## SENATE BILL NO. 2526

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO ALLOW NONRESIDENT STUDENTS TO FULLY PARTICIPATE IN THE YELLOW 3 RIBBON PROGRAM AND RECEIVE FUNDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- **SECTION 1.** Section 37-103-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5
- amended as follows: 6
- 37-103-25. (1) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions 7
- of Higher Learning and the \* \* \* Mississippi Community College 8
- 9 Board are authorized to prescribe the amount of tuition and fees
- to be paid by students attending the several state-supported 10
- 11 institutions of higher learning and community colleges and junior
- colleges of the State of Mississippi. 12
- 13 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and
- 14 subsections (3) and (4) of this section, the total tuition to be
- 15 paid by residents of other states shall not be less than the
- 16 average cost per student from appropriated funds. However, the
- tuition to be paid by a resident of another state shall be equal 17

- 20 (a) \* \* \* The nonresident is a "covered individual"
- 21 under Section 702 of the Veterans Access, Choice and
- 22 Accountability Act of 2014. A nonresident veteran, as defined by
- 23 Title 38 of the United States Code or a person entitled to
- 24 education benefits under Title 38 of the United States Code who is
- 25 not a covered individual under Section 702 of the Veterans Access,
- 26 Choice and Accountability Act of 2014, but qualifies for Yellow
- 27 Ribbon Program funds shall be charged nonresident tuition provided
- 28 the state institution of higher learning and community or junior
- 29 college participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program and provides a
- 30 scholarship (including Yellow Ribbon Program funds) that results
- 31 in the nonresident veteran or person entitled to education
- 32 benefits under Title 38 paying tuition equal to the amount
- 33 established under subsection (1). All other nonresident veterans,
- 34 as defined by Title 38 of the United States Code and other persons
- 35 entitled to education benefits under Title 38, except those
- 36 enrolled in a professional school or college, shall be charged
- 37 tuition equal to the amount established under subsection (1) of
- 38 this section. This paragraph (a) shall be administered and
- 39 interpreted in the manner necessary to obtain or retain approval
- 40 of courses of education by the Secretary of the United States
- 41 Department of Veterans Affairs and in a manner necessary to allow
- 42 a nonresident veteran or a person entitled to education benefits

- 45 participate and receive Yellow Ribbon Program funds;
- 46 (b) The nonresident student is an evacuee of an area
- 47 affected by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita. This waiver
- 48 shall be applicable to the 2005-2006 school year only \* \*  $\star$ ; and
- 49 (c) The nonresident student's out-of-state tuition was
- 50 waived according to subsection (3) or (4) of this section.
- 51 (3) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
- 52 Learning may, in its discretion, consider and grant requests to
- 53 approve institution specific policies permitting the waiver of
- 54 out-of-state tuition when such an official request is made by the
- 55 president or chancellor of the institution and when such request
- 56 is determined by the board to be fiscally responsible and in
- 57 accordance with the educational mission of the requesting
- 58 institution.
- 59 (4) The board of trustees of any community college or junior
- 60 college may develop and implement a policy for waiving
- 61 out-of-state tuition for the college if the policy is determined
- 62 by the board to be in accordance with the educational mission of
- 63 the college and if a local industry or business or a state agency
- 64 agrees to reimburse the college for the entire amount of the
- 65 out-of-state tuition that will be waived under the policy. State
- 66 funds shall be allocated and spent only on students who reside
- 67 within the State of Mississippi. However, associate degree

- 68 nursing students who reside outside the State of Mississippi may
- 69 be counted for pay purposes.
- 70 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 71 and after July 1, 2025.
