SENATE BILL NO. 2707

- AN ACT TO EXEMPT CERTAIN REGISTERED PROVIDERS OF SERVICES FOR
- 2 HOMELESS PERSONS FROM CERTAIN FILING FEES AND LICENSURE
- 3 APPLICATION FEES; TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-7-9 AND 63-1-43,
- 4 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Providers of services for homeless persons
- 7 registered with a Continuum of Care Program shall be exempted:
- 8 (a) From the civil filing fees in chancery court for
- 9 matters relating to the alteration of birth and marriage
- 10 certificates for homeless persons.
- 11 (b) From the application fees for driver's licenses,
- 12 identifications cards, or learner's permits under Section 63-1-43
- 13 for homeless persons.
- 14 **SECTION 2.** Section 25-7-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
