
- 32 (g) Private nonprofit colleges and universities or any
- 33 private school offering academic credits at primary, secondary or
- 34 postsecondary levels;
- 35 (h) Courses of instruction conducted by a public school
- 36 district or a combination of public school districts;
- 37 (i) Courses of instruction conducted outside the United
- 38 States;
- 39 (j) A school that offers only instruction in subjects
- 40 that the Commission on Proprietary School and College Registration
- 41 determines are primarily for \* \* \* nonvocational, personal
- 42 improvement or cultural \* \* \* purpose and that does not represent
- 43 to the public that its course of study or instruction will or may
- 44 produce income for those who take that study or instruction;

45	(k) Courses conducted primarily on an individual
46	tutorial basis, where not more than one (1) student is involved at
47	any one time, except in those instances where the Commission on
48	Proprietary School and College Registration determines that the
49	course is for the purpose of preparing for a vocational objective;
50	(1) Kindergartens or similar programs for preschool-age
51	children.
52	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
53	and after its passage.
