SENATE BILL NO. 2629

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A QUALIFIED ELECTOR TO VOTE EARLY NOT MORE THAN 21 DAYS NOR LESS THAN FIVE DAYS BEFORE THE DATE OF AN ELECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT EARLY VOTING MAY BE CONDUCTED IN THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE OR AT A LOCATION DESIGNATED BY THE REGISTRAR; 5 TO REQUIRE A PERSON WHO DESIRES TO VOTE EARLY TO APPEAR AT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE AND TO PROVIDE THAT AFTER SIGNING THE RECEIPT 7 BOOK SUCH PERSON SHALL BE ENTITLED TO VOTE AT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE OR AT THE LOCATION DESIGNATED BY THE REGISTRAR DURING THE 8 9 EARLY VOTING PERIOD IN THE SAME MANNER AS HE OR SHE WOULD AT HIS 10 OR HER VOTING PRECINCT ON THE DAY OF THE ELECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT 11 THE ELECTION LAWS THAT GOVERN PROCEDURES FOR A PERSON WHO APPEARS 12 TO VOTE ON THE DAY OF ELECTION SHALL APPLY WHEN A PERSON APPEARS TO VOTE DURING THE EARLY VOTING PERIOD; TO PROVIDE THAT ALL VOTES CAST DURING THE EARLY VOTING PERIOD SHALL BE FINAL; TO PROVIDE 14 1.5 THAT THE VOTES CAST DURING EARLY VOTING SHALL BE ANNOUNCED 16 SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH THE VOTES CAST ON ELECTION DAY; TO PROVIDE 17 THAT EACH CANDIDATE SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO BE PRESENT AT THE 18 REGISTRAR'S OFFICE AND TO CHALLENGE THE QUALIFICATIONS OF ANY 19 PERSON OFFERING TO VOTE EARLY IN THE SAME MANNER AS PROVIDED BY 20 LAW AT THE POLLING PLACE ON THE DAY OF THE ELECTION; TO REOUIRE THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS 21 22 NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE EARLY VOTING; TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-195, 23-15-353 AND 23-15-653, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; TO 23 24 AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627, 23-15-637, 23-15-713 AND 23-15-715, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT VOTERS MAY NOT CAST 25 ABSENTEE BALLOTS AT THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR DURING THE EARLY 26 27 VOTING PERIOD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

29 SECTION 1. Sections 1 through 5 of this act shall be known 30 and may be cited as the "Early Voting Act."

- 31 **SECTION 2.** (1) A qualified elector may vote early not more
- 32 than twenty-one (21) days nor less than five (5) days before the
- 33 date of an election in the office of the registrar or at a
- 34 location designated by the registrar of the county in which such
- 35 elector is registered to vote during the times established for
- 36 early voting in this section.
- 37 (2) If only one (1) person has qualified for each office on
- 38 the ballot, early voting shall not be conducted.
- 39 (3) Early voting shall be conducted at the office of the
- 40 registrar during the following times:
- 41 (a) Weekdays from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., except
- 42 that the office of the registrar shall remain open until 7:00 p.m.
- 43 the last two (2) days of the early voting period; and
- 44 (b) One (1) Saturday during the early voting period
- 45 from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.
- 46 (4) Notice of the early voting hours shall be given by the
- 47 commissioners of election not less than twenty-five (25) days
- 48 before the day of election by publication in a newspaper of
- 49 general circulation in the county. If a state holiday occurs on
- 50 any day in which early voting is allowed, the commissioners of
- 51 election may authorize the closing of the office of the registrar
- 52 or the designated location on such holiday by including a notice
- of such closure in the notice published pursuant to this
- 54 subsection.



- 55 **SECTION 3.** (1) A person who desires to vote early shall 56 appear at the office of the registrar or the location authorized 57 by the registrar for early voting. After signing the appropriate 58 receipt book, the elector shall vote at the location in the same 59 manner as he or she would at his or her voting precinct on the day 60 of the election. Except as may be otherwise provided by Sections 1 through 5 of this act, the election laws that govern procedures 61 62 for a person who appears to vote on the day of election shall 63 apply when a person appears to vote during the early voting 64 period.
- 65 All votes cast at an early voting location shall be 66 final.
- 67 The votes cast during early voting shall be announced simultaneously with the vote cast on election day. 68
- 69 SECTION 4. Each candidate or his or her representatives 70 shall have the right to be present at the office of the registrar or designated location when it is open for early voting and to challenge the qualifications of any person offering to vote in the 73 same manner as provided by law at the polling place on election 74 day.
- 75 SECTION 5. The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules and 76 regulations necessary to effectuate early voting.
- 77 Section 23-15-195, Mississippi Code of 1972, is SECTION 6. 78 amended as follows:

