377	company, a financing agreement with respect to its economic
378	development project. The terms and provisions of each financing
379	agreement shall be determined by negotiations between the
380	corporation and the approved company, except that each financing
381	agreement shall include the following provisions:
382	(a) If the corporation issues any bonds in connection
383	with an economic development project, the term of the financing
384	agreement shall not be less than the last maturity of the bonds
385	issued with respect to the economic development project, except
386	that the financing agreement may terminate upon the earlier
387	redemption of all of the bonds issued with respect to the economic

development project and may grant to the approved company an

option to purchase the economic development project from the

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390 corporation upon the termination of the financing agreement for 391 such consideration and under such terms and conditions the 392 corporation may approve. Nothing in this paragraph shall limit 393 the extension of the term of a financing agreement if there is a 394 refunding of the correlative bonds or otherwise.

- with an economic development project, the financing agreement shall specify that the annual obligations of the approved company under Sections 57-10-401 through 57-10-445 shall equal in each year at least the annual debt service for that year on the bonds issued with respect to the economic development project; and the approved company shall pay such obligation of the financing agreement to the trustee for bonds issued for the benefit of the approved company, at such time and in such amounts sufficient to amortize such bonds.
- (c) If the corporation loans funds to an approved company that is a private company under the Mississippi Small Enterprise Development Finance Act, the financing agreement shall include the terms and conditions of the loan required by Section 57-71-1 et seg.
- (d) (i) In consideration for financing agreement
 payment, the approved company may be permitted the following
 during the period of time in which the financing agreement is in
 effect, not to exceed twenty-five (25) years:

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414	1. A tax credit on the amount provided for in
415	Section 27-7-22.3(2), Mississippi Code of 1972; plus
416	2. The aggregate assessment withheld by the
417	approved company in each year.
418	(ii) The income tax credited to the approved
419	company referred to herein shall be credited in the fiscal year of
420	the financing agreement in which the tax return of the approved
421	company is filed. The approved company shall not be required to
422	pay estimated tax payments under Section 27-7-319, Mississippi
423	Code of 1972.
424	(e) (i) The financing agreement shall provide that the
425	assessments, when added to the credit for the state corporate
426	income tax herein granted, shall not exceed the total financing
427	agreement annual payment by the approved company in any year;
428	however, to the extent that financing agreement annual payments
429	exceed credits received and assessments collected in any year, the
430	excess payment may be recouped from excess credits or assessment
431	collections in succeeding years.
432	(ii) If during any fiscal year of the financing
433	agreement the total of the income tax credit granted to the
434	approved company plus the assessment collected from the wages of
435	the employees equals the annual payment pursuant to the financing

agreement, and if all excess payments pursuant to the financing

agreement accumulated in prior years have been recouped, the

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438	assessment collected from the wages of the employees shall cease
439	for the remainder of the fiscal year of the financing agreement.
440	(f) The financing agreement shall provide that:
441	(i) It may be assigned by the approved company
442	only upon the prior written consent of the corporation following
443	the adoption of a resolution by the corporation to such effect;
444	and
445	(ii) Upon the default by the approved company in
446	the obligation to render its annual payment, the corporation shall
447	have the right, at its option, to declare the financing agreement
448	in default and to accelerate the total of all annual payments that
449	are to be made or to terminate the financing agreement and cause
450	to be sold the economic development project at public or private
451	sale, or to pursue any other remedies available under the Uniform
452	Commercial Code, as from time to time amended, or otherwise
453	available in law or equity.
454	[In cases involving an economic development project for which
455	the Mississippi Business Finance Corporation has not issued bonds
456	for the purpose of financing the approved costs of such project
457	prior to July 1, 1994, but has issued bonds for such project prior
458	to July 1, 1997, or in cases involving an economic development
459	project which has been induced by a resolution of the Board of
460	Directors of the Mississippi Business Finance Corporation that has

been filed with the State Tax Commission prior to July 1, 1997,

this section shall read as follows:]

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463	57-10-409. The corporation may enter into, with any approved
464	company, a financing agreement with respect to its economic
465	development project. The terms and provisions of each financing

- (b) If the corporation issues any bonds in connection with an economic development project, the financing agreement shall specify that the annual obligations of the approved company under Sections 57-10-401 through 57-10-445 shall equal in each year at least the annual debt service for that year on the bonds issued with respect to the economic development project; and the

489	agreement to the trustee for bonds issued for the benefit of the
490	approved company, at such time and in such amounts sufficient to
491	amortize such bonds.

- (c) If the corporation loans funds to an approved company that is a private company under the Mississippi Small Enterprise Development Finance Act, the financing agreement shall include the terms and conditions of the loan required by Section 57-71-1 et seg.
- (d) (i) In consideration for financing agreement

 payment, the approved company may be permitted the following

 during the period of time in which the financing agreement is in

 effect, not to exceed twenty-five (25) years:
- 1. A tax credit on the amount provided for in Section 27-7-22.3(2), Mississippi Code of 1972; plus
