SENATE BILL NO. 2840 (As Sent to Governor)

- 44 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 45 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-113-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 47 37-113-55. There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 48 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi State University
- 49 Veterinary School Fund." The fund shall be maintained by the
- 50 State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart
- 51 from the General Fund of the state. Monies in the fund shall be
- 52 disbursed by the * * * Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 53 Higher Learning to assist Mississippi State University with paying
- 54 costs associated with the design, construction, renovation,
- 55 repairs, and equipping of the Wise Center. Unexpended amounts
- 56 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
- 57 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment
- 58 earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.
- 59 **SECTION 2.** Section 43 of Chapter 95, Laws of 2024, is
- 60 amended as follows:

 157 through the Mississippi Alternative Housing Pilot Program may be
 158 made by the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency as required by
 159 federal law to be in compliance with regulations of the federal
 160 articles of agreement and its awarded conditions, and upon
 161 approval of the Public Procurement Review Board.
- 162 (8) This section shall not be applicable to the State
 163 Veterans Homes in the event the State Veterans Affairs Board has

- 166 **SECTION 5.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
- 167 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- transfer the sum of Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000.00) from
- 169 the Capital Expense Fund (Fund No. 6449C00000) to the Secretary of
- 170 State Land Improvement Fund (Fund No. 6611100000).
- SECTION 6. During the period beginning July 1, 2024, through
- 172 June 30, 2025, the State Treasurer, in conjunction with the State
- 173 Fiscal Officer, on behalf of the University of Mississippi Medical
- 174 Center, shall transfer Four Million Thirty Thousand Four Hundred
- 175 Sixteen Dollars (\$4,030,416.00) for the Office of Mississippi
- 176 Physician Workforce to the State Department of Health for the
- 177 transfer of the program that occurred in House Bill No. 1129, 2024
- 178 Regular Session.
- 179 **SECTION 7.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
- 180 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- 181 transfer the sum of Two Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 182 (\$2,250,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund (Fund No.
- 183 6449C00000) to the Mississippi Semiquincentennial Celebration Fund
- 184 created in Section 39-41-1(13).
- 185 **SECTION 8.** There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 186 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Veteran's Home
- 187 Improvement Fund." The fund shall be maintained by the State
- 188 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from

- 189 the General Fund of the state. Monies in the fund shall be
- 190 disbursed by the Department of Finance and Administration acting
- 191 through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
- 192 Management to defray costs associated with the design,
- 193 construction, and equipping of a new veteran's home to be located
- 194 in Rankin County. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the
- 195 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund,
- 196 and any interest earned or investment earnings on amounts in the
- 197 fund shall be deposited into such fund.
- 198 **SECTION 9.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
- 199 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- 200 transfer the sum of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 201 (\$2,500,000.00) from the MSVA-Board CEF (Fund No. 6448200000) to
- 202 the Mississippi Veteran's Home Improvement Fund created in Section
- 203 8 of this act.
- 204 **SECTION 10.** There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 205 fund to be designated as the "United States Fire Insurance Company
- 206 Settlement Fund." The fund shall be maintained by the State
- 207 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
- 208 the General Fund of the state. Monies in the fund shall be
- 209 disbursed by the Department of Finance and Administration acting
- 210 through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
- 211 Management to defray costs in compliance with the settlement in
- 212 Mississippi Department of Finance and Administration, Bureau of
- 213 Building, Grounds and Real Property Management vs. United States

- 214 Fire Insurance Company, Civil Action No. 2024-2039, related to the
- 215 bookstore at Mississippi Delta Community College. Unexpended
- 216 amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
- 217 not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or
- 218 investment earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into
- 219 such fund.
- 220 **SECTION 11.** On July 1, 2025, the State Treasurer, in
- 221 conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall transfer the sum
- 222 of Three Hundred Ten Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-two Dollars
- 223 (\$310,362.00) from the Attorney General Contingent Fund (Fund No.
- 224 8801700000) to the United States Fire Insurance Company Settlement
- 225 Fund created in Section 10 of this act.
- 226 **SECTION 12.** (1) Upon the effective date of this act, the
- 227 State Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer,
- 228 shall transfer the sum of Two Million Forty-seven Thousand Four
- 229 Hundred Twenty-five Dollars and Seventy-seven Cents
- (\$2,047,425.77) from the Capital Expense Funds DFA (Fund No.
- 231 6494300000) to the 2022 IHL Capital Improvements Fund (Fund No.
- 232 6611330000) created in Section 37-101-83, Mississippi Code of
- 233 1972.
- 234 (2) These funds shall be disbursed by the Department of
- 235 Finance and Administration to The University of Southern
- 236 Mississippi, with the approval of the Board of Trustees of State
- 237 Institutions of Higher Learning on those projects related to the
- 238 universities under its management and control, to pay the costs