- 79 23-15-195. All elections by the people shall be by
- 80 ballot * * *.
- SECTION 7. Section 23-15-353, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 82 amended as follows:
- 83 23-15-353. (1) The officer charged with printing and
- 84 distributing the official ballot shall ascertain from the
- 85 registrar, at least ten (10) days before the day of election, the
- 86 number of registered voters in each voting precinct; and he or she
- 87 shall have printed and distributed a sufficient number of ballots
- 88 for use in each precinct.
- 89 (2) The officer charged with printing and distributing the
- 90 official ballot shall ascertain from the registrar, at least ten
- 91 (10) days before the beginning of early voting, the number of
- 92 ballots that the registrar desires for early voting.
- 93 **SECTION 8.** Section 23-15-653, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 94 amended as follows:
- 95 23-15-653. Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this
- 96 act, all registrars' offices shall remain open until noon on the
- 97 two (2) Saturdays prior to each election.
- 98 **SECTION 9.** Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 99 amended as follows:
- 100 23-15-627. (1) Any elector described in Section 23-15-713
- 101 may request an absentee ballot application and vote in person at
- 102 the office of the registrar in the county in which he or she
- 103 resides. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing an

105 receive an absentee ballot. Such form shall be printed on the 106 absentee ballot envelope as provided in Section 23-15-659. Except 107 as otherwise provided in Section 23-15-625, absentee ballot 108 applications shall be furnished to a person only upon the oral or 109 written request of the elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent, child, spouse, sibling, legal 110 111 guardian, those empowered with a power of attorney for that 112 elector's affairs or agent of the elector, who is designated in writing and witnessed by a resident of this state who shall write 113 114 his or her physical address on such designation, may orally 115 request an absentee ballot application on behalf of the elector. 116 The written designation shall be valid for one (1) year after the 117 date of the designation. An absentee ballot application must have the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be 118 119 initialed by the registrar or his or her deputy in order to be 120 used to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction 121 122 provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in 123 which the election is being held and which contains the seal and 124 initials required by this section.

295	ballots as otherwise provided by Section 23-15-699 for UOCAVA
296	ballots, or common carrier, such as United Parcel Service or FedEx
297	Corporation, must be postmarked on or before the date of the

- election and received by the registrar no more than five (5)
 business days after the election; any received after such time
 shall be handled as provided in Section 23-15-647 and shall not be
 counted.
- 302 All ballots cast by the absent elector appearing in (b) 303 person in the office of the registrar shall be cast with an 304 absentee paper ballot and deposited into a sealed ballot box by 305 the voter, not later than 12:00 noon on the * * * day immediately 306 preceding * * * the first day of the early voting period. 307 close of business each day at the office of the registrar, the 308 ballot box used shall be sealed and not unsealed until the 309 beginning of the next business day, and the seal number shall be 310 recorded with the number of ballots cast which shall be stored in a secure location in the registrar's office. 311
- 312 (2) The registrar shall deposit all absentee ballots which
 313 have been timely cast and received by mail in a secured and sealed
 314 box in a designated location in the registrar's office upon
 315 receipt. The registrar shall not send any absentee ballots to the
 316 precinct polling locations.
- 317 (3) The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules and
 318 regulations necessary to ensure that when a qualified elector who
 319 is qualified to vote absentee votes by absentee ballot, either by
 320 mail or in person with a regular paper ballot, that person's
 321 absentee vote is final and he or she may not vote at the polling
 322 place on election day. Notwithstanding any other provisions of

- 323 law to the contrary, the Secretary of State shall promulgate rules
- 324 and regulations necessary to ensure that absentee ballots shall
- 325 remain in the registrar's office for counting and not be taken to
- 326 the precincts on election day.
- 327 **SECTION 11.** Section 23-15-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 328 amended as follows:
- 329 23-15-713. For the purpose of this \star \star chapter, any duly
- 330 qualified elector may vote as provided in this * * * chapter if
- 331 the elector falls within at least one (1) of the following
- 332 categories:
- 333 (a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,
- 334 teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior
- 335 college, high, junior high, or elementary grade school whose
- 336 studies or employment at such institution necessitates his or her
- 337 absence from the county of his or her voting residence on
- 338 the * * * election day and all days upon which early voting may be
- 339 conducted, or the spouse and dependents of that student, teacher
- 340 or administrator if such spouse or dependent(s) maintain a common
- 341 domicile, outside of the county of his or her voting residence,
- 342 with \star \star the student, teacher or administrator.
- 343 (b) Any qualified elector who is required to be away
- 344 from his or her place of residence on any election day and all
- 345 days upon which early voting may be conducted due to his or her
- 346 employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi
- 347 congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of * * *

