## SENATE BILL NO. 2854 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-26-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE DEFINITIONS OF "TOURISM PROJECT" AND "RESORT 3 DEVELOPMENT" TO INCREASE THE MINIMUM PRIVATE INVESTMENT AMOUNTS REQUIRED UNDER THE TOURISM PROJECT INCENTIVE PROGRAM; TO DECREASE 5 THE PERCENTAGE OF THE PRIVATE INVESTMENT AMOUNT REQUIRED FOR 6 RESORT DEVELOPMENTS THAT MAY BE EXPENDED ON FACILITIES TO HOUSE 7 RETAIL ACTIVITY; TO AMEND SECTION 57-26-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE POTENTIAL TIME IN WHICH THE MISSISSIPPI 8 9 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY MAY MAKE INCENTIVE PAYMENTS FROM THE TOURISM 10 PROJECT SALES TAX INCENTIVE FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 57-26-7, 11 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REAUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI 12 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO APPROVE APPLICATIONS FOR PROJECTS THAT 13 INCLUDE RESORT DEVELOPMENTS, AND TO EXTEND THE APPLICATION DEADLINE TO JUNE 30, 2027; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 16 **SECTION 1.** Section 57-26-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 17 amended as follows: 57-26-1. As used in Sections 57-26-1 through \* \* \* 57-26-7, 18 19 the following terms and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 20 "Approved project costs" means actual costs 21 22 incurred by an approved participant for land acquisition, construction, engineering, design and other costs approved by the 23 24 Mississippi Development Authority relating to a tourism project; S. - 25 however, for the purposes of a tourism project described in
- 26 paragraph (d) (iv) of this section, such costs include only those
- 27 incurred after January 1, 2011, relating to the hotel portion of
- 28 the project consisting of facilities used for lodging and common
- 29 areas in that portion of the project. All costs must be verified
- 30 by an independent third party approved by the MDA. An approved
- 31 participant shall pay the costs for the third-party verification
- 32 of costs. Approved project costs may not increase regardless of
- 33 the actual costs incurred by the project.
- 34 (b) "Approved participant" means a person, corporation
- 35 or other entity issued a certificate by the Mississippi
- 36 Development Authority under Section 57-26-5.
- 37 (c) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.
- 38 (d) "Tourism project" shall include any of the
- 39 following as may be approved by the MDA:
- 40 (i) Theme parks, water parks, entertainment parks
- 41 or outdoor adventure parks, cultural or historical interpretive
- 42 educational centers or museums, motor speedways, indoor or outdoor
- 43 entertainment centers or complexes, convention centers,
- 44 professional sports facilities, spas, attractions created around a
- 45 natural phenomenon or scenic landscape and marinas open to the
- 46 public with a minimum private investment of not less than Ten
- 47 Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00);
- 48 (ii) A hotel with a minimum private investment
- 49 of \* \* \* Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) in land,

- 50 buildings, architecture, engineering, fixtures, equipment,
- 51 furnishings, amenities and other related soft costs approved by
- 52 the \* \* \* MDA, and having a minimum private investment of \* \* \*
- 53 Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per guest room which
- 54 amount shall be included within the minimum private investment
- 55 of \* \* \* Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00);
- 56 (iii) A public golf course with a minimum private
- investment of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00);
- 58 (iv) A full-service hotel with a minimum private
- investment of \* \* \* Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) in
- 60 land, buildings, architecture, engineering, fixtures, equipment,
- furnishings, amenities and other related soft costs approved by
- 62 the \* \* \* MDA, and having a minimum private investment of \* \* \*
- 63 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) per guest room or
- 64 suite which amount shall be included within the minimum private
- investment of \* \* Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00), a
- 66 minimum of twenty-five (25) quest rooms or suites, and quest
- 67 amenities such as restaurants, spas and other amenities as
- 68 determined by the \* \* \* MDA; however, in a county in which the
- 69 Grammy Museum Mississippi, the Marty Stuart Congress of Country
- 70 Music or the Mississippi Arts and Entertainment Center is located,
- 71 in a county in which the Saenger Theater and the main campus of a
- 72 state institution of higher learning are located, and in the
- 73 downtown historic district of the city in which the NWCC
- 74 Performing Arts Center is located, the minimum private investment

