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## SENATE BILL NO. 2888

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE MISSISSIPPI DIVISION OF MEDICAID (MDOM) TO CONDUCT A STUDY EXAMINING THE EFFECTIVENESS AND FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY OF WORK REPORTING REQUIREMENTS IN MEDICAID EXPANSION LEGISLATION, IN THE EVENT A MEDICAID EXPANSION BILL 5 EXPANDS COVERAGE TO CREATE A PLAN TO ALLOW MEDICAID COVERAGE IN 6 MISSISSIPPI FOR INDIVIDUALS DESCRIBED IN THE FEDERAL AFFORDABLE 7 CARE ACT, TO PROVIDE THAT THE COVERAGE GROUP FOR ELIGIBILITY MUST BE INDIVIDUALS 19-64 OF AGE WHOSE INCOME IS NOT MORE THAN 138% OF 8 9 THE FPL: TO PROVIDE FOR A STUDY OF THE EFFECTS OF MANDATORY 10 MONTHLY AND/OR QUARTERLY WORK REPORTING REQUIREMENTS ON THE NEWLY 11 ELIGIBLE COVERAGE GROUP; TO PROVIDE THAT UPON THE COMPLETION OF 12 THE STUDY CYCLE CONDUCTED BY JULY 1, 2028, A REVIEW OF THE STUDY 13 MUST BE CONDUCTED BY THE MEDICAID COMMITTEES OF BOTH HOUSES OF THE LEGISLATURE; TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION TO RECOMMEND METHODOLOGY TO 14 15 AMEND MEDICAID EXPANSION WORK REQUIREMENT LEGISLATION UPON REVIEW 16 OF THE REPORT DISPLAYING DETRIMENTAL IMPACTS TO THE COVERAGE 17 GROUP, IMPLICATIONS OF MEDICAID COVERAGE LOSS FOR HEALTH CARE 18 PROVIDERS AND HEALTH PLANS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 19 ACT SHALL STAND REPEALED ON JANUARY 31, 2032; AND FOR RELATED 20 PURPOSES. 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 22 SECTION 1. (1) The Mississippi Division of Medicaid (MDOM) shall collect, evaluate and report upon the following data in 23 connection with the Medicaid expansion program as federal law may 24 25 require: 26 In addition to and on the same schedule as the data collection required by federal law, the division shall collect, 27

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- 28 evaluate and report on further information with respect to any
- 29 mandatory work reporting requirements of the Medicaid expansion
- 30 legislation.
- 31 (b) With respect to all terminations of Medicaid
- 32 benefits to the coverage group, all of the same information as
- 33 required under the federal law, plus the specific reason or
- 34 reasons for the termination must be recorded and provided for the
- 35 study upon request.
- 36 (c) The division shall, in conjunction with the
- 37 Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) in addition to
- 38 the foregoing data collection and reporting activities, conduct a
- 39 study on the implementation of Medicaid expansion and work
- 40 reporting requirements. The study shall select subgroups
- 41 representing important sectors of the coverage group, including
- 42 type of area of residence (city, suburban, small town, rural),
- 43 English proficiency, level of education, literacy, work
- 44 experience, number of adults in the home, number of children in
- 45 the home, teen parentage, parents before and after the age of
- 46 eighteen (18), and other such subgroups. For each subgroup, the
- 47 study shall assemble a statistically valid sample of cases
- 48 entering the Medicaid expansion and work reporting requirements
- 49 programs at least six (6) months after its implementation date and
- 50 prior to July 1, 2026. The study shall continue until July 1,
- 51 2031. The division shall report to the Medicaid committees of the
- 52 House and Senate and Governor by March 1 of each year, beginning