- 239 for the repair or renovation of systems or buildings on the
- 240 Hattiesburg campus.
- 241 SECTION 13. Upon the effective date of this act, the State
- 242 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- 243 transfer the sum of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 244 (\$2,500,000.00) from the March 2023 Storm Housing Mission Fund
- 245 (Fund No. 3370300000) to the Hazard Mitigation Administration and
- 246 Management Fund (Fund No. 337HM00000).
- 247 **SECTION 14.** Upon the effective date of this act and after
- 248 completion of the transfer in Section 13 of this act, the State
- 249 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- 250 transfer the remaining balance of the March 2023 Storm Housing
- 251 Mission Fund (Fund No. 3370300000) to the Disaster Assistance
- 252 Trust Fund (Fund No. 3372500000).
- 253 **SECTION 15.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
- 254 Treasurer, in conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer, shall
- 255 transfer the sum of Five Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 256 (\$5,500,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund (Fund No.
- 257 6499C00000) to the Disaster Assistance Trust Fund (Fund No.
- 258 3372500000).
- 259 **SECTION 16.** Section 33-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 260 which is the provision of law creating the March 2023 Storm
- 261 Housing Mission Fund, shall stand repealed on July 1, 2025.
- 262 **SECTION 17.** There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 263 fund to be designated as the "DBCF Civil Money Penalty Fund,"

- 264 which shall consist of funds received from settlements related to 265 violations committed under the former "Mississippi Money 266 Transmitters Act," which was repealed by House Bill No. 1428, 2025 267 General Session, the "Money Transmission Modernization Act," which was enacted by House Bill No. 1428, 2025 Regular Session, and the 268 269 "Mississippi S.A.F.E. Mortgage Act" and any funds from any other 270 source designated for deposit into the fund. Monies in the fund 271 shall be disbursed by the Mississippi Department of Banking and 272 Consumer Finance, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for the 273 purpose of assessment, remediation, operation and maintenance, oversight and administration of licensees within the Consumer 274 275 Finance and Mortgage divisions of the agency. Unexpended amounts 276 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse 277 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or 278 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the 279 credit of the fund.
- section 18. During the period beginning July 1, 2025,
 through June 30, 2026, the State Treasurer, in conjunction with
 the State Fiscal Officer, shall transfer the sum of One Million
 Seven Hundred Sixty Thousand Two Hundred Eighty-five Dollars and
 Eighty-three Cents (\$1,760,285.83) from the Consumer Finance Fund
 (Fund No. 3351200000) to the DBCF Civil Money Penalty Fund created
 in Section 17 of this act.
- 287 **SECTION 19.** On July 1, 2025, the State Treasurer, in 288 conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer and the Mississippi

289	Emergency Management Agency, shall transfer the sum of
290	Eighty-eight Million Three Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Three
291	Hundred Three Dollars (\$88,328,303.00), which are monies of the
292	former Commercial Mobile Radio Service Board, from the appropriate
293	financial institutions to the NG911 CMRS Grant Fund created in
294	Section 7 of Senate Bill No. 2835, 2025 Regular Session.
295	SECTION 20. On July 1, 2025, the State Treasurer, in
296	conjunction with the State Fiscal Officer and the Mississippi
297	Emergency Management Agency, shall transfer the sum of Seven
298	Hundred Forty-three Thousand Dollars (\$743,000.00), which are
299	monies of the former Commercial Mobile Radio Service Board, from
300	the appropriate financial institutions to the State NG911 Fund
301	created in Section 8(h) of Senate Bill No, 2835, 2025 Regular
302	Session.

- 303 **SECTION 21.** (1) Sections 1 through 18 of this act shall 304 take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
- 305 (2) Sections 19 and 20 of this act shall take effect and be
 306 in force from and after July 1, 2025. However, Sections 19 and 20
 307 of this act shall not take effect if Senate Bill No. 2835, 2025
 308 Regular Session, does not become law.
