SENATE BILL NO. 2883 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-1-59, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO 3 CONTRACTS AND OTHER AGREEMENTS WITH COUNTY BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE PURPOSE OF STAFFING MISSISSIPPI WELCOME CENTERS; TO CREATE 5 THE MISSISSIPPI WELCOME CENTERS STAFF GRANT PROGRAM TO BE 6 ADMINISTERED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY; TO CREATE 7 THE MISSISSIPPI WELCOME CENTERS STAFF GRANT FUND TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY; AND FOR 8 RELATED PURPOSES. 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 **SECTION 1.** Section 57-1-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows: 57-1-59. The Mississippi Development Authority shall have 13 14 the following general powers and duties with respect to tourism: 15 To promote and advertise the image of Mississippi (a) both within and without the boundaries of this state; 16 17 (b) To promote and advertise fairs and similar 18 activities of interest to tourists and the traveling public; 19 (c) To promote and advertise the use of wildlife and

natural areas by tourists and the traveling public;

- 29 all facilities and programs which may be of interest to travelers
- 30 and tourists;
- 31 (q) To maintain an educational awareness program for
- 32 the citizens of the state to constantly encourage increased
- 33 development of activities of interest to tourists and the
- 34 traveling public;
- 35 (h) To develop and maintain an information services
- 36 system to adequately guide tourists and the traveling public
- 37 within the boundaries of the state;
- 38 (i) To develop and maintain an extensive media program
- 39 to adequately inform the national and international consumer about
- 40 Mississippi;
- 41 (j) To enter into contracts and other agreements with
- 42 local tourism commissions or similar entities for the purpose of
- 43 developing regional strategies for tourism promotion. The

- 49 (k) To develop programs and projects promoting the
- 50 state's heritage, history, culture, literature and arts, including
- 51 the positive recovery of the state after damages caused by natural
- 52 disasters, and demonstrating the state's attractiveness as a
- 53 tourism destination for those and other reasons * * *; and
- (1) To enter into contracts and other agreements with
- 55 county boards of supervisors for the purpose of employing staff
- 56 members, who shall not be state service employees or members of
- 57 the Public Employees' Retirement System of Mississippi, at
- 58 Mississippi welcome centers located within the boundaries of the
- 59 county with grant funds provided by the department.
- 60 **SECTION 2.** (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- 61 following words shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the
- 62 context requires otherwise:
- 63 (a) "Grant program" means the Mississippi Welcome
- 64 Centers Staff Grant established in this section.
- (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.
- 66 (2) (a) There is established the Mississippi Welcome
- 67 Centers Staff Grant Program, which shall be administered by the
- 68 MDA for the purpose of staffing welcome centers with county
- 69 employees as authorized under Section 57-1-59.

- 70 (b) Subject to the provisions of this act and any other
- 71 applicable state law and regulations, counties receiving a grant
- 72 shall have the authority to use the funds provided in this grant
- 73 program in a way that best facilitates their agreement to staff
- 74 welcome centers with county employees.
- 75 (3) MDA shall:
- 76 (a) Inform all counties with welcome centers about the
- 77 grant program;
- 78 (b) Develop regulations and procedures to govern the
- 79 administration of the grant program, including application
- 80 requirements, within two (2) months after enactment; and
- 81 (c) Subject to appropriation, award welcome centers
- 82 meeting the requirements of the program a grant for expenses
- 83 related to staffing the centers with certain county employees.
- 84 (4) An application for an award from the grant program shall
- 85 include:
- 86 (a) A detailed budget of operating expenses for the
- 87 welcome center, specifically as it pertains to expenses related to
- 88 staffing; and
- 89 (b) The number of employees needed to effectively staff
- 90 the welcome center, and the weekly hours to be worked by each
- 91 employee.
- 92 (5) Grants awarded shall be used for expenses incurred as a
- 93 result of staffing welcome centers with county employees,
- 94 including, but not limited to, compensation for county employees.

- 96 reasonable compensation for any employees hired at welcome centers
- 97 under this section.
- 98 (b) The amount awarded each year shall be based on the
- 99 actual budget and plan submitted by the county.
- 100 (c) Grants received by counties under this act shall
- 101 only be used to offset staffing costs.
- 102 (7) There is created a special fund in the State Treasury,
- 103 to be known as the "Mississippi Welcome Centers Staff Grant Fund,"
- 104 from which the grants authorized by this act shall be disbursed by
- 105 MDA. The fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as a
- 106 separate and special fund, separate and apart from the State
- 107 General Fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end
- 108 of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not lapse into
- 109 the State General Fund. Any interest earned or investment
- 110 earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be
- 111 deposited to the credit of the fund.
- 112 (8) By October 1, 2025, and by October 1 of each year
- 113 thereafter, MDA shall provide a comprehensive report on the use of
- 114 monies distributed under this grant program and its effectiveness
- 115 on welcome center staffing.
- 116 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- and after July 1, 2025, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2025.