- 53 July 1, 2027, the interim findings of the study with respect to
- 54 each subgroup, and by August 1, 2031, the final findings of the
- 55 study with respect to each subgroup. The reports shall be
- 56 available to the public upon request. No later than November 1,
- 57 2031, the division, in consultation with an advisory panel of
- 58 specialists in welfare policy, social science, and other relevant
- 59 fields shall devise the study and identify the factors to be
- 60 studied. The study shall, however, at least include the following
- 61 features:
- (i) Demographic breakdowns including, but not
- 63 limited to, race, gender, and number of children in the household
- 64 at the beginning of division services. Study participants must
- 65 meet the following criteria to participate:
- 1. Age nineteen (19) through sixty-four (64);
- 67 2. Received Medicaid coverage in the past
- 68 year and have been subject to new Medicaid work requirements as a
- 69 condition of eligibility;
- 70 3. Lost Medicaid eligibility in the past six
- 71 (6) months by not meeting Mississippi Division of Medicaid work
- 72 requirement rules and reporting procedures; or regained Medicaid
- 73 coverage by reporting work activities; or received employment
- 74 assistance.
- 75 (ii) The division shall obtain permission to
- 76 conduct the study from the subjects of the study and guarantee
- 77 their privacy according to the federal law, Health Insurance

- 78 Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA). To facilitate this
- 79 permission, the study may be designed to refer to subject by
- 80 pseudonyms or codes and shall in any event guarantee anonymity to
- 81 the subject without limiting access by outsiders to the data
- 82 (other than identities) generated by the study.
- 83 (iii) The subjects of the study shall be studied
- 84 upon enrollment and potential disenrollment based on compliance
- 85 with work reporting requirements to the extent feasible. The
- 86 evaluator shall attempt to maintain personal contact with the
- 87 subjects of the study, and employ such methods as meetings,
- 88 telephone contacts, written surveys, and computer matches with
- 89 other data bases to accomplish this purpose. The intent of this
- 90 feature of the study is to discover the paths the coverage group
- 91 takes upon expansion of Medicaid and implementation of work
- 92 reporting requirements including the factors that may influence
- 93 these paths and patterns. The study shall include a review and
- 94 analysis of:
- 95 1. Division of Medicaid outreach and
- 96 education efforts;
- 97 3. Division of Medicaid training and
- 98 employment resources;
- 99 4. Division of Medicaid work reporting

- 100 systems;
- 101 5. Division of Medicaid exemptions from work
- 102 requirements;

104	understanding of work requirements;
105	7. Implications of Medicaid coverage loss for
106	health care providers and health plans.
107	(iv) The study shall examine the influence of
108	various employability, education, and training programs upon
109	employment, earnings, job tenure, and unemployment through work
110	reporting requirement mandates.
111	(v) The study shall examine the frequency of
112	unplanned occurrences in subjects' lives, such as illness or
113	injury, family members' illness or injury, transportation
114	complications, strikes, natural disasters, evictions, loss of
115	other sources of income, domestic violence, and crime, and their
116	impact upon employment, earnings, job tenure, and unemployment
117	through work reporting requirement mandates.
118	(vi) The study shall examine the reasons for
119	subjects' benefits loss, the reasons for coverage loss due to
120	administrative requirements, noncompliance of work reporting
121	requirements, the availability of reenrollment services, programs
122	or services utilized by subjects to reenroll, whether the subject
123	suffered a job loss, the characteristics of the subject's next job
124	if applicable, and the relationship of these factors to
125	reenrollment benefits, job tenure, and unemployment through work
126	reporting requirement mandates.

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127	(vii) The study shall examine the impact of
128	mandatory work reporting requirements, including the types of work
129	activities, and the links between the requirements and the
130	activities and sanctions, employment, earnings, job tenure, and
131	unemployment through work reporting requirement mandates.
132	(viii) The study shall, in compliance with HIPPA
133	laws, track the subjects' usage of Medicaid benefits over the
134	course of the study, including patterns of usage, preventative
135	visits/screenings, sick visits, surgeries, emergency room visits,
136	and number of cases.
137	(ix) Put an objective, third-party evaluation in
138	place at the start of a Medicaid work requirements demonstration
139	so the implementation and impacts can be rigorously evaluated.
140	(x) The division may recommend methodology to
141	amend any Medicaid expansion work requirements upon review of the
142	study prescribed in this section.
143	(2) This section shall stand repealed on January 31, 2031.
144	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2025.

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
