SENATE BILL NO. 2526 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW NONRESIDENT STUDENTS TO FULLY PARTICIPATE IN THE YELLOW RIBBON PROGRAM AND RECEIVE FUNDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-103-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 37-103-25. (1) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions
- 8 of Higher Learning and the boards of trustees of the community
- 9 colleges and junior colleges are authorized to prescribe the
- 10 amount of tuition and fees to be paid by students attending the
- 11 several state-supported institutions of higher learning and
- 12 community colleges and junior colleges of the State of
- 13 Mississippi.
- 14 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and
- 15 subsections (3) and (4) of this section, the total tuition to be
- 16 paid by residents of other states shall not be less than the
- 17 average cost per student from appropriated funds. However, the
- 18 tuition to be paid by a resident of another state shall be equal

- 19 to the tuition amount established under subsection (1) of this
- 20 section if:
- 21 (a) * * * The nonresident is a "covered individual"
- 22 under Section 702 of the Veterans Access, Choice and
- 23 Accountability Act of 2014. A nonresident veteran, as defined by
- 24 Title 38 of the United States Code or a person entitled to
- 25 education benefits under Title 38 of the United States Code who is
- 26 not a covered individual under Section 702 of the Veterans Access,
- 27 Choice and Accountability Act of 2014, but qualifies for Yellow
- 28 Ribbon Program funds shall be charged nonresident tuition provided
- 29 the state institution of higher learning and community or junior
- 30 college participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program and provides a
- 31 scholarship (including Yellow Ribbon Program funds) that results
- 32 in the nonresident veteran or person entitled to education
- 33 benefits under Title 38 paying tuition equal to the amount
- 34 established under subsection (1) of this section. All other
- 35 nonresident veterans, as defined by Title 38 of the United States
- 36 Code and other persons entitled to education benefits under Title
- 37 38, except those enrolled in a professional school or college,
- 38 shall be charged tuition equal to the amount established under
- 39 subsection (1) of this section. This paragraph (a) shall be
- 40 administered and interpreted in the manner necessary to obtain or
- 41 retain approval of courses of education by the Secretary of the
- 42 United States Department of Veterans Affairs and in a manner
- 43 necessary to allow a nonresident veteran or a person entitled to

- 46 colleges to fully participate and receive Yellow Ribbon Program

- 48 (b) The nonresident student is an evacuee of an area
- 49 affected by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita. This waiver
- shall be applicable to the 2005-2006 school year only * * *; and
- 51 (c) The nonresident student's out-of-state tuition was
- 52 waived according to subsection (3) or (4) of this section.
- 53 (3) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
- 54 Learning may, in its discretion, consider and grant requests to
- 55 approve institution specific policies permitting the waiver of
- 56 out-of-state tuition when such an official request is made by the
- 57 president or chancellor of the institution and when such request
- 58 is determined by the board to be fiscally responsible and in
- 59 accordance with the educational mission of the requesting
- 60 institution.
- 61 (4) The board of trustees of any community college or junior
- 62 college may develop and implement a policy for waiving
- 63 out-of-state tuition for the college if the policy is determined
- 64 by the board to be in accordance with the educational mission of
- 65 the college and if a local industry or business or a state agency
- 66 agrees to reimburse the college for the entire amount of the
- 67 out-of-state tuition that will be waived under the policy. State
- 68 funds shall be allocated and spent only on students who reside

- 69 within the State of Mississippi. However, associate degree
- 70 nursing students who reside outside the State of Mississippi may
- 71 be counted for pay purposes.
- 72 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 73 and after July 1, 2025.