- 75 per guest room or suite shall be  $\star$   $\star$  Two Hundred Thousand
- 76 Dollars (\$200,000.00), which amount shall be included within the
- 77 minimum private investment of  $\star$   $\star$  Twenty Million Dollars
- 78 (\$20,000,000.00);
- 79 (v) A tourism attraction located within an
- 80 "entertainment district" as defined in Section 17-29-3 that is
- 81 open to the public, has seating to accommodate at least forty (40)
- 82 persons, is open at least five (5) days per week from at least
- 83 6:00 p.m. until midnight, serves food and beverages, and provides
- 84 live entertainment at least three (3) nights per week;
- 85 (vi) A cultural retail attraction;
- 86 (vii) A tourism attraction located within a
- 87 historic district where the district is listed in the National
- 88 Register of Historic Places, where the tourism attraction is open
- 89 to the public, has seating to accommodate at least forty (40)
- 90 persons, is open at least five (5) days per week from at least
- 91 6:00 p.m. until midnight, serves food and beverages, and provides
- 92 live entertainment at least three (3) nights per week;
- 93 (viii) A tourism attraction, located in a county
- 94 bordered by the Mississippi River and including Interstate 69 and
- 95 U.S. Highways 3, 4 and 61, with a minimum investment of One
- 96 Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000.00) and subject to an urban
- 97 renewal plan that redevelops two (2) hotels, a golf course and
- 98 clubhouse, a shooting range and a convention center and develops
- 99 an entertainment center and waterpark, together with other

100 attraction-related amenities, on an area not less than two 101 thousand (2,000) acres.

The term "tourism project" does not include any licensed gaming establishment owned, leased or controlled by a business, corporation or entity having a gaming license issued under Section 75-76-1 et seq.; however, the term "tourism project" may include a project described in this paragraph (d) that is owned, leased or controlled by such a business, corporation or entity or in which the business, corporation or entity has a direct or indirect financial interest if the project is in excess of development that the State Gaming Commission requires for the issuance or renewal of a gaming license and is not part of a licensed gaming establishment in which gaming activities are conducted.

The term "tourism project" does not include any facility within the project whose primary business is retail sales or any expansions of existing projects; however, pro shops, souvenir shops, gift shops, concessions and similar retail activities, and cultural retail attractions may be included within the definition of the term "tourism project." In addition, retail activities, regardless of whether the primary business is retail sales, that are part of a resort development may be included within the definition of "tourism project."

(e) "Resort development" means a travel destination

development with a minimum private investment of \* \* \* Two Hundred

Million Dollars (\$200,000,000.00) and which consists of (i) a

- 125 hotel with a minimum of two hundred (200) guest rooms or suites
- 126 and having a minimum private investment of Two Hundred Thousand
- 127 Dollars (\$200,000.00) per quest room or suite, and (ii) quest
- 128 amenities such as restaurants, golf courses, spas, fitness
- 129 facilities, entertainment activities and other amenities as
- 130 determined by the MDA. Not more than an amount equal to \* \* \*
- 131 thirty percent (30%) of the private investment required by this
- 132 paragraph may be expended on facilities to house retail activity.
- 133 (f) "Cultural retail attraction" means a project which
- 134 combines destination shopping with cultural or historical
- interpretive elements specific to Mississippi with a minimum
- 136 private investment of Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) in
- 137 land, buildings, architecture, engineering, fixtures, equipment,
- 138 furnishings, amenities and other related soft costs approved by
- 139 the \* \* \* MDA and which:
- 140 (i) Is located in a qualified resort area as
- 141 defined in Section 67-1-5;
- 142 (ii) Is a part of a master-planned development
- 143 with a total investment of not less than One Hundred Million
- 144 Dollars (\$100,000,000.00) in land, buildings, architecture,
- 145 engineering, fixtures, equipment, furnishings, amenities and other
- 146 related soft costs approved by the \* \* \* MDA;
- 147 (iii) Has a minimum of fifty (50) retail tenants
- 148 with a minimum of three hundred thousand (300,000) square feet of
- 149 heated and cooled space; and

