SENATE BILL NO. 2640

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-125, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO ALLOW THE INCLUSION OF INACTIVE VOTERS IN ELECTRONIC POLLBOOKS 3 SO LONG AS AFFIDAVIT BALLOTS ARE AVAILABLE AT SAID VOTING PRECINCT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-125, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 23-15-125. (1) The pollbook of each voting precinct shall 9 designate the voting precinct for which it is to be used, and 10 shall be ruled in appropriate columns, with printed or written headings, as follows: date of registration; voter registration 11 12 number; name of electors; date of birth; and a number of blank columns for the dates of elections. All qualified applicants who 13 14 register with the registrar shall be entered in the Statewide Elections Management System. Only the names of those qualified 15 applicants who register within thirty (30) days before an election 16 17 shall appear on the pollbooks of the election; however, if the thirtieth day to register before an election falls on a Sunday or 18 19 legal holiday, the registration applications submitted on the

25/SS08/R284 PAGE 1 (ab\kr) 20 business day immediately following the legal holiday shall be 21 accepted and entered in the Statewide Elections Management System 22 for the purpose of enabling voters to vote in the next election. 23 When county election commissioners determine that any elector is 24 disqualified from voting, by reason of death, conviction of a 25 disenfranchising crime, removal from the jurisdiction, failure to comply with the provisions of Section 23-15-152, or other legal 26 27 cause, that fact shall be noted in the Statewide Elections 28 Management System and the voter's name shall be purged from the 29 Statewide Elections Management System, the state's voter roll and 30 the county's pollbooks. 31 Nothing in this section shall preclude the use of 32 electronic pollbooks. Voting precincts that utilize electronic 33 pollbooks, shall maintain all the information that is required in subsection (1) of this section, as well as a list of inactive 34 35 registered voters who formerly held active status, and have moved 36 to inactive status following the procedures in Sections 23-15-152 and 23-15-153. Electronic pollbooks shall not include individuals 37 38 who have been removed from the voter roll because the county 39 election commissioners determined that an elector was disqualified from voting by reason of death, conviction of a disenfranchising 40 crime, removal from the jurisdiction, failure to comply with the 41 provisions of Section 23-15-152, or other legal cause that was 42 43 noted in the Statewide Elections Management System and the voter's 44 name was purged from the Statewide Elections Management System,

- 46 deemed to be in inactive status, the voter may vote by affidavit
- 47 ballot only, and that ballot shall be accepted and counted
- 48 following the same procedure provided in Section 23-15-573.