- 350 (c) Any qualified elector who is away from his or her county of residence for any reason on election day * * * and all days upon which early voting may be conducted.
- 353 (d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent
 354 physical disability and who, because of such disability, is unable
 355 to vote in person without substantial hardship to himself, herself
 356 or others, or whose attendance at the voting place could
 357 reasonably cause danger to himself, herself or others.
- 358 (e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a
 359 temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized
 360 outside of his or her county of residence or more than fifty (50)
 361 miles distant from his or her residence, if the parent, spouse or
 362 dependent will be with such person on election day and all days
 363 upon which early voting may be conducted.
- 364 (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or 365 older.
- 366 (g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional
 367 delegation absent from Mississippi on election day and all days
 368 upon which early voting may be conducted, and the spouse and
 369 dependents of * * * the member of the congressional delegation.
- 370 (h) Any qualified elector who will be unable to vote in 371 person because he or she is required to be at work on election day 372 and all days upon which early voting may be conducted during the

- 373 times when the polls will be open or any qualified elector who
- 374 will be required to be on-call on election day during the times
- 375 when the polls will be open.
- 376 Any qualified elector who is incarcerated in prison
- 377 or jail in the county where he or she is registered to vote and
- 378 has not been convicted of a disenfranchising crime.
- 379 SECTION 12. Section 23-15-715, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 380 amended as follows:
- 381 23-15-715. Any elector desiring an absentee ballot as
- 382 provided in this * * * chapter may secure same if:
- 383 (a) Not more than forty-five (45) days nor later
- than * * * the * * * day immediately preceding * * * the first day 384
- 385 of the early voting period, he or she shall appear in person
- 386 before the registrar of the county in which he or she resides, or
- 387 for municipal elections he or she shall appear in person before
- 388 the city clerk of the municipality in which he or she resides and,
- 389 when the elector so appears, he or she shall execute and file an
- 390 application as provided in Section 23-15-627 and vote by absentee
- 391 ballot. If the absentee ballot has not been printed by forty-five
- 392 (45) days preceding the election, the elector may appear and file
- 393 an application anytime before the election. Then the absentee
- 394 ballot shall be mailed by the registrar to the elector as soon as
- 395 the ballot has been printed.
- 396 Within forty-five (45) days next prior to any
- election, any elector who cannot comply with paragraph (a) of this 397

398	section by reason of temporarily residing outside the county, or
399	any person who has a temporary or permanent physical disability,
400	persons who are sixty-five (65) years of age or older, any person
401	who is incarcerated in prison or jail in the county where the
402	person is registered to vote and has not been convicted of a
403	disenfranchising crime, or any person who is the parent, spouse or
404	dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled
405	person who is hospitalized outside of his or her county of
406	residence or more than fifty (50) miles away from his or her
407	residence and such parent, spouse or dependent will be with such
408	person on election day and all days upon which early voting may be
409	conducted, may make application for an absentee ballot by mailing
410	the appropriate application to the registrar. Only persons
411	temporarily residing out of the county of their residence, persons
412	having a temporary or permanent physical disability, persons who
413	are sixty-five (65) years of age or older, any person who is
414	incarcerated in prison or jail in the county where the person is
415	registered to vote and has not been convicted of a
416	disenfranchising crime, or any person who is the parent, spouse or
417	dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled
418	person who is hospitalized outside of his or her county of
419	residence or more than fifty (50) miles away from his or her
420	residence, and such parent, spouse or dependent will be with such
421	person on election day and all days upon which early voting may be
422	conducted, may obtain absentee ballots by mail under the

423	provisions of this * * * $paragraph$ and as provided by Section
424	23-15-713. Applications of persons temporarily residing outside
425	the county shall be sworn to and subscribed before an official who
426	is authorized to administer oaths or other official authorized to
427	witness absentee balloting as provided in this chapter, said
428	application to be accompanied by such verifying affidavits as
429	required by this chapter. The applications of persons having a
430	temporary or permanent physical disability shall not be required
431	to be accompanied by an affidavit but shall be witnessed and
432	signed by a person eighteen (18) years of age or older. The
433	registrar shall send to such absent voter a proper absentee voter
434	ballot within twenty-four (24) hours, or as soon thereafter as the
435	ballots are available, containing the names of all candidates who
436	qualify or the proposition to be voted on in such election, and
437	with such ballot there shall be sent an official envelope
438	containing upon it in printed form the recitals and data
439	hereinafter required.

- (c) Except when the voter has requested a runoff ballot on the initial absentee ballot application, upon request for a runoff ballot pursuant to Section 23-15-719, the registrar shall mail together the absentee ballot application and the absentee ballot to the absent voter for the runoff election.
- SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2025.
