2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE MISSISSIPPI COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
LO	June 30, 2026\$ 33,358,966.00.
L1	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L2	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
L3	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
L 4	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi
L5	Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning
L 6	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026 14,426,083.00.
L7	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
L 8	act, One Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars

- 19 (\$1,150,000.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement
- 20 Fund from funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and
- 21 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 22 **SECTION 4.** No general funds authorized to be expended herein
- 23 shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds
- 24 which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions
- of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 26 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 27 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the
- 28 emphasis areas of Agriculture, Family and Consumer Education,
- 29 Natural Resources and Environment, 4-H, and Business and Community
- 30 Development in each county.
- 31 **SECTION 6.** No part of the funds appropriated or authorized
- 32 to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for
- 33 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who
- 34 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 35 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of
- 36 State Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such
- 37 legal services.
- 38 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 39 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to
- 40 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 41 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 42 during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

43	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that if							
44	the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly							
45	or indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants,							
46	research grants or donations, such special source funds not							
47	classified as current restricted funds shall be added and							
48	accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the							
49	intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special							
50	source funds be included in all reports and requests for the 2026							
51	Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature.							
52	SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance							
53	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of							
54	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized							
55	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the							
56	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,							
57	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

87	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the							
88	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things							
89	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,							
90	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind							
91	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to							

92	the Mississipp	oi Industries	for the	Blind	whenever	purchases	are
93	made without o	competitive ba	ids.				

- 94 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 95 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 96 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 97 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 98 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 99 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 100 actions contrary to this provision.
- section 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
  the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
  credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
  warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
  Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
  proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