- 151 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in one or more of the following:
- 152 1. Art created by Mississippi artists or
- 153 portraying themes specific to Mississippi;
- 154 2. Memorabilia, signage or historical markers
- 155 which serve to promote the State of Mississippi;
- 3. Audio/visual equipment used to showcase
- 157 Mississippi artists;
- 158 4. A minimum of one thousand two hundred
- 159 fifty (1,250) square feet of heated and cooled space available to
- 160 the \* \* \* MDA or its assignee for a period of not less than ten
- 161 (10) years.
- 162 (g) "Retail activity" means businesses whose inventory
- 163 consists primarily of upscale name brands or their equivalent as
- 164 determined by the MDA.
- 165 (h) "State" means the State of Mississippi.
- 166 **SECTION 2.** Section 57-26-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 167 amended as follows:
- 168 57-26-3. (1) (a) There is created in the State Treasury a
- 169 special fund to be known as the "Tourism Project Sales Tax
- 170 Incentive Fund," into which shall be deposited such money as
- 171 provided in Section 27-65-75(16). The monies in the fund shall be
- 172 used for the purpose of making the incentive payments authorized
- 173 in this section. The fund shall be administered by the MDA.
- 174 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal

year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on or investment earnings on the amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. The MDA may use not more than one percent (1%) of interest earned or investment earnings, or both, on amounts in the fund for administration and management of the incentive program authorized under Sections 57-26-1 through 57-26-5.

182 (b) Subject to the provisions of this section, 183 incentive payments may be made by the MDA to an approved 184 participant that incurs approved project costs to locate a tourism 185 project in the state. The payments to an approved participant 186 shall be for eighty percent (80%) of the amount of sales tax 187 revenue collected from the operation of the tourism project, after 188 making the diversions required in Section 27-65-75(7) and (8). 189 The MDA shall make payments to an approved participant on a 190 semiannual basis with payments being made in the months of January 191 and July. The aggregate amount of incentive payments that an 192 approved participant may receive shall not exceed thirty percent 193 (30%) of the approved project costs incurred by the approved 194 participant for the tourism project. Expansions, enlargements or 195 additional investments made by an approved participant will not 196 increase authorized incentive payments certified by the MDA. The 197 MDA shall make the calculations necessary to make the payments 198 provided for in this section. The MDA shall cease making

- 201 (i) The date that an aggregate amount of thirty
  202 percent (30%) of the approved project costs incurred by the
  203 approved participant for the tourism project has been paid to the
  204 approved participant; or
- 205 (ii) \* \* \*  $\underline{\text{Twenty (20)}}$  years after the date the 206 tourism project opens for commercial operation.
- 207 (2) At such time as incentive payments are no longer
  208 required to be made to an approved participant, the MDA shall
  209 notify the Department of Revenue and the sales tax revenue
  210 collected from the tourism project shall no longer be deposited
  211 into the Tourism Project Sales Tax Incentive Fund. Any amounts
  212 remaining in the fund that were collected from such project shall
  213 be transferred to the State General Fund.
- 214 **SECTION 3.** Section 57-26-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 215 amended as follows:
- 57-26-7. The MDA shall not approve any application submitted after June 30, \* \* \* 2027, pursuant to Section 57-26-5 for a project that includes any resort development.
- 219 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 220 and after its passage.
